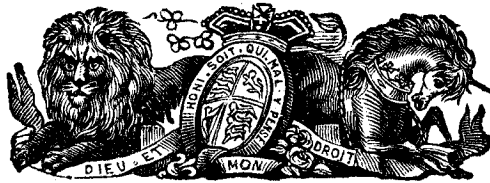

## PROCLAMATION

*Reserving and withdrawing for the purposes of Sale certain Waste Lands of the Crown situate on the Wakatipu Gold Field.*

By His Honor JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Esquire,  
Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the Lands herein-after described should be reserved and withdrawn for the purposes of sale—Now, therefore, I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that I do reserve and withdraw for the purposes of sale the lands hereinafter described, that is to say, All that area bounded on the north-west by a line from Ben Lomond to the source of Hayes' Creek, and thence in an easterly direction to

Arrowtown, on the south-west by a line from Frankton to Ben Lomond, on the south by the Kawarau River, and on the east by the Arrow River.

## PROCLAMATION.

*Saddle Hill Road District Altered; Moeraki Bush Road District Divided; and Walton, Greyton, Brighton, Kurimoto, Motupipi, and Otakia Road Districts Formed.*

By His Honor JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Roads Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1862," it is among other things enacted in the 12th section thereof, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance the said Province, except as is therein excepted, may, from time to time, be divided into districts; and until otherwise provided pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there shall be twenty-five districts, which shall be named and bounded as described in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed; and it is also in the said 12th section provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts,

and to increase the number of districts, by forming and naming new districts, or by dividing any district into two or more districts.

And whereas in the said Schedule the Saddle Hill Road District therein named is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north by East Taieri District; on the east by Kaikorai and Green Island Districts; on the south by the Ocean and the Otakia Creek; and on the west by Block II, Otakia District.

And whereas in the said Schedule the Moeraki Bush District named therein is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north-west by the Taieri River; on the north-east by Saddle Hill District; on the south-east by the Ocean; and on the south-west by the Maori Reserve.

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said Saddle Hill Road District, and to divide the said Moeraki Bush Road District: And whereas it is also expedient to form six New Road Districts, to be called respectively the Walton, Greyton, Brighton, Kurimoto, Motupipi, and Otakia Road Districts.

Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Saddle Hill Road District shall henceforth be altered, and that henceforth

The SADDLE HILL ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north and north-west by the Southern Trunk Road; on the west by section 41, irregular block, East Taieri Survey District, section 32, application 19, sections 17 and 15, block I, Otakia Survey District; on the south by sections 10, 11, 36, 37, and 20, a line through section 30 to the north-west angle of section 39, section 39, 1 of 22, and 33, and a line through section 34 block VIII, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District to its eastern boundary, and by section 71 block VII, in the said Survey District; and on the east by section 41 block VII, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District, and by section 26, Green Island West Survey District: And I do also, with the like advice and consent, proclaim and declare that the said Moeraki Bush Road District shall, from the day of the date hereof, be abolished, and in lieu thereof there shall be six new Road Districts, that is to say, the Walton, Greyton, Brighton, Kurimoto, Motupipi, and Otakia Road Districts. And that

The WALTON ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by the Southern Trunk Road to section 40 block VII, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District, thence on the west by sections 40 and 73 in the said block; thence on the north by section 73, in the said block, thence by a line through section 34 to its western boundary sections 59, 31, 32, a direct line through section 30 to its western boundary sections 21, 57, and 9, block VIII, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District; on the west by sections 15, 13, and 11, block I, Otakia, and by Taylor's Creek to the Ocean; on the south by the Ocean; and on the east by the Kaikorai River and Abbot's Creek to the Main South Road. And that

The GREYTON ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by the Southern Trunk Road; on the west by block II, Otakia Survey District, and section 27, block III, in the said district; on the south by sections 20, 1 of 19, 1 of 18, a direct line through section 2 of 18 to its eastern boundary, and by sections 10 and 11 in the said last-named block; and on the east by block VIII, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District, and section 40, irregular block, East Taieri Survey District: And that

The BRIGHTON ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by sections 13, 12, 2 of 18, 2 of 19, and 43, block I, Otakia Survey District; thence on the east by sections 43 and 42 of the said block; on the north-west by sections 31 and 35, block II, in the said district, and sections 21 and 20, block III, in the said district, and by sections 35 and 36, block IV, in the said district; on the west by sections

45, 46, 47, and 48, in the said last-named block, section 31, block V, in the said district, and section 8, block XXIX, Waiholo Survey District; on the south-west by the ocean; and on the east by the ocean and Taylor's Creek. And that

The KURIMOTO ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west by sections 34, 25, 9, 2 of 11, and 2 of 12, block V, Otakia Survey District; on the south-west by the Native Reserve; on the south-east by the Ocean; on the north-east by section 9, block XXIX, Waiholo, section 12, block III, and section 48, block IV, Otakia Survey District. And that

The MOTUPIPI ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west by the Taieri River; on the south-west by the Native Reserve; on the south-east by sections 1 of 12, 1 of 11, 10, 26, 27, and 33, block V, Otakia Survey District; and on the north-east by sections 47, 41, 42, 43, 37, 28, 27, 19, and 18, block IV, Otakia Survey District. And that

The OTAKIA ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west by the Taieri River; on the west by sections 17, 14, 13, 38, and 40, block IV, and sections 23, 24, and 25, block V, Otakia Survey district; and on the south by sections 33 and 31 block V, and sections 12, 14, 15, 16, 22, 24, 25, 26, and 27, block III, Otakia Survey District.

#### PROCLAMATION,

*Appointing a certain portion of the Province of Otago a Quarantine Ground, under the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."*

By His Honor John Hyde Harris, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

I, JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, do hereby appoint to be a Quarantine Ground under the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," all that piece or parcel of Land, being part of section numbered 6, North Harbour and Blueskin District, and part of section numbered 3, North-East Valley District, in the said Province; bounded on the north-west by another part of the said section numbered 6; on the south-east by sections 3, 5, and 7, North-East Valley aforesaid, and the Main North Road; on the north-east by section numbered 7, North Harbor and Blueskin District aforesaid; and on the south-west by section numbered 3 of the said last mentioned District.

#### AMENDED NOTICE.

JETTIES and WEIGHBRIDGE, at Jetty-street, Dunedin.

JETTY and WEIGHBRIDGE, at Stuart-street, do.

JETTY at Rattray-street, do.

JETTY at Pelichet Bay, do.

JETTY at Port Chalmers.

JETTY at Moeraki.

Sale at noon of Monday, 20th February, 1865, at the Office of the Secretary for Public Works, Dunedin, as provided by the "Jetties and Wharves Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1864."

THE TOLLS, DUES, WHARFAGES, &c., from 1st March next until the end of 1865, of the above-mentioned Jetties will be let by public auction to the highest bidder, on his depositing one month's rent at the time and place above-mentioned, and on his finding sufficient sureties for the payment of the money or rent monthly in advance during the lease, and for the due fulfilment of the other conditions.

#### CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO THE DUNEDIN JETTIES.

1. All the Jetties in Dunedin will be let in one lot. Rattray-street Jetty will be handed over when finished to the lessee.

2. The lessee must keep three lamps on each of Jetty-street new Jetty, and Rattray-street Jetty, same as at present on Jetty-street new Jetty; also one lamp on each of Pelichet Bay Jetty, Stuart-street Jetty, and Jetty-street old Jetty, the same as at present on the said old Jetty.

3. The Lessee shall pay as required what the Harbor Master shall consider reasonable wages to a Night Watchman, who shall be appointed by and be under the direction of the Harbor Master.

4. The Shed on the new Jetty must be at all times available for passengers' and immigrants' luggage. The charge for receiving, including delivery, of luggage and goods shall be at the rate of not more than 2s. per ton; and for storage at the rate of not more than 2s. per ton per week. No charge for storage shall be made for immigrants' luggage for the first 48 hours. So much of the Shed as is not required for luggage may be used for all unclaimed goods found on the Jetty, and for goods requiring shelter for a short time only. The Harbor Master shall have an office in the Shed.

5. Water not to exceed the rate of 2s. 6d. per ton; but the Government will not be in any way responsible for the continuance of the water supply.

6. Weighbridge Dues shall be the same as at present, viz., 6d. for every cart, and 1s. for every waggon.

#### CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO PORT CHALMERS JETTY.

7. The lessee of Port Chalmers Jetty must keep a lamp upon the Jetty, the same as at present.

#### CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL JETTIES.

8. Jetties will be let, subject to all Acts, Ordinances, and Harbour Regulations in force for the time being and the Harbour Master shall retain control over all Jetties, so far as these Acts, Ordinances, and Regulations will apply.

9. The lessee must keep all the property under lease in thorough repair.

10. No offices to be erected on any Jetty, except by permission of the Government, save sentry-box for the Night Watchman.

11. All Jetties to be clean swept every Saturday afternoon.

12. The Government shall be entitled to the free and sole use of any Jetty at any time, for the purpose of receiving distinguished visitors, or for any other public purpose.

13. The Landing Steps at all Jetties shall be open to the public, and no charge shall be made for watermen's boats plying to and from said Landing places.

14. The Jetty Dues shall be at the following rates, on all goods shipped or landed, and shall be paid by the master or owner of the vessel:—

Firewood, 1s. per cord; Wool, 6d. per bale; Horses, 1s.; Cattle, 9d.; Sheep, 1d.; Pigs, 2d. per head; Immigrants Luggage direct from Britain, free; all other goods at the rate of 1s. per ton. Vessels under 40 tons register shall be allowed four, and vessels above that tonnage shall be allowed six, working days to load and unload at the Jetties, as the case may be; and any vessel remaining longer at any Jetty shall be charged one penny per registered ton per day.

15. All lamps must be kept properly burning from sunset till sunrise.

16. The lessee must keep on each Jetty, if required by the Harbour Master, a Notice Board, placed to the satisfaction of the Harbour Master, containing the Scale of Charges, and any other Jetty or Harbour Regulations which the Harbour Master may deem necessary.

16. The leases shall contain the foregoing conditions and other usual and necessary clauses of a lease.

The following sums were collected at Jetty-street Jetties and Stuart-street Jetty, Dunedin, during the year 1864, clear of expenses of collecting. The other Jetties have been free hitherto. There is a slight alteration in the mode in which the dues are to be levied under the lease from that which existed during 1864:—
