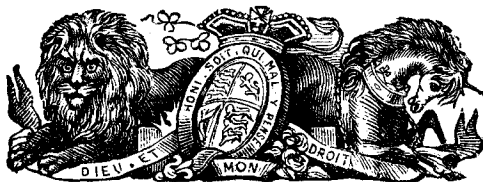

Governor's Order, No. 63,

Declaring the Port of Taieri no longer a Port of Entry.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, &c.

IN exercise of the power in me for this purpose vested by "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare that the

PORT OF TAIERI,

in the Province of Otago, shall be no longer a Port of Entry for the purposes of "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858."

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and in exercise of all powers and authorities vested in him in this behalf, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, order that from and

after the first day of December next, no Goods whatever shall be carried Coastwise from any port or place in or from any part of New Zealand to any port or place on or to any part of the East Coast of New Zealand situate between the South Head of Tauranga Harbor, in the Bay of Plenty, and Table Cape.
