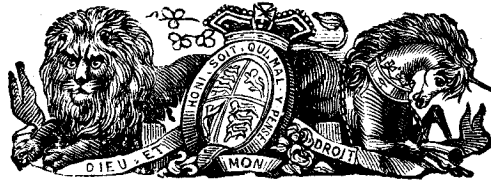

#### PROCLAMATION,

*Reserving and withdrawing for purposes of Sale certain Waste Lands of the Crown situate in the Gold Fields in the Province of Otago.*

By His Honor JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Esquire,  
Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the lands hereinafter described should be reserved and withdrawn for the purposes of sale: Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, Do hereby Proclaim and Declare that I do reserve and withdraw for the purposes of sale the Waste Lands of the Crown particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written, and situate respectively in the Gold Fields in the said Schedule mentioned, that is to say:—

#### SCHEDULE.

IN THE WAKATIPU GOLD-FIELD, All that area situate in the Wakatipu Gold field, containing by admeasurement three hundred and sixty-nine (369) acres one (1) rood and eighteen (18) poles, more or less, situate in the South Wakatipu District of the said Province of Otago, being Village Reserve; together with the whole of the block numbered I, with the exception of sections numbered respectively 27, 28, and 29 on the map of the said district; bounded towards the north by Crown lands, by the Lochy River, also by sections numbered respectively 27 and 28; towards the east by Crown lands, by Lake Wakatipu, also by section numbered 29; towards the south by Crown lands, and sections numbered respectively 27, 28, and 29; and towards the west by Crown lands and section numbered 27.

*Rescinding Proclamation of thirtieth day of May last, so far as the said Proclamation reserved and withdrew for the purposes of Sale the Lands hereinafter described.*

WHEREAS I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in that behalf, did by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, dated the thirtieth day of May last, reserve and withdraw for the purposes of sale certain Waste Lands of the Crown, situate on the Tuapeka Gold-field, which said lands were in the said Proclamation particularly described: And whereas it is expedient to rescind the said Proclamation of the thirtieth day of May last, so far as the lands hereinafter described are affected thereby: Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby proclaim and declare that I do hereby rescind the said Proclamation of the thirtieth day of May last, so far as the lands hereinafter described are affected thereby, that is to say—All that area containing by admeasurement two hundred and twenty-six (226) acres and one (1) rood and seventeen (17) poles, more or less, situate in the Tuapeka District, being sections numbered respectively, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 17, 20, 21, 22, 24, 33, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 55, 69, 81, and 88, block I, on the Map of the said District, bounded towards the north by Crown Lands, towards the east by Crown Lands, towards the south by Crown Lands, and towards the west by Crown Lands: And I do proclaim and declare that the lands hereinbefore described shall, from and after the day of the date hereof, be included within and form part of the said Tuapeka Gold-field.

#### PROCLAMATION.

*North-East Valley Road District divided and diminished, and the Pine Hill Road District formed.*

By His Honor JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Roads Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1862," it is among other things enacted in the 12th section thereof, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance the said Province, except as is therein excepted, may, from time to time, be divided into districts; and until otherwise provided pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there shall be twenty-five districts, which shall be named and bounded as described in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed; and it is also in the said 12th section provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts, by forming and naming new districts, or by dividing any district into two or more districts.

And whereas in the said Schedule the North East Valley Road District therein named is described as comprising All that area bounded on the north by the watershed of the range extending from Mihiwaka to Point Heyward; on the east and south by the Harbour and the town of Port Chalmers; and on the west by Pelichet Creek; thence by the watershed of the ranges extending over Signal Hill and Mount Cargill to Mihiwaka.

And whereas it is expedient to divide and diminish the said North East Valley Road District, and to form a new Road District, to be named "The Pine Hill Road District,"

Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said North East Valley Road District shall, from the day of the date hereof, be divided and diminished, and that from the day of the date hereof there shall be a new Road District, to be named the "Pine Hill Road District," and that henceforth the North East Valley Road District shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west by part of block VIII, and sections 16, 14, 12, 10, 8, 6, 4, and 2, block XI; thence by a direct line through sections 18 and 16, Block X, and sections 13, 12, 9, 8, 7, 6, 3, and 2, block X; on the south-west by the Dunedin Town Belt and sections 51 and 53, block IX; on the south by sections 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, and 61, block IX; on the south-east by sections 26, 25, 24, 23, 22, 21, 20, 19, 18, 17, 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9, 8, and 7, block IX; on the north-east by section 6; thence to the south-eastward by sections 6 and 5; thence on the north-east by sections 4 and 33, block IX, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, sections 84 and 85, North East Valley Survey District, and section 42, block VII, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; and that The Pine Hill Road District shall comprise All that area bounded on the north by block III, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; on the west by the Water of Leith and the Dunedin Town Belt; on the south-east by part of North East Valley Survey District, to section 13; thence by sections 10, 11, 14, 15, a direct line through sections 16 and 18, block X, to the north-west corner of section 1, block XI, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; thence by sections 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, and 15 of the last-named block; on the east by the eastern boundary of block XI; thence by

a direct line to the south-west angle of block XII, and by block XII to block III, North Harbour and Blue-skin Survey District.

### PROCLAMATION

*Waipori Road District Divided, and Henley Road District Formed.*

By His Honor JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Roads Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1862," it is among other things enacted in the 12th section thereof, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance the said Province, except as is therein excepted, may, from time to time, be divided into districts; and until otherwise provided pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there shall be twenty-five districts, which shall be named and bounded as described in the schedule to the said Ordinance annexed; and it is also in the said 12th section provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts, by forming and naming new districts, or by dividing any district into two or more districts.

And Whereas by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, number 317, and dated August the seventh, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the West Taieri Road District, named and described in the schedule to the said Ordinance, was divided, and the Waipori Road District formed. And Whereas the said Waipori Road District is by the said proclamation described as comprising all that area bounded on the north-west by the boundary of the Hundreds; on the north-east by the West Taieri Road District; on the south-east by the Taieri River; and on the south-west by the Waipori Lake and Waipori River. And Whereas it is expedient to divide the said Waipori Road District, and to form a new Road District, to be called the Henley Road District; Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the said Province, with the Advice and Consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby Proclaim and Declare that the boundaries of the said Waipori Road District shall from the day of the date hereof be altered and diminished. And that from the day of the date hereof

THE WAIPORI ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise All that area bounded on the north-west by the boundary Hundreds; on the south and south-west by the Waipori River; on the south-east by blocks VI, V, IV, and III, Maung Atua Survey District, to the western corner of section 4, block II, West Taieri Survey District; thence on the north-east by the boundary line between sections 11 and 12, block II, West Taieri Survey District, and its continuation in the same direction to the boundary of the Hundreds. And I do also Proclaim and Declare that from the day of the date hereof there shall be a New Road District, to be called

THE HENLEY ROAD DISTRICT, comprising All that area bounded on the north by section 38, irregular block, West Taieri Survey District; on the north-west by blocks I and II, Maung Atua Survey District; on the west by the Waipori River and Lake; on the south and south-east by the Taieri River; and on the north-east by block III, Maung Atua Survey District.

WHEREAS, it is intended to stop up those Roads and Portions of Roads situate and being in the Hawksbury Hundred and which are hereinafter described, and are delineated in the map or plan mentioned and referred to in the "Hawksbury Roads Lands Ordinance, 1864," copy of which map or plan is deposited at the Public School in the said Hundred. Now, therefore, I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in that behalf by the "Hawksbury Roads Lands Ordinance, 1864," do hereby give notice that all persons objecting to the stopping up of such Roads, or portions of Roads, or any of them, are required to set forth a statement in writing of any well-grounded objection they may have to the stopping up of such Roads, or portions of Roads, and to leave such statement addressed to me at my office in Dunedin, or at the Police Office, within the said Hawksbury Hundred; within sixty days from the date hereof, otherwise such objections will not be considered by me.

#### *Description of Roads and Portions of Roads proposed to be stopped up, viz.:*—

43 chains 50 links in length, 1 chain wide; from the Northern Trunk Road at Waikouaiti Bridge to the Northern Trunk Road; bounded on the north-west by land the property of John Jones, Esq., on the south-east by Application 246.

2 chains 50 links in length, 1 chain wide; from Northern Trunk to old North Road; bounded on the south-west by the property of John Jones, Esq., south-east by Application 246.

6 chains 10 links in length, 1 chain wide; from old North Road to Northern Trunk; bounded on both sides by the property of John Jones, Esq.

33 chains in length, 1 chain wide; from Northern Trunk to Old North Road; bounded on both sides by the property of John Jones, Esq.

8 chains in length, 1 chain wide; from Waikouaiti River to Mill Track; bounded on both sides by the property of John Jones, Esq.
