WAIHOLA ROAD DISTRICT DIVIDED; AND WAIHOLA EAST, WAIHOLA WEST, AND CLARENDON ROAD DISTRICTS FORMED.

PROCLAMATION

By the Honorable JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Roads Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1862," it is among other things enacted in the 12th section thereof, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance, the said Province, except as is therein excepted, may from time to time be divided into districts; and until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there shall be twenty-five districts, which shall be named and bounded as described in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed; and it is also in the said 12th section provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts, by forming and naming new districts, or by dividing any district into two or more districts.

And whereas, in the said Schedule, the Waihola district therein named is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north-east by the West Taieri District; on the south-east by the Watershed of the ranges running from the Taieri Ferry to Gorge Hill; on the south-west by the Watershed of the ranges running from Gorge Hill, Horse Shoe Bush Hill, to the boundary of the Hundreds: And whereas it is expedient to divide the said Waihola District into three Road Districts, to be called respectively the Waihola East, Waihola West, and the Clarendon Road Districts.— Now therefore, I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Waihola Road District shall

henceforth be divided into three Road Districts, the first to be named the Waihola East Road District, the second to be named the Waihola West Road District, and the third to be named the Clarendon Road District, and that the said three Road Districts shall respectively be bounded as and comprise the territory hereinafter described, that is to say—

THE WAIHOLA EAST ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded towards the north by the Maungatua Road District; towards the south-east by the Watershed of the ranges and a road line from Taieri Ferry to section numbered 17, block II, Waihola Survey District, thence by a line in a southerly direction to the road line dividing the Tokomairiro and Waihola Survey Districts; towards the south-west by the said road line, and towards the north-west by the main south road line as far as the Waihola Lake, thence along the shore of that lake, and round the northern boundary of block XXI, Waihola Survey District, to the Maungatua Road District.

THE WAIHOLA WEST ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded towards the west by the leading range to the interior from Horse Shoe Bush; towards the north by a line due east over Trig. Station M, Clarendon Survey District, thence by a road line to section numbered 1, block XVII, Waihola Survey District, thence by that section, and section numbered 2, block XV, to Waihola Lake, thence by a line crossing the lake to the south corner of section numbered 3, block XXII, Waihola Survey District; towards the south-east by the Waihola East Road District; towards the south-west by that road line which forms the south-western boundary of block I, Waihola Survey District, thence along the north-western boundary of the said block I, to the leading range to the interior.

THE CLARENDON ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded towards the north-west by the boundary of the Hundreds; towards the north-east by the Maungatua Road District; towards the south-east by the Maungatua and Waihola East Road Districts;

towards the south by the Waiholo West Road District; and towards the west by the leading range to the interior from Horse Shoe Bush.

ANDERSON'S BAY, PORTOBELLO, AND NORTH-EAST HARBOR ROAD DISTRICTS ALTERED; AND TOMAHAWK, HIGHCLIFF, BROAD BAY, AND SANDY MOUNT ROAD DISTRICTS FORMED.

PROCLAMATION

By the Honorable JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Roads Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1862," it is among other things enacted in the 12th section thereof, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance the said Province, except as is therein excepted, may from time to time be divided into districts; and until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there shall be twenty-five districts, which shall be named and bounded as in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed is specified; and it is also in the said 12th section provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts by forming and naming new districts, or by dividing any district into two or more districts.

And whereas in the said Schedule the Anderson's Bay District therein named is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north by the Harbor; on the east by the watershed of the range running from Grassy Point to Seal Point; on the south by the ocean; and on the west by the Dunedin town belt, and that road running direct from near Hillside to the Ocean Beach: And whereas in the said Schedule the Portobello District is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north by the Harbor; on the east by the Maori Reserve; on the south by the ocean; and on the west by Anderson's Bay District: And whereas by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* No. 234, and date March 25, 1863, the Portobello and Anderson's Bay Road Districts were altered, and the North-east Harbor District formed: And whereas by the said proclamation the Portobello District is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north by the Harbor; on the east by the Maori Reserve; on the south by the ocean; and on the west by the North-east Harbor District: and whereas by the said proclamation the Anderson's Bay District is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north by the Harbor; on the east by the western boundary lines of blocks I, II, III, and VIII, Anderson's Bay District, and that line continued from section 22, block I, to the ocean; on the south by the ocean; and on the west by the Dunedin town belt, and that road running direct from near Hillside to the Ocean Beach: And whereas by the said proclamation the North-east Harbor District is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north by a line drawn between sections Nos. 12 and 13, block VII, Portobello Bay District, thence through the Sugar Loaf Hill or Harbor Cone, and onwards to the line dividing sections 5 and 6, block III, Portobello Bay District, and thence by Hooper's Inlet and the ocean; on the

west by Anderson's Bay District: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Portobello, Anderson's Bay, and North-east Harbor Districts, and to form four new districts, to be called respectively the Tomahawk, Highcliff, Sandy Mount, and Broad Bay Road Districts;—Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Portobello Road District, Anderson's Bay Road District, and North-east Harbor Road District, and the boundaries thereof respectively, shall henceforth be varied and altered, and that henceforth the said three last named Districts shall be bounded as and shall comprise the territory hereinafter described, namely—

THE PORTOBELLO ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west and north by Otago Harbor; on the east by Native Reserve; on the south by the Ocean to Hooper's Inlet, thence round Hooper's Inlet to the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 1 and 31, block V, Portobello Survey District, thence along that boundary line and its continuation to the south-eastern corner of section numbered 64, block II, Otago Peninsula Survey District, thence along the boundary of the said section numbered 64 in a north-westerly direction one hundred links, thence on the west by a straight line over Harbor Cone to section numbered 18, block II, Otago Peninsula Survey District, thence along the northern boundary of section numbered 20 to the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 15 and 16, block II, of the said Survey District, thence along that boundary line and its continuation in the same direction to Otago Harbor.

THE ANDERSON'S BAY ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by Otago Harbor to the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 44 and 45, Upper Harbor East Survey District; on the east by that line and its continuation to the road line between section numbered 41, block III, Tomahawk Valley Survey District, and section numbered 24, block I, Otago Peninsula Survey District; on the south-east by that road line to section numbered 22, block VIII, Anderson's Bay Survey District, thence along the north-eastern boundaries of sections numbered respectively 22, 21, 20, 19, 18, and 17 of the said block VIII, thence along the north-western boundary line of the said section numbered 17 and its continuation in the same direction to the Lagoon, thence by the Lagoon to block VII, Otago Peninsula Survey District, thence by the said block VII to a road line intersecting section numbered 8, block III, Anderson's Bay Survey District, thence by that road line which extends along the northern boundary of block VII, Otago Peninsula, to land under application numbered 2494, thence along the south-eastern boundary of the said land to a road line; on the south-west by that road line and its continuation to the Town Belt; and on the north-west by the Town Belt of Dunedin.

THE NORTH-EAST HARBOR ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west by Otago Harbor; on the north-east by Broad Bay Road District; on the south by Sandy Mount and Highcliff Road Districts; and on the west by Anderson's Bay Road District.

And I do, with the like advice and consent, proclaim and declare that henceforth there shall be within the said Province four new Road Districts, to be named respectively as follows: the Tomahawk Road District, the Highcliff Road District, the Broad Bay Road District, and the Sandy Mount Road District; and that the said four last-named Districts respectively shall be bounded as and comprise the territory hereinafter described, that is to say—

THE TOMAHAWK ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded towards the north by Anderson's Bay Road District; towards the east by a road line; towards the south by a road line and the ocean to the

road forming the south-western boundary of block numbered VII, Otago Peninsula Survey District; and towards the west by that road line.

THE HIGHCLIFF ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded towards the north by the Portobello road line; towards the east by Sandy Mount Road District; towards the south by the Ocean; and towards the west by the Tomahawk Road District.

THE SANDY MOUNT ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by Colinswood, Broad Bay, and Portobello Road Districts; on the east by Hooper's Inlet and the Ocean; on the south by the Ocean to the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 51 and 52, block III, Otago Peninsula Survey District; and on the west by the said boundary line and its continuation in the same direction to the Colinswood Road District.

THE BROAD BAY ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by Otago Harbor; on the east by the Portobello Road District; on the south by block numbered 3, Otago Peninsula Survey District to the eastern corner of section numbered 59, block II, of the said Survey District, and on the south-west by a line skirting the north-eastern boundaries of sections numbered respectively 59, 71, 72 and 73, continued in a westerly direction to Otago Harbor.

NEW ZEALAND INDUSTRIAL EXHIBITION, 1865.

WHEREAS by Letters Patent under the hand of his Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, and the seal of the Colony, a Commission has been appointed for the purpose of devising and carrying out an Exhibition of Agricultural and Industrial Products, and Manufactures of the Colony of New Zealand, and such products and manufactures of other countries as may be calculated to be useful in the development of the said Colony. And whereas by the aforesaid Letters Patent, authority is given to the Superintendents respectively of the Provinces of the said Colony to appoint in the several Provinces Local Committees, for the purpose of encouraging the production of articles to be exhibited, of transmitting them to Dunedin, and of conducting communication between Exhibitors and the Commissioners. And whereas I, JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, did on the 16th day of December last, and also on the 29th day of March last, appoint certain persons to act as such Local Committee for the Province of Otago. And whereas it is expedient that certain other persons hereinafter mentioned should be added to such Local Committee, to act in conjunction with the persons so appointed as aforesaid;—Now therefore I, in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do appoint the gentlemen hereinafter mentioned to form part of the said Local Committee:—

THE following Regulations, referring to the transmission of Gold, Bank-notes, or Specie, by Escort to and from Dunedin, to take effect from the 5th October next, are published for general information:—

1. Gold, Bank-notes, or Specie, for transmission by Escort to Dunedin, must be deposited with the Gold Receiver of the district; and notes or specie for transmission up-country, at the office of the Chief Gold Receiver, Dunedin.

2. The Gold Receiver will enter on the receipt, which he will give to the depositor, and on the butt of it (which he will retain) the gross weight of the parcel to be transmitted; he will also require the signature of the depositor to the butt of the receipt.

3. When gold is transmitted "for delivery," the Gold Receiver's receipt should be sent, in all cases, to the consignee.

4. Immediately after the dispatch of each Escort for Dunedin, the Gold Receivers will send to the office of the Chief Gold Receiver an invoice of parcels transmitted. This document must contain a *precise* transcript of the particulars inserted in the "receipts" having reference to that Escort.

5. No delivery of any kind will be made without the surrender of the Gold Receiver's "receipt."

6. A uniform charge of threepence per ounce will be made for gold forwarded to Dunedin under these arrangements; and for specie and bank-notes conveyed in any direction, or for any distance, a charge of one-half per cent will be made.

7. The packages of gold will be delivered at the office of the Chief Gold Receiver to the agents or parties authorised to receive them; and notes or specie for transmission up-Country, will be received there the day previous to the leaving of the Escort, up to four o'clock p.m.

8. The owner of Gold, Bank-Notes, or Specie, transmitted by the Escort, must undertake all risks of conveyance whatsoever (including robbery and theft), as the Government will not, under any circumstances, be responsible for loss.

A PROCLAMATION

Intimating Her Majesty's assent to a certain Bill passed by the General Assembly.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colonies of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New Zealand, until the Governor of the said Colony shall signify by speech or message to the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of the said Colony, or by Proclamation, that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same:

And whereas a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of the said Colony, intituled "An Act to enable Provincial Councils to make laws affecting Public Roads and Watercourses," was presented to the Governor of the said Colony for Her Majesty's assent, and the said Bill was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

Now therefore I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the said in part recited Act, do, by this Proclamation, signify and proclaim to all whom it may concern, that the said Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Given under my hand at Government House at Auckland, and issued under the seal of the Colony of New Zealand, this twenty-sixth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.
