[The Proclamation beginning on the first, and ending on the second column of page 30, of *Gazette* No. 367, dated 7th June current, not having properly described the Land intended to be reserved and withdrawn from sale, the said Proclamation has been cancelled, and the following is issued in lieu thereof.]

PROCLAMATION

Reserving and withdrawing for the purposes of sale certain Waste Lands of the Crown, situate on the Wakatipu Gold Field, in the Province of Otago.

By his Honor John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS on the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in that behalf, did by Proclamation in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, constitute and appoint a certain portion of the said Province to be a Gold Field under the name of the "Wakatipu Gold Field," and the limits of which Gold Field, I did, in and by the said Proclamation define; and whereas the lands hereinafter described are Waste Lands of the Crown, and are within the said limits, and form part of the said Wakatipu Gold Field so proclaimed as aforesaid, and no Pastoral License exists over the said last-mentioned Lands: And whereas it has been made to appear to me that the Lands hereinafter described are necessary for settlement, public purposes, and roads;—Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that I do reserve and withdraw for the purposes of sale the Lands hereinafter described—that is to say—

All that area situate in the Wakatipu Gold Field, in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement eighty (80) acres, more or less, commencing at a point on a line drawn at the magnetic bearing of 284 deg. 15 min. from a rock at the junction of M'Connachie's Creek with Moke Creek, on which a bench mark has been cut, and distant therefrom four thousand two hundred (4200) links; thence bounded by a line bearing S. 21 deg. 5 min. E., eight thousand (8000) links; thence by a line bearing N. 68 deg. 55 min. E., one thousand (1000) links; thence by a line

bearing N. 21 deg. 5 min. W., eight thousand (8000) links; thence by a line bearing S. 68 deg. 55 min. W., one thousand (1000) links, and intersected by Moke Creek: all bearings being magnetic.

PROCLAMATION,

Declaring Detonating Caps, Powder, &c., Warlike Stores.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Arms Act, 1860," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, from time to time, to declare what Articles shall be considered as Warlike Stores for the purposes of the said Act, and also for the purposes of an Ordinance

of Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of New Zealand, passed in the sixth session of the said Council, intituled "An Ordinance to empower the Governor of New Zealand to regulate the impetration and sale of Arms, Gunpowder, and other Warlike Stores."

Now therefore I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, do hereby proclaim and declare that the undermentioned Articles shall (amongst others) be considered as Warlike Stores, for the purpose above mentioned, that is to say—

Detonating Caps, Powder, and all other articles capable of being used for the discharging of fire-arms.

The numbers of the Military and their families on the 1st of December, were—Officers and men, 9,136; male children, 933; total males, 10,069. Women, 1,024; female children, 880; total females, 1,904. Total of the Military and their families, 11,973; making the general total of the European population 183,904, viz., 116,548 males, and 67,356 females.

The numbers of Military Settlers and the Colonial Defence Force, included in the above table, were, in the aggregate, 6,382, viz., 5,139 males, and 1,243 females. Their distribution in the several Provinces of the Northern Island on the Census night, was:—Auckland: Males, 4,035; females, 1,089; total, 5,124. Taranaki: Males, 969; females, 118; total, 1,087. Wellington: Males, 35; females, 14; total, 49. Hawke's Bay: Males, 100; females, 22; total, 122. Further information will be found in the next table (No. II.)

No return for the Chatham Islands has yet been received. The European population in 1861 was 50, viz., 27 males and 23 females.
