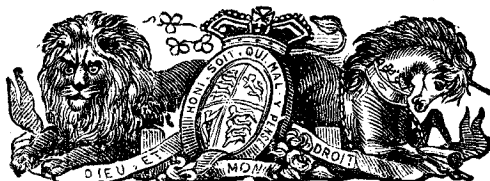

PROCLAMATION.

Tokomairiro Road District abolished, and Milburn, Helensbrook, Milton, Hillingdon, Coombe Hay, Southbridge, Glenore, Adamsthorpe, and Lovelsbrook Road Districts formed.

By His Honor JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Roads Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1862," it is among other things enacted in the 12th section thereof, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance the said Province, except as is therein excepted, may, from time to time, be divided into districts; and until otherwise provided pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there shall be twenty-five districts, which shall be named and bounded as described in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed; and it is also in the said 12th section provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts, by forming and naming new districts, or by dividing any district into two or more districts.

And whereas in the said Schedule the Tokomairiro Road District therein named is described as comprising—All that area bounded on the north-west by the boundary of the Hundreds; on the north-east by Waihola District; on the east, by the watershed of the ranges from Gorge Hill over stations I and S to the source of Shag Creek, thence by Shag Creek to the Ocean; on the south by the Ocean; and on the south-west by Rocky Valley Creek, and the watershed over Mount Misery and Station H, to the watershed of the Ranges leading towards Mount Stuart.

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said Tokomairiro Road District, and to form nine new Road Districts, to be called respectively, the Milburn, Helensbrook, Milton, Hillingdon, Coombe Hay, Southbridge, Glenore, Adamsthorpe, and Lovelsbrook Road Districts.

Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Tokomairiro Road District shall, from the day of the date hereof, be abolished, and that in lieu thereof there shall be nine new Road Districts;—that is to say, the Milburn, Helensbrook, Milton, Hillingdon, Coombe Hay, Southbridge, Glenore, Adamsthorpe, and Lovelsbrook Road Districts; and that

THE MILBURN ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by the northern boundary of block I, Table Hill Survey District; on the west, by the north branch of the Tokomairiro River as far as section 2, block II, Table Hill Survey District; on the south-west, by sections 10 and 13, block I, Table Hill Survey District; sections 39, 46, 51, 58, 63, 70, 76, and 80, Tokomairiro Survey District; sections 9 and 4, and a direct line through sections 1 and 2 to the south-west angle of section 3, block II, Akatore Survey District; on the east, by block VIII, Akatore Survey District; and on the north-east, by block III, Clarendon, and blocks I and II, Waihola Survey District. And that

THE HELENSBROOK ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by section 8, block I, and sections 3 and 4, block II, Table Hill Survey District; on the west by sections 58, 57, 55, and 54, block II in the said district; on the south-west, by sections 51 and 50, block II, in the said district; sections 128, 116, 111, 104, 99, 92, and 87, Tokomairiro Survey District, and section 3, block I, Akatore Survey District; thence on the west by a

road line known as Thompson's Avenue; on the south by sections 13 and 14, block I, Akatore Survey District; on the east, by block VII in the last-mentioned district; on the north-east, by a direct line from the south-west corner of section 3, through sections 2 and 1, and by sections 5 and 10, block II in the last said district; and by sections 79, 75, 71, 62, 69, 50, 47, and 38, Tokomairiro Survey District, and sections 14 and 11, block I, Table Hill Survey District. And that

THE MILTON ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west by sections 50, 49, and 48, block II, Table Hill Survey District, block XXIII, and section 198, Tokomairiro Survey District; on the south-west, by the Tokomairiro River to section 8, block XXX, Tokomairiro Survey District, section 1, block XXXII, and sections 11 and 4, block XXXI in the last said district, and by block I, Kaitangata Survey District; on the south, by block VI, Akatore Survey District; on the east, by block VII, Akatore Survey District; on the north, by sections 12 and 11, block I, Akatore Survey District; on the east, by a road line known as Thompson's Avenue; and on the north-east, by sections 2, block I, Akatore Survey District; and by sections 86, 93, 98, 105, 110, 117, and 127, Tokomairiro Survey District. And that

THE HILLINGDON ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by block II, Akatore Survey District; on the west by sections 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20 and 21, block I, Akatore Survey District; thence on the north by block I, Akatore Survey District; on the south-west by the Tokomairiro river; on the south-east by the ocean; and on the north-east by the Koaura or Shag Creek. And that

THE COOMBE HAY ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west by sections 33, 32, 31, 30, 29, 28, 27, 26, 25, and 24, block I, Kaitangata Survey District; on the south-west by Rocky Valley Creek; on the south-east by the ocean; and on the north-east by the Tokomairiro river and sections 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8, block XXVIII, Tokomairiro Survey District. And that

THE SOUTHBRIDGE ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by the Tokomairiro river and the southern trunk road; on the south-west by sections 3 and 10, blocks XXXVIII, XXXVII, and XXXVI, Tokomairiro Survey District, and section 24, block I, Kaitangata Survey District; on the south-east by sections 28, 15, 23, 22, 21, and 20, block I, Kaitangata Survey District; on the north-east by section 33, block I, Kaitangata Survey District, section 12, block XXVIII, sections 2 and 3, block XXXI, and section 8, block XXX, Tokomairiro Survey District. And that

THE GLENORE ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by block V, Table Hill Survey District; on the north-west by the north-west boundary of block III, Table Hill Survey District; on the south-west by section 5, block LI, sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, blocks L and XLVII, Tokomairiro Survey District; on the south-east by section 12, block XLII, Tokomairiro Survey District; thence on the south-east by the Tokomairiro river to block XXIV, Tokomairiro Survey District; on the south-east by blocks XXIV, XXII, and XV, Tokomairiro Survey District; on the east by sections 125 and 124, Tokomairiro Survey District, sections 56 and 1 and 2, block II, Table Hill Survey District; thence by the north branch of the Tokomairiro river to the northern boundary of block II, Table Hill Survey District. And that

THE ADAMSTHORPE ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west by the north-west boundary of blocks LI, LIV, and LIII, Tokomairiro Survey District; on the south-west by block X, and sections 10 and 7, block VII, Hill End Survey District, and sections 3 and 10, blocks LXV, XLIV, and XXXIX, Tokomairiro Survey District; on the south-east by the Southern Trunk Road; on

the north-east by the Tokomairiro River, sections 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12, blocks XLVII and L, and section 4, block LI, Tokomairiro Survey District. And that

THE LOVELSBROOK ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by block X, Hill End Survey District; on the south-west and south by Lovell's Creek; on the south-east by the Southern Trunk Road; on the north-east by sections 11 and 2, blocks XXXIX, XLIV, and XLV, and by block LIII, Tokomairiro Survey District.

PROCLAMATION

Reserving and withdrawing for the purpose of sale certain Waste Lands of the Crown, situate on the Tuapeka Gold Field.

By His Honor JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Esquire,

WHEREAS it is expedient that the lands hereinafter described should be reserved and withdrawn for the purposes of sale—Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, do hereby Proclaim and Declare that I do Reserve and Withdraw for the purposes of Sale the lands hereinafter described, that is to say—All that Area commencing at a point at the junction of the Main South Road with the Tuapeka Road, thence along the Tuapeka Road to the Township of Glenore, thence by a line 20 chains north-east of Glenore to the west branch of the Tokomairiro River, thence to the Tuapeka Road west of Glenore, thence in a straight line to Mount Stuart, thence along the south-west boundary of run numbered 54 to Crookburn, thence in a straight line to the southern corner of the Township of Lawrence, thence to the Tuapeka Road, thence in a straight line to the northern corner of Lower Havelock Township, thence to the south-west corner of the same, thence west of the Waitahuna River about 40 chains to a point in a line with the south-east boundary of Lower Havelock Township, thence by the said boundary to the Tuapeka Road, thence along the said road to Round Hill, thence along the dividing range in a north-easterly direction to the north-east boundary of Run numbered 53, thence along the said boundary to the east branch of the Tokomairiro River, thence along the same to its intersection with the Main South Road, and along the said road to the starting point.

Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby Proclaim and Declare the Ferry so established at Inch Clutha, on the Matau Branch of the Molyneux River, below Petchell's Saw Mill, to be a Public Ferry, within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

gers, animals, and goods, chargeable at the Inch Clutha Ferry, and the exemptions therefrom:—

The above Fares and Freights shall be chargeable from sunrise till one hour after sunset. From one hour after sunset till sunrise the above Fares and Freights and one-half more shall be charged.

EXEMPTIONS.

Persons or conveyances carrying the Mail, and any person exhibiting a certificate under the hand of His Honor the Superintendent that such person is on duty in the employment of the General or Provincial Governments, are exempt from payment of the said Fares and Freights.

ORDER IN COUNCIL,

Constituting Oamaru and Waikouaiti Militia Districts, and altering the Northern Boundary of the Dunedin Militia District, in the Province of Otago.

G. GREY Governor.

At the Government House at Auckland, on the 6th day of January, 1865.

Present:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Militia Act 1858," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, Militia Districts, and such Districts from time to time to vary, and to designate the Militia of any such Districts by the name of a Regiment, Battalion, Corps, or Company:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the above power, doth by this present Order constitute the following several Militia Districts, to be called and known by the names following, viz:—

THE OAMARU DISTRICT

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Waitaki River; towards the East by the Ocean; towards the South by the Southern Boundary Line of Blocks 3, 5, and 8, Otepopo Survey District, and the said line extended in an easterly direction until it intersects the circumference of a circle whose radius is fifteen miles in length, and centre the south-west corner of Block 2, Oamaru Survey District; and towards the West by the circumference of the said circle.

THE WAIKOUAITI DISTRICT

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Oamaru Militia District; towards the East by the Ocean; towards the South by a line extending from Brinn's Point in a north-westerly direction until it intersects the circumference of a circle whose radius is fifteen miles in length, and centre the south-west corner of Block 9, Moeraki Survey District; and towards the West by the circumference of the said circle.

THE DUNEDIN MILITIA DISTRICT.

The boundaries of the Dunedin Militia District, as amended, now comprise all that area bounded towards the North by the Waikouaiti Militia District; towards the East by the Ocean; and towards the South and West by the circumference of a circle whose radius is

twenty miles in length, and centre the Police-Office in the Town of Dunedin.
