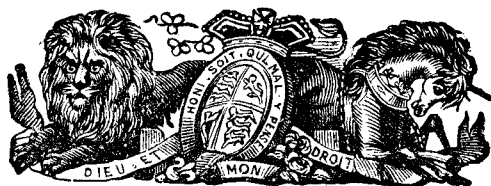

ADDRESS OF HIS HONOR THE SUPERINTENDENT

ON PROROGUING THE TWENTIETH SESSION OF THE PROVINCIAL COUNCIL OF THE PROVINCE OF OTAGO, THURSDAY, 18TH MAY, 1865.

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Provincial Council—

I have now to thank you for the careful consideration which you have given to the various important measures brought before you during the present Session, and I trust that your legislation will result in the permanent advancement of the Province.

I have also to thank you for the supplies which you have voted for carrying on the Government and Public Works; and to assure you of my desire to administer the revenue with a wise economy.

The various resolutions which you have passed and communicated to me shall receive from the Government that attention which is due to your recommendation, and the importance of the subjects thus brought under my notice.

In addition to the Dunedin Town Board Dissolution Ordinance, to which I have already assented, I now assent on behalf of the Governor to the following Bills, viz:—

THE following is published for general information:—

Sir, I am directed to inform you that, for the present, and pending further and final arrangements, you are authorised to allow the expenses in Criminal Prosecution, in accordance with the Regulations of 23rd February, 1864 (published in the *Gazette* of 3rd March); but in the case of Prosecutors in witnesses, according to the following scale:—

Common Witnesses, such as Labourers, per diem,	6s.
Journeyman, &c.,	10s.
Master Tradesmen,	15s.
Farmers and Yeomen,	15s.
Auctioneers,	15s.
Professional Men,	21s.
Female Witnesses at the rate of two-thirds the allowance to Male Witnesses of similar rank.	

Travelling Expenses.

Where the Witnesses reside at a distance exceeding one mile from the place of trial, travelling expenses at not exceeding 1s. 6d. per mile one way.

Witnesses being officers in the pay of the Government are not to be paid for their time, but only for extra costs occasioned by their attendance.
