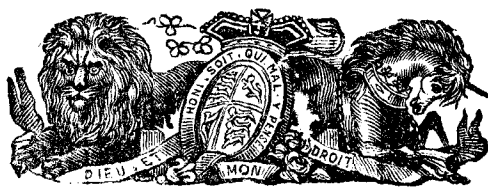

## ADDRESS

OF

### HIS HONOR THE SUPERINTENDENT,

ON PROROGUING THE NINETEENTH SESSION OF THE PROVINCIAL COUNCIL OF THE PROVINCE OF OTAGO, SATURDAY, 12TH NOVEMBER 1864.

*Mr Speaker and Gentlemen of the Provincial Council,*

THE work of the Session having been brought to a close, I have now to thank you for the care you have bestowed upon the many important subjects to which your attention has been directed.

I desire particularly to express my entire concurrence with the views of the Council as enunciated in the important Resolutions adopted by them on the subject of existing relations between this Province and the General Government of New Zealand. These Resolutions, if followed by united and unwavering action on the part of our representatives in the General Assembly, and supported, as I believe they will be, by the unanimous voice of the people of the Province, cannot fail to contribute materially towards the production of those changes in our political position upon which our continued prosperity greatly depends.

The encouragement afforded by the Council for the construction of a Railway from Dunedin to the River Clutha will, I trust, result in a successful effort towards the accomplishment of a work which would confer incalculable benefits upon the Province.

The supplies which you have voted for the public service will be administered with a due regard to the intentions of the Council; and the various duties with which the Government are charged will receive their unremitting attention.

The great importance of a solution of the question, "how can our pastoral lands be so disposed of as to produce the most beneficial results to the whole population of the country," induced me to offer to you a few suggestions in regard to it; and I would now earnestly commend the subject to the consideration of members during the recess, with a view to its full discussion and settlement at a future session.

**HAMPDEN DISTRICT**

Comprises all that area which is bounded on the north by blocks 9 and 2, Otepopo Survey District; on the east by the ocean; on the south by blocks 9, 6, and 7, Moeraki Survey District; and on the west by the boundary of the Hundreds.

**WAIHOLA DISTRICT**

Comprises all that area which is bounded on the north by Lower Waipori District; on the north-east and east by Lower Waipori District, the Taieri River, the Bush Reserve, block 6, Clarendon Survey District, and blocks 3 and 4, Akatore Survey District; on the south-west and west by Shag Creek, thence by the watershed of the ranges over stations S and J to Gorge Hill, thence to Horse-shoe Bush Hill, and thence to the boundary of the Hundreds; and on the north-west by the boundary of the Hundreds.

**I, HARRY WALTER PELLEW SMITH,** do solemnly and sincerely declare that I studied Medicine for three years at St. George's Hospital, London, that I passed my examination before the Board of Examiners, and became a Licentiate in Midwifery of the Royal College of Surgeons, England, and Licentiate of the Society of Apothecaries in the year 1860, and that I held the appointment as Surgeon to the Fire Brigade, Dunedin, from November, 1862, to July, 1863, and as Medical Officer to the Relief Fund, Mount Ida, from September to December, 1863; and I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of the provisions of an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of his late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to repeal an Act of the present Session of Parliament, intituled an Act for the more effectual abolition of oaths and affirmations taken and made in various departments of the State, and to substitute declarations in lieu thereof, and for the more entire suppression of voluntary and extrajudicial oaths and affidavits, and to make other provision for the abolition of unnecessary oaths."
