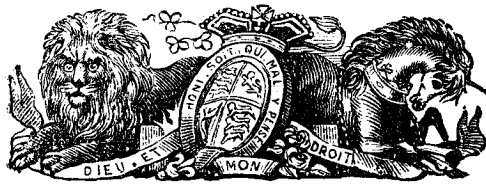

#### WAREPA ROAD DISTRICT. NOTICE.

WHEREAS it is intended to stop up those Roads and Portions of Roads situate and being in the Warepa Road District, and which are hereinafter described, and are delineated in the map or plan mentioned and referred to in the "Roads Diversion Ordinance, 1864," copies of which map or plan are deposited at the Public School at Warepa, in the said District;—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in that behalf by the "Roads Diversion Ordinance, 1864," do hereby give notice that all persons objecting to the stopping up of such roads, or portions of roads, or any of them, are required to set forth a statement in writing of any well-grounded objection that they may have to the stopping up of such roads or portions of roads, and to leave such statement, addressed to me, at my office, in Dunedin, within sixty days from the date hereof, otherwise such objections will not be considered by me.

*Description of the Roads and Portions of Roads in the Warepa District, which the Superintendent is empowered to Stop Up.*

#### WAREPA ROAD DISTRICT.

- 1.—22 chains in length, 60 links wide, from District Road on section 2, block XXX, to boundary line of Warepa District; boundaries, north, section 2, block XXX; south, section 12, block XXIX, Clutha Survey District.
- 2.—58 chains in length, 60 links wide, from District Road on section 11, block XXXII, to District Road on section 7, block XXXIV, Clutha; boundaries, east, part of block XXXIII; west, part of block XXXIV, Clutha.
- 3.—136 chains in length, 60 links wide, from Trunk Road on section 7, block XXXVIII, to District Road on section 2, block XXIX; boundaries, east, block

XXIX and part of XXX; west, block XXXVII and part of block XXXVIII, Clutha.

4.—8 chains in length, 60 links wide from District Road on section 2, block XXIX, Clutha Survey District, to District Road on section 12, block XXVIII; boundaries, north, section 2, block XXIX; south, section 12, block XXVIII, Clutha Survey District.

5.—17 chains in length, 60 links wide, from District Road on section 38, block I, Warepa, to District Road on section 1, block XXXVII, Clutha Survey District; boundaries, north, part of section 1, block XXXVII, Clutha; south, part of section 38, block I, Warepa.

6.—26 chains in length, 60 links wide, from District Road on section 1, block XXXVII, to District Road on section 2, block XXXVII, Clutha Survey District; boundaries, north, parts of sections 1 and 2, block XXXVII; south, parts of sections 37 and 38, block I, Warepa.

7.—28 chains in length, 60 links wide, from District Road on section 9, block XXXIX, to block line dividing blocks XXXIX and XL; boundaries, east, sections 10 and 12, block XXXI; west, sections 9 and 11, block XXXIX, Clutha.

8.—7 chains in length, 60 links wide, from District Road on section 4, block XL, to District Road on section 3, block XLVI; boundaries, east, section 4, block XL; west section 3, block XLVI, Clutha.

9.—56 chains in length, 60 links wide, from District Road on section 1, block XLVI to Trunk Road on section 5, block XLV, Clutha; boundaries, east, part of blocks XXXIX and XL; west, part of blocks XLV and XLVI, Clutha.

10.—53 chains in length, 60 links wide, from Southern Trunk Road on section 8, block XLI, to District Road on section 12, block XL; boundaries, east, block XLI, and section 12, block XL; west, block XLVII, and section 11, block XLVI, Clutha.

11.—56 chains in length, 60 links wide, from Trunk Road on section 5, block XLV, to District Road on section 11, block XLIV; boundaries, east, part of

blocks XXXVIII and XXXIX; west, part of blocks XLIV and XLV, Clutha.

12.—76 chains in length, 60 links wide, from District Road to Trunk Road, on section 1, block XXXIX; boundaries, north, part of blocks XXXIX and XLV; south, part of blocks XXXVIII and XLIV, Clutha.

13.—38 chains in length, 60 links wide, from Trunk Road on section 5, block LVIII, to District Road at block CI, Clutha; boundaries, east, part of block LI; west, part of block LVIII, Clutha.

17.—74 chains in length, 60 links wide, from District Road on section 5, block LXXIV, to Main Road on section 8, block LXV; boundaries, east, sections 6, 4, and 2, block LXXVI, and 12, 11, and 8, block LXV; west, sections 5, 3, and 1, block LXXVI, and sections 11, 9, and 7, block LXXIII.

18.—94 chains in length, 60 links wide, from Road line between blocks LVIII and LXV to District Road on section 1, block LXXIII, Clutha; boundaries, north, block LXV, and section 1, block LXXIII; south, part of block CII, Clutha.

19.—68 chains in length, 60 links wide, from District Road on section 10, block LXXXI to block line between LXXXI and CIII, Clutha; boundaries, east, block LXXXI; west, part of block LXXXV, Clutha.

20.—18 chains in length, 60 links wide, from Road line between blocks XLI and XLVII to District Road on section 2, block XLI, Clutha; boundaries, north, section 2, block XLI; south, section 12, block XL, Clutha.

#### No. 12.—WAREPA ROAD DISTRICT.

3.—166 chains in length, 60 links wide, from District Road between block XXXVII, Clutha Survey District, and block I, Warepa to District Road on section 12, block XXXVIII, Clutha Survey District: Boundaries—east, block XXXVII and part of block

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor SAMUEL BEALEY, Esq., rescinding a certain Proclamation under "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."

WHEREAS on the 23rd day of September, 1865, I, Samuel Bealey, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, did, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, issue a Proclamation declaring certain Districts to be infected Districts under "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," and making certain regulations for the destruction of diseased cattle, and for the preventing the removal or transportation of cattle from the said infected Districts into the Province of Canterbury. Now therefore I, SAMUEL BEALEY, Superintendent as aforesaid, do hereby rescind the said Proclamation.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor SAMUEL BEALEY, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, appointing Quarantine Ground under "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it is (*inter alia*), enacted that the Governor might by order in Council, from time to time appoint places for quarantine grounds under the said Act, and make regulations for the management of such quarantine grounds, and fixing the fees and charges thereof; and for the destroying of diseased cattle, and for landing and driving of cattle under the said Act, and generally for regulating and enforcing the performance of duties thereby imposed on Inspectors and on Masters of ships or vessels.

And whereas the Governor in Council hath by warrant under his hand delegated to me SAMUEL BEALEY, so long as I shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, the several powers vested in the Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth and tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act is provided, and subject to the regulations issued by the Governor in Council.

Now, therefore, I the said SAMUEL BEALEY, by virtue of the powers vested in me, do hereby appoint all that portion of the Province of Canterbury, to the west of the dividing range, to be a quarantine ground under the said Act.
