PROCLAMATION

Of Licensing Districts under the Licensing Ordinance, 1864.

WHEREAS by the tenth section of the "Licensing Ordinance, 1864," it is enacted that the Superintendent of Otago, as soon after the coming into operation of the said Ordinance as conveniently may be, shall, for the purposes of this Ordinance, divide the settled portions of the said Province into such and so many districts as he may think fit to be called Licensing Districts, and when and so soon as such division shall have been made, the Superintendent shall, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, declare such districts, and by such proclamation define the boundaries thereof;

Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby Proclaim and Declare that from and after the day of the date hereof, and until further notice, there shall be within the Province of Otago for the purposes of the said Ordinance Eleven Licensing Districts, to be called respectively as follow:—

1. Clyde Licensing District.
2. Queenstown Licensing District.
3. Oamaru Licensing District.
4. Waikouaiti Licensing District.
5. Dunedin Licensing District.
6. Port Chalmers Licensing District.
7. Taieri Licensing District.
8. Tokomairiro Licensing District.
9. Clutha Licensing District.
10. Hamilton Licensing District.
11. Lawrence Licensing District.

And I do hereby Proclaim and Declare that the said several districts shall be respectively bounded and defined in manner following, that is to say—

1. CLYDE LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise the towns of Alexandra, Clyde, Cromwell, Gladstone, Newcastle, Pembroke, and Wakefield, together with all that

area bounded towards the north by the Province of Canterbury; towards the east by the Province of Canterbury and the Otamakau Creek to the Hawkdun Mountains; towards the south by the Dunstan Gold Field; and towards the west by a direct line from Parkburn at its source to the Wanaka Lake, and by the Wanaka Lake to the Province of Canterbury, also that area within the Dunstan Gold Field which has been withdrawn from the operation of the Gold Fields Act.

2. QUEENSTOWN LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise the towns of Queenstown, Kingston, and Frankton, together with all that area bounded towards the north by the Province of Canterbury; towards the east by the Clyde Licensing District; towards the south by the Dunstan Gold Field; and towards the west by the Wakatipu Gold Field, also all that area within the Wakatipu Gold Field, which has been withdrawn from the operations of the Gold Fields Act.

3. OAMARU LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded on the north by the Clyde Licensing District; on the east by the Province of Canterbury; on the south by the Ocean; and on the west by the Horse Range and Kakanui Mountains and the Mount Ida and Dunstan Gold Fields.

4. WAIKOUAITI LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded on the north by the Oamaru Licensing District; on the east by the Ocean; on the south by a line running due west from Brinn's Point to the Taieri Gold Field, and on the west by the Taieri and Mount Ida Gold Fields.

5. DUNEDIN LICENSING DISTRICT, shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by Waikouaiti and Port Chalmers Licensing Districts; towards the east by the Port Chalmers Licensing District and the Ocean; towards the south by the Ocean; and towards the west by the Taieri River and the Taieri Gold Field.

6. PORT CHALMERS LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area including the town of Port Chalmers, the Lower Harbor, West Survey District, the Sawyer's Bay Survey District, Sections numbered 88 to 115 inclusive, North East Valley Survey District, and Blocks 4, 5, 6, and part of 7, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District: bounded from the North-west corner of Block 4, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District, in a southerly direction, by the western boundary line of the said Block 4, to the northern boundary line of Block 6, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District, thence by the said northern boundary line of the said Block 6 and the northern boundary line of Block 7, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District, to the Main North Road, thence by the Main North Road to the northern boundary line of the North East Valley Survey District; thence in a westerly direction by the said northern boundary line of the North East Valley District to a road line between Sections 87 and 89 of the said District, thence by the said road line continued between Sections 86 and 88, North East Valley District to the northern boundary line of Block 9, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District; thence in an easterly direction by the said northern boundary line of the said Block 9, to the north-west corner of Section 33, Sawyer's Bay Survey District; thence in a south-easterly direction by the boundary line of the said Sawyer's Bay Survey District to Otago Harbor, and thence by high-water mark to the starting point.

7. TAIERI LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by the Tuapeka and Taieri Gold Field; towards the east and south by the Dunedin Licensing District; and towards the west by the Taieri River, the Waiholo Lake, and Meggat Burn; also, all that area within the Taieri Goldfield, and south of the Rock and Pillar Mountains, which has been withdrawn from the operation of the Gold Fields Act.

8. TOKOMAIRI LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by the Tuapeka Gold Field; towards the east by the Taieri and Dunedin Licensing Districts; towards the south by the Ocean; and towards the west by the Clutha District.

9. CLUTHA LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by the Nokomai and Mount Benger Gold Fields; towards the east by the Mount Benger and Tuapeka Gold Fields to Lovell's Creek, thence by Lovell's Creek, the Tuakitoto Lake, Kaitangata Lake and Creek, and the Clutha River, to the Ocean; towards the south by the Ocean; and towards the west by the Province of Southland.

10. HAMILTON LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise the town of Hamilton and all that area within the Mount Ida and Taieri Gold Fields north of the Rock and Pillar Mountain, which has been withdrawn from the operation of the Gold Fields Act.

11. LAWRENCE LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise the town of Lawrence and all that area within the Trapeka and Waitahuna Gold Fields, which has been withdrawn from the operation of the Gold Fields Act.

PROCLAMATION.

Diseased Cattle Regulations.

By His Honor Isaac Earl Featherston, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by Section No. 9 of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it is enacted that "if at any time it shall be made to appear to the Governor that any infectious or contagious disease has broken out in any district out of the Colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by order in Council, to declare that such district is infected within the meaning of this Act, and from time to time to make such regulations as to him shall seem fit, for prohibiting the importation of cattle into the Colony from such district, and the landing or driving of such cattle, and for destroying cattle imported, landed, or driven contrary to such regulations;" and by Section 10 of the said Act it is also enacted, that, "if at any time it shall be made to appear to the Governor that any infectious or contagious disease has broken out among cattle in any district of the Colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by order in Council, to declare that such district is infected within the meaning of this Act, and from time to time to make such regulations for destroying diseased cattle therein, and for prohibiting the removal or transportation of cattle from one part of the Colony to another, and for preventing the further spread of

such disease, as to him shall seem fit:" And it is by the same Act also enacted that the Governor in Council may, by warrant under his hand, from time to time, delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the Colony, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he may think fit, and may from time to time rescind such delegation: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to Isaac Earl Featherston, Esq., so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, the several powers vested in the Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth Sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act is provided, and subject to the regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the 14th day of September, 1864, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made:

Now therefore I, the said Isaac Earl Featherston, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare—first, that after the date hereof the several Colonies of Australia, that is to say, the Colony of Victoria, the Colony of New South Wales, the Colony of Queensland, the Colony of South Australia, and the Colony of Western Australia, as well as the Colony of Tasmania, and the Colony of Cape of Good Hope, and the Islands of Great Britain and Ireland, shall be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the above-mentioned Act, and that no cattle after the date hereof, until further notice, shall be imported into the province of Wellington from such district: provided, however, that the Superintendent of the Province may allow any cattle to be landed from vessels from the Islands of Great Britain and Ireland, subject to such conditions and restrictions as he may deem expedient and the circumstances of the case may require; and I do also proclaim and declare, that after the date hereof, the Provinces of Auckland, Otago, and Southland, in the Colony of New Zealand, shall be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning of the said Act, and that no cattle shall be imported into the Province of Wellington from either of the said Provinces.
