### SHEEP RETURNS.

**HIS** Honor the Superintendent directs the publication of the following Annual Report and Return.

**SIR**—I have the honor to forward the Annual Return of Sheep for the Province of Otago for the year ending 30th September, 1865.

The enclosed list shows a total of one million two hundred and seventy-two thousand one hundred and thirty-five (1,272,135), of which one hundred and ninety-seven thousand one hundred and sixty-two (197,162) are wethers over two-tooth.

The importations of sheep have been very limited during the year. Landed at Port Chalmers four thousand seven hundred and sixteen (4716). Brought overland from Canterbury four thousand two hundred (4200). I have been unable to discover how many came from Southland, having received no Return from the Southern Inspector, but I believe the number to be small, probably about four thousand (4000), which, in comparison with last year, will show a difference of one hundred and four thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven (104,897).

There is also a considerable decrease in the consumption of mutton, the number of sheep killed for use of stations as per returns being eighteen thousand six hundred and thirty-nine (18,639); and for Dunedin and suburbs twenty-three thousand nine hundred and ninety-four (23,994).

The severe weather experienced during the last few months has had a very prejudicial effect on the lambing. I estimate the average percentage at not over 60, while a few flocks in favoured localities may reach 90.

The condition of the flocks generally is fair, and the clip will be equal in quantity and quality to last.

The yearly returns show sixty-nine thousand and two hundred (69,200) diseased, being a reduction of forty-six thousand four hundred and seventy-five (46,475) in comparison with last year. The cause I attribute to the improved method of dipping, and the erection of proper dips, together with the careful mustering of the sheep and close supervision by the officers of the Department. I anticipate a reduction of the number diseased to at least one half in the course of the next quarter, as shearing operations are being carried on, thereby rendering dipping easier and more effectual.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor SAMUEL BEALEY, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, declaring certain Districts to be infected under "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."

WHEREAS by "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it was provided that the Governor in Council might, by warrant under his hand, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the said Colony, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such Regulations as he might think fit, and might from time to time rescind such delegation: And whereas the said Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to SAMUEL BEALEY, Esquire, so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, the several powers vested in the said Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act provided, and subject to the Regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the Eighteenth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and to any other Regulations to be from time to time duly made:

Now, therefore, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, by virtue of such powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare, that after the date hereof the several Provinces of the Colony of New Zealand, that is to say, the Provinces of Otago and of Southland, in the Middle Island, and the Provinces of Auckland and of Taranaki in the North Island, shall be deemed to be infected Districts within the meaning of the said Act: And I do further proclaim and declare the following Regulations for the destruction of diseased cattle, and for the preventing and regulating the removal or transportation of cattle from the said several infected Districts into the Province of Canterbury.

- I. If any person shall import, drive or remove, or cause to be imported, driven or removed, or assist in driving or removing any cattle from either of the said infected Districts into the Province of Canterbury, except upon Quarantine ground, and the authority of a Quarantine certificate, such person shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty Pounds for every head of cattle so imported, driven, or removed.
- II. It shall be lawful for any Inspector of cattle, or Police Constable to destroy, or cause to be destroyed, any cattle which shall pass into this Province from either of the said districts contrary to these Regulations.
- III. If any person shall wilfully impede or obstruct any Inspector, or any Police Constable acting under the authority of these Regulations, every person so offending shall and may be seized and detained by such person so acting

as aforesaid, or any person or persons he may call to his assistance, until such offender or offenders can be taken before two Justices of the Peace, and shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty Pounds.

## A PROCLAMATION

Appointing certain Districts under "The Marriage Act."

WHEREAS by "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to divide the Colony of New Zealand, for the purposes of the said Act, into such and so many districts as he may think fit, and that every such district shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's District, and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation, and issue a new Proclamation, dividing the Colony or any part of it anew into districts, or increasing the number or altering the boundaries of districts, as from time to time he may think requisite.

And whereas, by Proclamation duly made and issued, the Governor in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did, amongst others, constitute districts in the Province of Otago for the purposes of the said Act, the boundaries whereof were therein set forth.

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamations as relates to the said districts, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised within such districts;

Now therefore I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation, so far as relates to the said districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such districts shall be and is hereby divided for the purposes of the said Act into districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

## DUNEDIN DISTRICT,

comprises all that area bounded on the north by the Waihemo Creek, Blueskin Bay, and the ocean; on the east and south by Port Chalmers District, and by the ocean; and on the west by Kaikorai and Abbott's

Creeks; thence by the watershed of the Kaikorai, Flagstaff, and Swampy Hill Ranges, to the source of the Waihemo Creek.

#### PORT CHALMERS DISTRICT.

All that area comprising the town of Port Chalmers, the Lower Harbour, West Survey District, the Sawyer's Bay Survey District, sections numbered 88 to 115 inclusive, North-east Valley Survey District, and blocks IV, V, VI, and part of VII, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District, bounded from the north-west corner of block IV, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District, in a southerly direction, by the western boundary line of the said block IV, to the northern boundary line of block VI, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District; thence by the said northern boundary line of the said block VI, and the northern boundary line of block VII, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District to the main North Road; thence by the Main North Road to the Northern boundary line of the North-east Valley Survey District; thence in a westerly direction by the said northern boundary line of the North-east Valley District to a road line between sections 87 and 89 of the said district; thence by the said road line continued between sections 86 and 88, North-east Valley District, to the northern boundary line of block IX, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District; thence in an easterly direction by the said northern boundary line of the said block IX, to the north-west corner of section 33, Sawyer's Bay Survey District; thence in a south-easterly direction by the boundary line of the said Sawyer's Bay Survey District to Otago Harbor; and thence by high-water mark to the starting point.

#### ARROW DISTRICT,

**A PROCLAMATION**

*Appointing certain Districts under "The Registration Act."*

**WHEREAS** by "The Registration Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to divide the Colony of New Zealand for the purposes of the said Act into such and so many districts as he may think fit, and that every such district shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Registrar's district; and it is provided that the Governor may at any time revoke the whole or any part of such Proclamation, and issue a new Proclamation dividing the Colony or any part of it anew into districts, or increasing the number or altering the boundaries of districts as from time to time he may think requisite.

And whereas, by Proclamations duly made and issued, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, did amongst others constitute districts in the Province of Otago for the purposes of the said Act, the boundaries whereof were therein set forth.

And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamations as relates to the said districts, and to divide anew the territory formerly comprised within such districts:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamations so far as relates to the said districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within such districts shall be and is hereby divided for the purposes of the said Act into districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

**DUNEDIN DISTRICT,**

comprises all that area bounded on the north by the Waihemo Creek, Blueskin Bay, and the ocean; on the east and south by Port Chalmers District and by the ocean; and on the west by Kaikorai and Abbott's Creek's; thence by the watershed of the Kaikorai Flagstaff and Swampy Hill Ranges to the source of the Waihemo Creek.

**PORT CHALMERS DISTRICT,**

All that area comprising the Town of Port Chalmers, the Lower Harbor, West Survey District, the Sawyer's Bay Survey District, sections numbered 88 to 115 inclusive, North-east Valley Survey District, and blocks IV, V, VI, and part of VII North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District—bounded from the north-west corner of block IV, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District, in a southerly direction, by the western boundary line of the said block IV to the northern boundary line of block VI, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District; thence by the said northern boundary line of the said block VI, and the northern boundary line of block VII, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District, to the Main North Road; thence by the Main North Road to the northern boundary line of the North-east Valley Survey District; thence in a westerly direction by the said northern boundary line of the North-east Valley District to a road line between sections 87 and 89 of the said district; thence by the said road line continued between sections 86 and 88, North-east Valley District to the northern boundary line of block IX, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District; thence in an easterly direction by the said northern boundary line of the said block IX to the north-west corner of section 33, Sawyer's Bay Survey District; thence in a south-easterly direction by the boundary line of the said Sawyer's Bay Survey District to Otago Harbor; and thence by high-water mark to the starting point.

**ARROW DISTRICT,**

comprises all that area bounded towards the north and east by the Wanaka District, and by the Dunstan Districts; towards the south by the Kawarau River; and on the west by the watershed of the Shotover and Arrow Rivers.

**OAMARU DISTRICT,**

comprises all that area bounded on the north by the Province of Canterbury; on the east by the ocean; on the south by the Horse, Kakanui Hawkden Ranges; and on the west by Mount St. Bathans, and the continuation of the Dunstan Mountains to the Province of Canterbury.

**EAST TAIERI DISTRICT,**

comprises all that area bounded on the north by Waikouaiti District; on the east by Dunedin District; on the south by the ocean; and on the west by the Taieri River.

**WAIKOUAITI DISTRICT,**

comprises all that area bounded towards the east from Shag Point by the ocean to the Dunedin Registration District; thence towards the south by the Dunedin Registration District to Silver Peak Hills; by Silver Peak Hills to a point due east of Allen's Creek; thence to Allen's Creek, and by the said Creek to the Taieri River; thence towards the west by the Taieri River to Fillyburn; thence towards the north by a line due east to the Oamaru Registration District; and thence by the said District to the starting point.

**WAKATIP DISTRICT,**

comprises all that area bounded towards the north by the Province of Canterbury; towards the east by th

Wanaka, Arrow, Dunstan, and Nokomai Registration Districts; towards the south by the Province of Southland and the ocean; and towards the west by the ocean.

#### WAREPA DISTRICT,

comprises all that area bounded towards the north by the Nokomai Registration District; towards the east by the Manuherikia, Mount Benger, and Gabriel's Registration Districts, and by the Clutha River, Koan branch; towards the south by the ocean; and towards the west by the Province of Southland.

#### WEST TAIERI DISTRICT,

comprises all that area bounded towards the north by the Lammermoor Ranges and Sutton's Stream; towards the east by Waikouaiti and East Taieri Districts; and towards the south and west by Tokomairiro and Gabriel's Districts.

#### MOUNT BENDER DISTRICT,

comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding from the north-west corner of Gabriel's Registration District in a northerly direction, and parallel to the Clutha River to Spylaw Burn at its source; thence by Spylaw Burn to the Pomahaka River; thence to Wart Hill; thence to White Coomb; thence by the Umbrella Mountains to a point due west of Jordan Creek; thence of Jordan Creek at its junction with the Clutha River; thence to south Roughridge Hill; thence along the western boundary of Hamilton Registration District to the Lammerlaw; and thence in a south-westerly direction by the boundary line of Gabriel's Registration District to the starting point.

#### MANUHERIKIA DISTRICT,

comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding in a westerly direction from White Coomb to the Wakaia River; thence by the Wakaia River to the White Coomb Creek; thence by the ranges to Rocky Mount; thence to the Obelisk; thence in a northerly direction to a point due west of Earnsclough Burn; thence to Earnsclough Burn at its junction with the Clutha River; thence parallel to the Manuherikia River to Spottis Burn; thence in a southerly direction to the Raggedy Range; and by the watershed of Manor Burn to South Roughridge Hill; thence in a westerly direction by the boundary of Mount Benger Registration District.

#### GABRIEL'S DISTRICT,

comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding in a northerly direction, twenty chains distant from and parallel to the Clutha River, from a point opposite Crookburn, to a point opposite Beaumont Burn; thence to and along Beaumont Burn to its source; thence to the Lammerlaw; thence along the ranges to Maungatua Hill; thence by the boundary of the West Taieri Hundred to a point south-east of Waitahuna Hill; thence over Waitahuna Hill to the watershed between the Waitahuna and Tuapeka Rivers; thence to Crookburn at its source, and thence along Crookburn, and across the Clutha River to the starting point.

#### NOKOMAI DISTRICT,

comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding from Lorn Peak to Rocky Mount; thence by the ranges over the Seeple and East Dome to the boundary of the Province of Southland; thence by the boundary of the Province of Southland to a point two miles above Allanburn; and thence in a north-easterly direction to Lorn Peak, the starting point.

#### DUNSTAN DISTRICT,

comprises all that area bounded by a line proceeding from the northern corner of Manuherikia Registration District to the Dunstan Creek at its junction with

the Manuherikia River; thence by the said creek to the Dunstan Mountains; thence to Park Burn at its junction with the Clutha River; thence by Park Burn to its source; thence to Kirtle Burn, at the junction of its first feeder; thence by Kirtle Burn to the Kawarau River; thence by the Kawarau River to a point due north of Ben Nevis; thence by the ranges to Lorn Peak; thence by the Nokomai and Manuherikia Registration Districts to the starting point.

#### BLACKSTONE DISTRICT,

*Saddle Hill Road District Altered; Moeraki Bush Road District Divided; and Walton, Greyton, Brighton, Kurimoto, Motupipi, and Otakia Road Districts Formed.*

By His Honor JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Roads Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1862," it is among other things enacted in the 12th section thereof, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance the said Province, except as is therein excepted, may, from time to time, be divided into districts; and until otherwise provided pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there shall be twenty-five districts, which shall be named and bounded as described in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed; and it is also in the said 12th section provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts, by forming and naming new districts, or by dividing any district into two or more districts.

And whereas in the said Schedule the Saddle Hill Road District therein named is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north by East Taieri District; on the east by Kaikorai and Green Island Districts; on the south by the Ocean and the Otakia Creek; and on the west by Block II, Otakia District.

And whereas in the said Schedule the Moeraki Bush District named therein is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north-west by the Taieri River; on the north-east by Saddle Hill District; on the south-east by the Ocean; and on the south-west by the Maori Reserve.

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said Saddle Hill Road District, and to divide the said Moeraki Bush Road District: And whereas it is also expedient to form six New Road Districts, to be called respectively the Walton, Greyton, Brighton, Kurimoto, Motupipi, and Otakia Road Districts.

Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim

and declare that the boundaries of the said Saddle Hill Road District shall henceforth be altered, and that henceforth

The SADDLE HILL ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north and north-west by the Southern Trunk Road; on the west by section 41, irregular block, East Taieri Survey District, section 32, application 19, sections 17 and 15, block I, Otakia Survey District; on the south by sections 10, 11, 36, 37, and 20, a line through section 30 to the north-west angle of section 39, section 39, 1 of 22, and 33, and a line through section 34 block VIII, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District to its eastern boundary, and by section 71 block VII, in the said Survey District; and on the east by section 41 block VII, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District, and by section 26, Green Island West Survey District: And I do also, with the like advice and consent, proclaim and declare that the said Moeraki Bush Road District shall, from the day of the date hereof, be abolished, and in lieu thereof there shall be six new Road Districts, that is to say, the Walton, Greyton, Brighton, Kurimoto, Motupipi, and Otakia Road Districts. And that

The WALTON ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by the Southern Trunk Road to section 40 block VII, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District, thence on the west by sections 40 and 73 in the said block; thence on the north by section 73, in the said block, thence by a line through section 34 to its western boundary sections 59, 31, 32, a direct line through section 30 to its western boundary sections 21, 57, and 9, block VIII, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District; on the west by sections 15, 13, and 11, block I, Otakia, and by Taylor's Creek to the Ocean; on the south by the Ocean; and on the east by the Kaikorai River and Abbot's Creek to the Main South Road. #### CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL JETTIES.

8. Jetties will be let, subject to all Acts, Ordinances, and Harbour Regulations in force for the time being,

and the Harbour Master shall retain control over all Jetties, so far as these Acts, Ordinances, and Regulations will apply.

9. The lessee must keep all the property under lease in thorough repair.

10. No offices to be erected on any Jetty, except by permission of the Government, save sentry-box for the Night Watchman.

11. All Jetties to be clean swept every Saturday afternoon.

12. The Government shall be entitled to the free and sole use of any Jetty at any time, for the purpose of receiving distinguished visitors, or for any other public purpose.

13. The Landing Steps at all Jetties shall be open to the public, and no charge shall be made for watermen's boats plying to and from said Landing places.

14. The Jetty Dues shall be at the following rates, on all goods shipped or landed, and shall be paid by the master or owner of the vessel:—

Vessels under 40 tons register shall be allowed four, and vessels above that tonnage shall be allowed six, working days to load and unload at the Jetties, as the case may be; and any vessel remaining longer at any Jetty shall be charged one penny per registered ton per day.

15. All lamps must be kept properly burning from sunset till sunrise.

16. The lessee must keep on each Jetty, if required by the Harbour Master, a Notice Board, placed to the satisfaction of the Harbour Master, containing the Scale of Charges, and any other Jetty or Harbour Regulations which the Harbour Master may deem necessary.

17. The leases shall contain the foregoing conditions and other usual and necessary clauses of a lease.

The following sums were collected at Jetty-street Jetties and Stuart-street Jetty, Dunedin, during the year 1864, clear of expenses of collecting. The other Jetties have been free hitherto. There is a slight alteration in the mode in which the dues are to be levied under the lease from that which existed during 1864. The expense of collecting was £625.

### PROCLAMATION.

*Tokomairiro Road District abolished, and Milburn, Helensbrook, Milton, Hillingdon, Coombe Hay, Southbridge, Glenore, Adamsthorpe, and Lovelsbrook Road Districts formed.*

By His Honor JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Roads Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1862," it is among other things enacted in the 12th section thereof, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance the said Province, except as is therein excepted, may, from time to time, be divided into districts; and until otherwise provided pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there shall be twenty-five districts, which shall be named and bounded as described in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed; and it is also in the said 12th section provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts, by forming and naming new districts, or by dividing any district into two or more districts.

And whereas in the said Schedule the Tokomairiro Road District therein named is described as comprising—All that area bounded on the north-west by the boundary of the Hundreds; on the north-east by Waiholā District; on the east, by the watershed of the ranges from Gorge Hill over stations I and S to the source of Shag Creek, thence by Shag Creek to the Ocean; on the south by the Ocean; and on the south-west by Rocky Valley Creek, and the watershed over Mount Misery and Station H, to the watershed of the Ranges leading towards Mount Stuart.

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said Tokomairiro Road District, and to form nine new Road Districts, to be called respectively, the Milburn, Helensbrook, Milton, Hillingdon, Coombe Hay, Southbridge, Glenore, Adamsthorpe, and Lovelsbrook Road Districts.

Now therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Tokomairiro Road District shall, from the day of the date hereof, be

abolished, and that in lieu thereof there shall be nine new Road Districts;—that is to say, the Milburn, Helensbrook, Milton, Hillingdon, Coombe Hay, Southbridge, Glenore, Adamsthorpe, and Lovelsbrook Road Districts; and that

THE MILBURN ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by the northern boundary of block I, Table Hill Survey District; on the west, by the north branch of the Tokomairiro River as far as section 2, block II, Table Hill Survey District; on the south-west, by sections 10 and 13, block I, Table Hill Survey District; sections 39, 46, 51, 58, 63, 70, 76, and 80, Tokomairiro Survey District; sections 9 and 4, and a direct line through sections 1 and 2 to the south-west angle of section 3, block II, Akatore Survey District; on the east, by block VIII, Akatore Survey District; and on the north-east, by block III, Clarendon, and blocks I and II, Waiholā Survey District. And that

THE HELENSBROOK ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by section 8, block I, and sections 3 and 4, block II, Table Hill Survey District; on the west by sections 58, 57, 55, and 54, block II in the said district; on the south-west, by sections 51 and 50, block II, in the said district; sections 128, 116, 111, 104, 99, 92, and 87, Tokomairiro Survey District, and section 3, block I, Akatore Survey District; thence on the west by a road line known as Thompson's Avenue; on the south by sections 13 and 14, block I, Akatore Survey District; on the east, by block VII in the last-mentioned district; on the north-east, by a direct line from the south-west corner of section 3, through sections 2 and 1, and by sections 5 and 10, block II in the last said district; and by sections 79, 75, 71, 62, 59, 50, 47, and 38, Tokomairiro Survey District, and sections 14 and 11, block I, Table Hill Survey District. 15. All lamps must be kept properly burning from sunset till sunrise.

By His Honor JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Roads Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1862," it is among other things enacted in the 12th section thereof, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance the said Province except as is therein excepted, may, from time to time, be divided into districts; and until otherwise provided pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there shall be twenty-five districts, which shall be named and bounded as described in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed; and it is also in the said 12th section provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts, by forming and naming new districts, or by dividing any district into two or more districts.

And whereas, in the said Schedule, the Molyneux Road District, therein named, is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north by the Trunk Road, the Clutha River and its southern branch; on the east by the Clutha River and the Ocean; on the south, by the boundary of the Hundreds; and on the west, by the Puerua River and a continuation of that straight line halving Blocks XXXI., XXXII., and XXXIV., stretching from the Puerua River to the Trunk Road.

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said Molyneux Road District and to form in lieu thereof four new Road Districts, to be called respectively, the Port Molyneux, Puerua, Otanomomo, and Finegand Road Districts.

Now, therefore I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Molyneux Road District shall, from the day of the date hereof, be abolished, and in lieu thereof there shall be four new Road Districts, that is to say, the Port Molyneux, Puerua, Otanomomo and Finegand Road Districts, and that

THE PORT MOLYNEUX ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west by the Omaru River, on the south-west by the south-west boundary of the East Clutha Hundred; on the south-east by the Kororo Creek, on east by the Native Reserve, the Ocean, and the River Clutha; and on the north-east by the Puerua. And that

THE PUERUA ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by the Puerua and section 8, block XXV, and section 7, block XXX, Clutha Survey District; on the west by sections 6, 4, and 2, block XXX, Clutha Survey District, and a continuation of the same line to the crossing of the Puerua; thence, on the north-west by the Puerua to the boundary of the hundred; on the south-west by the south-west boundary of the East Clutha Hundred; and on the south-east by the River Omaru. And that

THE OTANOMOMO ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-east and north by the Waitapeka; on the north-west and west by the Main Road from Balclutha to Port Molyneux; on the south by section 5, block XXX, and section 6, block XXV, Clutha Survey District, and by the River Puerua. Station Q; and on the south east by the watershed of the ranges to Two Stone Hill.

And I do also, with the like advice and consent, proclaim and declare that from the day of the date hereof there shall be three new Road Districts, to be called respectively the Tuakitoto, North Molyneux, and Stony Creek Road Districts; and that

2. The lessee must keep three lamps on each of Jetty-street new Jetty, and Rattray-street Jetty, same as at present on Jetty-street new Jetty; also one lamp on each of Pelichet Bay Jetty, Stuart-street Jetty, and Jetty-street old Jetty, the same as at present on the said old Jetty.

3. The Lessee shall pay as required what the Harbor Master shall consider reasonable wages to a Night Watchman, who shall be appointed by and be under the direction of the Harbor Master.

4. The Shed on the new Jetty must be at all times available for passengers' and immigrants' luggage. The charge for receiving, including delivery, of luggage and goods shall be at the rate of not more than 2s. per ton; and for storage at the rate of not more than 2s. per ton per week. No charge for storage shall be made for immigrants' luggage for the first 48 hours. So much of the Shed as is not required for luggage may be used for all unclaimed goods found on the Jetty, and for goods requiring shelter for a short time only. The Harbor Master shall have an office in the Shed.

5. Water not to exceed the rate of 2s. 6d. per ton; but the Government will not be in any way responsible for the continuance of the water supply.

6. Weighbridge Dues shall be the same as at present, viz., 6d. for every cart, and 1s. for every waggon.

CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO PORT CHALMERS JETTY.

7. The lessee of Port Chalmers Jetty must keep a lamp upon the Jetty, the same as at present.

CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL JETTIES.

8. Jetties will be let, subject to all Acts, Ordinances, and Harbour Regulations in force for the time being, and the Harbour Master shall retain control over all Jetties, so far as these Acts, Ordinances, and Regulations will apply.

9. The lessee must keep all the property under lease in thorough repair.

10. No offices to be erected on any Jetty, except by permission of the Government, save sentry-box for the Night Watchman.

11. All Jetties to be clean swept every Saturday afternoon.

12. The Government shall be entitled to the free and sole use of any Jetty at any time, for the purpose of receiving distinguished visitors, or for any other public purpose.

13. The Landing Steps at all Jetties shall be open to the public, and no charge shall be made for watermen's boats plying to and from said Landing places.

14. The Jetty Dues shall be at the following rates, on all goods shipped or landed, and shall be paid by the master or owner of the vessel:—

Vessels under 40 tons register shall be allowed four, and vessels above that tonnage shall be allowed six, working days to load and unload at the Jetties, as

the case may be; and any vessel remaining longer at any Jetty shall be charged one penny per registered ton per day.

15. All lamps must be kept properly burning from sunset till sunrise.

16. The lessee must keep on each Jetty, if required by the Harbour Master, a Notice Board, placed to the satisfaction of the Harbour Master, containing the Scale of Charges, and any other Jetty or Harbour Regulations which the Harbour Master may deem necessary.

17. The leases shall contain the foregoing conditions and other usual and necessary clauses of a lease.

The following sums were collected at Jetty-street Jetties and Stuart-street Jetty, Dunedin, during the year 1864, clear of expenses of collecting. The other Jetties have been free hitherto. There is a slight alteration in the mode in which the dues are to be levied under the lease from that which existed during 1864. The expense of collecting was £625.

And whereas in the said Schedule the North East Valley Road District therein named is described as comprising All that area bounded on the north by the watershed of the range extending from Mihiwaka to Point Heyward; on the east and south by the Harbour and the town of Port Chalmers; and on the west by Pelichet Creek; thence by the watershed of the ranges extending over Signal Hill and Mount Cargill to Mihiwaka.

And whereas it is expedient to divide and diminish the said North East Valley Road District, and to form a new Road District, to be named "The Pine Hill Road District,"

## TAKE PART OF HIS LAND.

2. To take a Crown Grant in fee simple without conditions, for two-thirds in value of the land comprised in such certificate, to be ascertained to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

## COME UNDER THIS ACT.

3. To Take a Crown Grant in fee simple, subject to the tax imposed by this Act and the provisions hereof relating thereto.

## OTHERWISE TO STAND ON THEIR RIGHTS.

IX. Any such former purchaser who shall not within six months after the coming into operation of this Act, elect to do any one of the aftermentioned things and signify the same in writing to the Waste Land Board, shall be deemed to have decided to stand upon his rights and to remain subject to his liabilities as though this Act had not been passed.

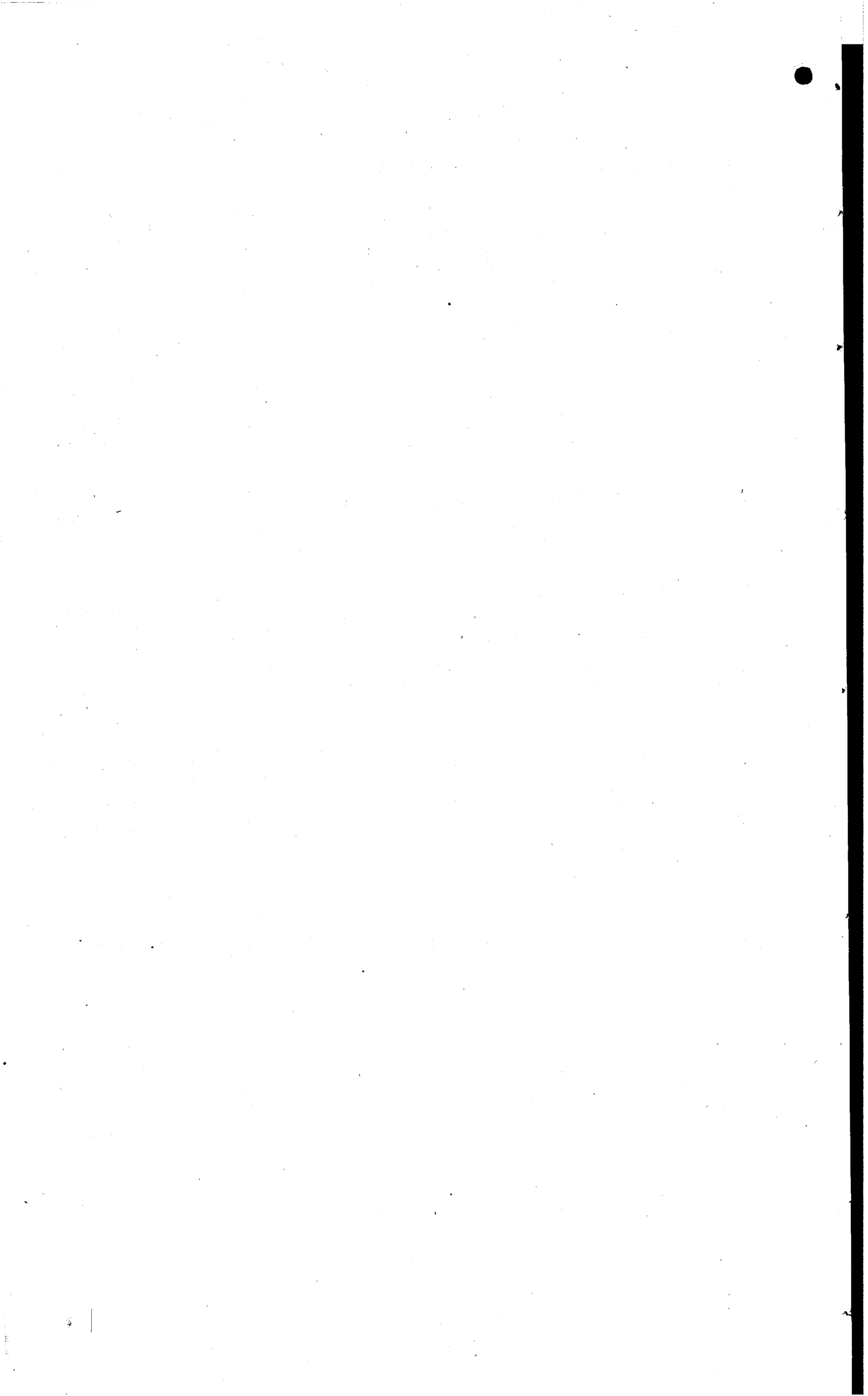

THE decision of the Supreme Court in the matter of the Attorney General *v.* Jones having been given in favor of the Crown, the attention of purchasers of land under the "Otago Land Regulations, 1856," is directed to the following clause of the "Waste Land Act, 1863," No 2:—

FORMER APPLICANTS MAY—COMPOUND—TAKE PART OF HIS LAND—OR COME UNDER THIS ACT.

VIII. Any person who at any time before the passing of this Act shall have applied for the purchase of Land, under the Land Regulations then in force,

and shall have obtained from the Waste Land Board a certificate entitling him to take possession of the Land specified in his application, but who shall not have expended on such Land Forty Shillings per acre in improvements, so as to entitle him to a Crown Grant thereof, under the said Regulations (hereinafter styled a "former purchaser,") may elect to do any one of the following things:—

#### COMPOUND.

1. To pay to the Receiver of Land Revenue, at his office, a sum of money equal to Ten shillings per acre on the quantity of Land comprised in his certificate, and be entitled forthwith to a Crown Grant, in fee simple free from conditions.

#### TAKE PART OF HIS LAND.

2. To take a Crown Grant in fee simple without conditions, for two-thirds in value of the land comprised in such certificate, to be ascertained to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

#### COME UNDER THIS ACT.

3. To Take a Crown Grant in fee simple, subject to the tax imposed by this Act and the provisions hereof relating thereto.

#### OTHERWISE TO STAND ON THEIR RIGHTS.

IX. Any such former purchaser who shall not within six months after the coming into operation of this Act, elect to do any one of the aforementioned things and signify the same in writing to the Waste Land Board, shall be deemed to have decided to stand upon his rights and to remain subject to his liabilities as though this Act had not been passed.

The attention of such purchasers is further directed to the fact that the "Waste Land Act, 1863," No. 2, came into force on the 20th September, 1864, consequently the period within which a purchaser can elect to do any of the things set forth in sub-clauses 1, 2, and 3 of section VIII, will expire on the 20th day of March next.

But if it shall appear on such first or second inspection that any one or more of such Cattle are suffering from any infectious disease, to forthwith give notice to that effect to the Master of such vessel, in pursuance of sub-section C of section 4 of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."

2. On the expiration of 24 hours after such last-mentioned notice shall have been given, to visit the said vessel, and if he shall find any Cattle alive therein, or if the said Cattle, or any of them, shall have been landed either alive or dead during the said 24 hours, to take immediate steps for the enforcement of the penalties created by section No. 12 of the aforesaid Act.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Roads Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1862," it is among other things enacted in the 12th Section thereof, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance, the said Province, except as is therein excepted, may from time to time be divided into districts; and until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there shall be twenty-five districts, which shall be named and bounded as in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed; and it is also in the said 12th Section provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts by forming and naming new districts, or by dividing any district into two or more districts.

And whereas in the said Schedule, the Silverstream Road District, therein named, is described as comprising all that area bounded on the north by the boundary of the Hundreds; on the east and south, by Wakari and Kaikorai Districts; on the south and west, by a direct continuation of the line halving Blocks IV. and IX., Taieri Districts, from the Chain Hills to Culling's Creek; thence by Culling's Creek and its western source to station L, on Boulder Hill.

things enacted in the 12th section thereof, that for the purposes of the said Ordinance the said Province, except as is therein excepted, may, from time to time, be divided into Districts; and until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there shall be twenty-five districts, which shall be named and bounded as described in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed; and it is also in the said 12th section provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time to alter, vary, diminish or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts, by forming and naming new districts, or by dividing any district into two or more districts.

**THE CAVERSHAM ROAD DISTRICT** shall comprise all that area bounded towards the north by Sections 46, 58, 59, 63, 64, 65, and 99, Block VI., and Section 4, Block VII., Town Survey District, and the Main South Road to the Cemetery Reserve; towards the west by Section 45, Block VI., Town District; towards the south by the Main South Road; towards the south-west by Section 28, Block VII., Town Survey District; and a direct line from thence to the east angle of Section 23, Ocean Beach Survey District; thence towards the north-west by Section 23, to its west angle; thence towards the south-west by the road line from

Section 77, Ocean Beach Survey District, to the Ocean; towards the south-east and south by the Ocean, towards the east by Sections 11, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1, 65, and 86, Block VII., Town Survey District, and Block VII., Peninsula Survey District. And that henceforth

#### GREEN ISLAND CEMETERY.

*Rules and Regulations, made in pursuance of Section V. of the "Cemeteries Ordinance, 1864," for the management of the Public Cemetery at Green Island.*

1. The said Managers shall divide a portion of the Cemetery into three Classes, viz. :—

2. CLASS I., being ground of which the perpetual and exclusive right may be acquired, with the privilege of enclosing the ground, and of erecting headstones or other monuments thereon. A portion of ground of this Class shall be staked off along the present fence, into Lots of 8 feet by 10, each having a frontage to the road around the Cemetery. These Lots shall be sold one Lot for £1 10s., and two Lots for £2 10s.

3. CLASS II., being ground of which the perpetual and exclusive right may be acquired; but the purchaser shall not have right to enclose the same, or to erect a monument thereon other than a flat stone laid horizontally, with inscription, or marked out by corner stones with initials or figures; provided that these horizontal or corner stones do not rise more than six inches above the surface of the adjoining ground. A portion of land of this Class shall be staked off into Lots for single graves, 8 feet by 6, having a frontage to the road, and directly opposite the Lots of the 1st Class. The price of each Lot shall be—for one Lot 15s.; two Lots, £1 5s.

4. CLASS III., being a portion of ground which has been set aside for the interment of such persons as are not purchasers of, and have not acquired, a right to private ground. On ground of this Class no monuments or memorials whatever shall be allowed, and no grave shall, under any circumstances, be opened for any new interment sooner than after the expiry of Five Years from the time of the first or last interment, as the case may be.

#### GENERAL REGULATIONS.

5. All graves to be six feet deep, but in the event of the purchasers of private ground desiring a greater depth, an extra charge of 3s. shall be made for every foot more than 6 feet deep.

6. The Managers shall provide all necessary furniture and attendance for properly conducting interments.

7. Any purchasers of private ground, in which no interment shall have taken place, may transfer his or her interest in said ground to any other person, upon payment being made to the Clerk for the time being, of a fee of 5s. for such transfer.

8. A Plan of the Cemetery shall be prepared, showing particularly the Lots so laid off, together with the numbers thereof.

9. The Clerk for the time being shall keep a Book, in which he shall enter, from time to time, the number of every Lot sold, the name of the purchaser thereof, together with the date of the sale of the same, and shall keep a Record of the Burials in the Cemetery.

10. The Clerk for the time being shall receive the purchase-money for the sale of such Lots, and shall give a receipt for the same, which receipt shall be held conclusive evidence of the purchase and selection of the Lots mentioned therein.

11. In all cases of intended interment the person having the management or control of the same shall apply to the Clerk for the time being for warrant for such interment, which warrant the said Clerk is hereby authorised to grant upon payment to him of the following fees, viz. :—

14. The Manager shall publish a statement once a year, showing the amounts received and paid by them on account of the Cemetery.

15. The said Record Book shall be open for the inspection of the public, on paying a fee of 1s. for each inspection.

## BYE-LAWS OF THE SOUTH TOKOMAIRIRO HUNDRED, 1865.

1. No diseased cattle shall be depastured on the Hundred, and any person or persons who shall turn out or depasture any diseased beast, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five Pounds.

2. Whenever it shall appear to the Wardens, or a majority of them, that any beast of a dangerous or vicious character; or when, from any other cause, they shall deem it advisable to prohibit any specified

beast from being depastured on the Hundred, it shall be lawful for them, or a majority of them, to prohibit the depasturing any such beast, and to give notice in writing of such prohibition to the owner or person in charge of such beast; and if the same shall not be removed from the unfenced pasture lands of the Hundred within twenty-four hours, or such further time as may be stated in such notice, by delivery of the same personally, or by leaving the same at the usual place of residence of such owner or person having the charge of such beast, the owner or person having the charge of such beast shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Five Pounds; or if any person as aforesaid, after having received notice as aforesaid, shall turn out or depasture on the Hundred any prohibited beast, he shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Five Pounds for every such offence; or in the event of any beast which the Wardens shall deem it advisable to prohibit from running on the Hundred being unknown to them, it shall be lawful for them to impound such beast, to be dealt with under the "Impounding Ordinance, 1862."

3. No sheep shall be depastured on the Hundred without the consent in writing of the Wardens, or a majority of them, and under such restrictions as they may deem it advisable to impose; and any person depasturing sheep on the unenclosed land within the Hundred without such consent as aforesaid, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five Pounds: Provided always that this Bye-law shall not be applicable to sheep *bona fide* travelling through the Hundred, if the same shall travel at the rate of not less than five miles per day.

4. No unbranded cattle over the age of six months shall be depastured on the Hundred, and unbranded cattle above the age of six months found on the Hundred may be impounded, and dealt with according to law.

5. The Wardens, or a majority of them, may at any time call upon the license holders, or any license holder, to take a return shewing the number, description, age, sex, colour, and brands of stock depastured on the Hundred belonging to them, him, her, or in their, his, or her custody; and any license holder neglecting or refusing to make such return within one week after being required by notice in writing to make such return, or making a false return, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five Pounds.

6. Any cattle not being the property of, or in the custody of a license holder, but depastured on the Hundred, in contravention of any Bye-laws duly passed, may be impounded, and the owner or custodian of such cattle may be proceeded against for

trespass, and shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five Pounds.

[Nothing herein contained shall prejudice the right of the Waste Land Board, or the Commissioner of Crown Lands, to proceed against such trespasser for the recovery of the penalty of Fifty Pounds imposed by the 76th clause of the Waste Land Regulations for the illegal occupation of Crown Lands.]

7. Any person who shall set fire to the herbage or grass upon the Crown Lands within the Hundred without the consent in writing of the Wardens, or a majority of them, previously obtained, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five Pounds; but such consent of the Wardens will not protect any person from the consequence of any loss or damage which may be sustained by any person by reason of the carelessness with which such burning of the Hundred may be performed.

8. Any person disturbing or harassing cattle depastured within the boundaries of the Hundred, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five Pounds; provided always that the holder of the depasturing license within the Hundred, or any person duly authorised in his behalf, may drive such cattle for the purpose of collecting such as may belong to him, and for the free and legitimate use of his right of pasturage within the Hundred; but in the event of its being necessary for such purpose to drive any cattle belonging to any other person to a greater distance than half a mile, the person so driving such cattle must take them to the nearest available stock-yard, and there separate his own from those of other persons, and return the latter to the place from which they were driven; and failing so to do will be liable to the penalty of any sum not exceeding Five Pounds for every such offence. Any person removing cattle beyond the boundary of the Hundred other than those belonging to him, or for the removal of which he shall have due authority, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five Pounds.

9. All or any of the acts authorised by these Bye-laws to be done by the Wardens, or a majority of them, may be done by any Ranger, or any person duly appointed by them, or authorised in that behalf.

10. Any person shooting cattle on the Hundred without the consent in writing previously obtained of the Wardens, or a majority of them, shall be liable to a penalty of Ten Pounds.

**REGULATIONS ACCORDING TO WHICH THE  
PRACTICE AND PROCEDURE UNDER THE  
LAND REGISTRY ACT, 1860, SHALL BE  
REGULATED AND CONDUCTED.**

**MAPS.**

1. Maps of all Crown Lands granted or disposed of, arranged in Districts of convenient size, shall be constructed and kept for the purpose of Registration in each Registration District.

2. Such Maps shall be termed Registration Maps, and the words "Registration Map" shall be written or marked upon them.

3. From time to time, as required, Supplementary Maps shall be constructed of land newly granted, and the sections or allotments newly granted shall be laid off on the original Maps, so that the Registration Maps in use may include all Crown Lands from time to time disposed of.

4. All such Maps shall be constructed under direction of the Registrar General.

5. Every Map shall be signed by the Registrar General.

6. The Maps shall be conveniently named, numbered, or otherwise distinguished, for reference, as the Registrar General shall from time to time direct.

7. The Registration Maps of each district shall be deposited with the District Registrar of such district.

8. No alteration in, or addition to, such Maps shall be made, except as authorised by the Regulations, or by authority of the Registrar General.

9. In every Registration Map the sections, sub-sections, or allotments, shall be numbered as the Registrar General shall direct.

10. Pending the construction of Registration Maps, Maps on Original Crown Grants may be referred to as and for the purposes of Registration Maps, and the same need not be signed by the Registrar General.

**SUB-DIVISIONAL MAPS.**

11. Sub-divisional Maps, connected with each Registration Map shall be kept on separate files, conveniently numbered or distinguished for reference.

12. If a proprietor shall sub-divide an allotment for sale or transfer, he may cause a sub-divisional Map thereof, shewing the proposed sub-divisions, to be made and deposited with the District Registrar.

13. He may from time to time with the consent of the District Registrar, alter any such sub-divisions, which may not have been disposed of, by causing a fresh sub-divisional Map to be made subject to like conditions.

14. Where application shall be made by a proprietor to register his title to a sub-divided part of an original allotment, the District Registrar may require a sub-divisional Map to be deposited with him.

15. In cases not otherwise provided for, where a proprietor shall transfer a sub-divided part of an original allotment, there shall be deposited with the District Registrar a sub-divisional Map, shewing the entirety of section or allotment and the sub-divided part thereof.

16. Maps or Plans attached to applications may in the discretion of the District Registrar be referred to as and for the purposes of sub-divisional Registration Maps.

17. All sub-divisional Maps shall be made and authenticated to the satisfaction of the District Registrar; and the sub-divisional sections or allotments on such sub-divisional Maps shall be numbered respectively so as to distinguish the same for purposes of Registration, and shall be referred to and indexed as original sections.

18. The Registrar General may from time to time cause the Registration Maps to be newly compiled for the purpose of embodying therein the sub-divisional allotments, distinguished by proper numbers, and such newly compiled Maps, being signed by the Registrar General, may be used as Registration Maps, in lieu of the originals. The Registrar General shall regulate the construction, arrangement, and care of the Registration Maps, as he shall think fit.

#### INDEXES.

19. It shall be the duty of the District Registrar to keep—

1. A nominal Index.
2. A local Index.

#### NOMINAL INDEX.

20. The Nominal Index shall contain the names of parties on the Register, and shall be compiled alphabetically. It may be divided into periods or other divisions as the Registrar General shall direct.

21. Against the name of each person in such Index shall be entered the number of the entry in the Register relating to such person.

#### LOCAL INDEX.

22. The Local Index shall be arranged in correspondence with the Registration Maps, and the numbers of the respective allotments shall be entered therein, and against each number shall be entered the number of every entry of proprietorship relating to such allotment.

#### GENERAL REGULATIONS AS TO INDEXES.

23. It shall be the duty of the District Registrars under direction of the Registrar General from time to time to examine the Indexes and collate the same with the Registers, and to correct errors found on such examination.

24. When an entry in a Register is cancelled, the corresponding number of such entry in the Indexes shall be cancelled likewise by the District Registrar drawing a line through the same, and initialing the cancelled number.

#### BOOKS.

25. It shall be the duty of the District Registrar to keep—

1. A Register of Proprietors of Land.
2. A Register of Charges.
3. A Register of Notices of Leases and Agreements for Leases.
4. A Register of Inhibitions.

26. He shall also keep books for noting applications of all kinds, with the exact times thereof, lists of certificates issued, particulars of Fees received,— and such other books as the Registrar General shall from time direct.

#### APPLICATION TO REGISTER TITLE.

27. Every person applying to Register a Title to Land, shall make and subscribe, in duplicate, an application in the following form:—

“I,” or “We,” (Christian Name and Surname at full length) as the case may be, “the undersigned “A.B., of” (add place of abode and description or designation.)

Or, “I, A.B., as Agent or Attorney for C.D., “of” &c., “Do apply, pursuant to the Land Registry Act, 1860, to Register the Title to the (Plans to be annexed pursuant to the Regulation) following Land, viz.

(Here add description of Land, specifying the estimated contents, the Parish, Township, County, Province, or other local division in which situate, the number of Allotment, Section, or Sub-section, whether occupied or unoccupied, and if occupied, the name of occupant.)

“Which Land is described in the annexed “plan, and is valued for the purpose of the “Assurance Fund at £ (Value to be inserted pursuant to regulations.) The above Land is “included in the Crown Grant marked or “numbered,” (here insert the proper mark or number of reference to the Crown Grant relating to the Land.)

(In the case of Land formerly on the Register, and in respect of which application is made to register the Title anew,) add—

“The above Land was heretofore registered in the “name of R.S., of as “proprietor.”

“Annexed is a list, marked A. of the Deeds and “Documents now deposited relating to the “Title, copies whereof are also deposited herewith. Annexed also is a list, marked B., of the “names and addresses of all persons entitled “to any estate or interest in the land. Official “notices referring to this application may be “left for me at” (here specify some known place of address in the same Town in which the Register Office is situate.)

(Where the applicant admits that the land “is subject to Incumbrances or Trusts, add) “The “land is subject to the following Incumbrances “or Trusts (as the case may be) the rights “in respect whereof will be reserved.” Here specify the Incumbrances or Trusts reserved.

Subjoined to this application shall be a memorandum which may be signed by parties interested, if consenting to the application, as follows:—

If the application or consent be made by Attorney, add “by E.F., of &c., Attorney for the said” (A.B. or C.D. as the case may be.)

28. Annexed to every such application and duplicate shall be an accurate plan of the Land, the Title whereof is proposed to be registered. Such Plan shall correspond with the Plan on the Registration Map. If the land be part only of an original allotment or section, the plan shall describe the entire original allotment or section corresponding with the Registration Map, and shall show accurately the measurement, extent, boundaries, and relative position of the Land proposed to be registered, and also the other sub-divisions of such original section if required by the District Registrar.

29. A List or Schedule (marked A.) of Deeds and Documents deposited, shall be annexed to the application.

30. A Schedule (marked B.,) of persons entitled to any Estate or Interest in the Land shall be annexed to the application, which schedule may be in the following form:—

“List of persons entitled to an Estate or Interest

31. The District Registrar shall, if required to sign and give an interim receipt for Documents deposited, to be exchanged for such Documents if returned.

32. The District Registrar shall transmit the copies of Deeds and Documents deposited to the Registrar-General. Such transmission may be by post.

33. Where an application to register Title shall be made, subject to specified Incumbrances or Trusts, the District Registrar may, if he shall think fit, refuse to proceed with such Registration, until proof shall be made to his satisfaction, that the parties interested in such Incumbrances and Trusts, or any of them, have been apprised of the intention to register such Title, and until such parties, or any of them, have had opportunity of being heard in opposition to such application.

34. In every case where the rights of parties are reserved the applicant shall, on behalf of the parties whose rights are to be reserved, lodge Inhibitions in respect of such rights in conformity with the Regulations applicable to Inhibitions—the effect of which Inhibitions shall be the same as if lodged by the parties themselves.

35. Within one month after the receipt of an application to register a Title to Land, the District Registrar shall cause a notice, which may be in the following form, to be inserted in some local newspaper circulated in the District, and shall continue such advertisement three times consecutively in such newspaper.

*Notice under Land Registry Act, 1860.*

A.B., of (add place of abode and description) having applied to Register his Title as Proprietor to the Land hereinafter described, viz. :—(here add a short description sufficiently identifying the Land.) All persons having interest in such Land, capable of being affected by such Registration, are required to lodge their claims, and the evidence in support thereof, with the

36. The examination and hearing of the application shall be proceeded with, at the time and place specified in such notice.

37. Such examination and hearing may be continued by adjournment, whereof notice shall be posted in some conspicuous place in the District Registrar's Office.

38. Parties objecting to the application, or claiming interests in the Land proposed to be registered, may appear and be heard in person or by their counsel or by Attornies before the District Registrar.

39. All applications (with their respective Plans and Schedules) shall be numbered consecutively, and shall, as nearly as may be, be heard in the order in which they shall be received.

40. The documents relating to the respective applications shall be kept by themselves, numbered with numbers corresponding to the number of the application.

41. In the case of every application to register Title for the first time, no person shall be registered as Proprietor, without the approval of the Registrar-General, or of such other Barrister or Solicitor as may from time to time be designated by him in that behalf with the approval of the Governor.

**REGISTER OF PROPRIETORS OF LAND.**

42. The Form of Register of a Proprietor of Land shall be as follows, subject to be, from time to time, varied by authority of the Registrar-General:—

43. Every person applying to register a charge shall fill up and subscribe the following Form, which may be altered from time to time by the Registrar General.

Annexed to such application shall be a plan of the Land charged, agreeing with the Registration Map and with these Regulations, or otherwise sufficiently identifying the same.

44. Upon receipt of every such charge the District Registrar shall, if required, sign and deliver to the Depositors a receipt; upon the receipt of such charge notice thereof shall be given by the District Registrar to the Proprietor of the Land charged.

45. Judgments, Crown Debts, Extents and Acceptances of Office, affecting the Lands of a Registered Proprietor, are deemed charges by a Registered Proprietor, and official Certificates of such Judgments, Crown Debts, Extents and Acceptances of Office, signed by the proper officers respectively, shall be received and registered as Instruments of charge; but, in such cases it shall not be incumbent on the District Registrar to require a plan of the land charged, provided the same be sufficiently distinguished by reference to entries already on the Registers.

46. As regards charges created by Wills of Registered Proprietors, such Wills or Probates, Administrations, with Will annexed, exemplifications and office copies of Wills may be received as Instruments of charge.

47. The District Registrar may require proof to his satisfaction of the validity of any charge, and, unless satisfied thereof, he may refuse to register the same absolutely, or may suspend such registration, in which case he shall register the same provisionally, subject to further consideration, or subject to any order which the Supreme Court may make relative thereto. Every entry of a Provisional Registration shall be headed "Provisionally Registered." Notice shall be given to the party tendering such charge that the same is only Provisionally Registered, in order that he or she may apply, if thought fit, to the Supreme Court for an order to make the registration absolute. If no such order shall be intimated to the District Registrar within the space of three months after the first presentation of the charge for registration, the District Registrar may thereupon, in his discretion, cancel the register by writing across the entry in the register the word "Cancelled," with his name and the date. He shall notify such fact to the Applicant, and shall, on demand, return to him the Deed of charge.

48. Subjoined or attached to every certificate of charge shall be a Memorandum of the Inhibitions affecting such charge, referring to their respective registered numbers.

49. Whenever a charge is registered, the register number of such charge shall be entered in the Memorandum at the foot of the register of the Proprietor's Title. Whenever an Inhibition is registered against a charge, the register number of the Inhibition shall be

entered on the Memorandum at the foot of the register of such charge, and when cancelled an entry shall be made of such cancellation.

50. Upon sale or foreclosure under any order or decree of the Supreme Court of land subject to a registered charge, the District Registrar shall make the requisite entries and transfers for giving effect to such order or decree.

51. Upon a sale of land under a power of sale, contained or implied in the instrument of charge, the District Registrar shall, after due proof made to his satisfaction of compliance with the prescribed conditions, make the requisite entries and transfers in the register for giving effect to such sale.

52. Upon the discharge of any charge the District Registrar shall write across the registered instrument a minute indicating such discharge, whereupon such registry shall be deemed to be cancelled and discharged.

53. No transfer of proprietorship of land or charge shall be registered without delivery up of the existing certificate, except in case of sale or transfer under order or decree of the Supreme Court.

## GENERAL REGULATIONS RELATING TO TRANSFERS OF LAND AND CHARGES.

54. When any land or charge is transferred entire, the District Registrar shall write or cause to be written across the Register a minute indicating such transfer, and shall sign the same.

55. Where land is subdivided a new entry shall be made in the Register of Proprietors, in respect of each subdivisional part, including the part, if any, retained by the original proprietor, and minutes shall be written across the register indicating such subdivisional transfers.

56. A proprietor intending to subdivide his land by consecutive transactions may deposit with the District Registrar his land certificate pending such transactions, and may, by writing, request that such land certificate may be retained pending such transactions, and the same shall be retained accordingly. In every such case, as each subdivision takes place, the District Registrar shall indicate such subdivision upon the Register of Proprietors by proper references. The original Proprietor may at any time require the District Registrar to issue a certificate of his title to the land remaining undisposed of, and thereupon the District Registrar may make the necessary entry on the register and issue a certificate accordingly.

57. If land be transferred or devised to more persons than one as tenants in common or in coparcenery, each tenant in common or coparcener, as the case may be, shall be registered as proprietor in respect of his or her undivided share, and all the regulations applicable to the registration of the title to land shall be applicable to the registration of Title to undivided shares of land.

58. Charges can only be transferred in their entirety.

59. Deeds of transfer shall be numbered and indexed according to Regulations made from time to time by the Registrar-General.

## TRANSMISSION.

60. Before registering a title on the death of a deceased proprietor the District Registrar shall fix a time for hearing objections thereto, and he shall notify the same by advertisement, and shall hear such objections and otherwise proceed in reference thereto in such manner as in the case of an original application to register Title *mutatis mutandis*.

61. Upon any application made to register Title, upon the death of a sole registered proprietor, or of the survivor of several joint registered proprietors, it shall be the duty of the District Registrar to satisfy himself, whether the deceased held the land in his own right or as a trustee, whether he died testate or intestate. If testate he is to satisfy himself as to the

validity of the will or codicil of the deceased, whether the land was devised by such Will or Codicil absolutely or subject to particular uses, estates, trusts or interests, or to charges or special limitations or conditions, and who are the devisees or other persons interested under such will. If the deceased died intestate he is to satisfy himself who is heir-at-law. Where any persons appearing to be interested in the land shall be infants, he shall satisfy himself who is the guardian or person entitled to be the guardian of such infants; in the case of married women who are their husbands; in the case of lunatics, who are their committees, if any. And of all other matters in any way material, in his judgment, for determining who is the fit person to be registered in the place of the deceased proprietor. All which matters and things he shall fully report to the Registrar-General.

62. Before assuming the intestacy of a deceased proprietor the District Registrar shall require the production of Letters of Administration to the deceased, if granted; if none have been granted, then an affidavit to that effect. He shall also require the affidavit of the party applying to the effect that he or she has made, or caused search to be made, for any Will or Codicil of the deceased amongst the papers of the deceased, at his bankers, if any, at his agents or solicitors, if any, and in all other places where it is likely that a Will or Codicil may have been deposited; and further that no Will or Codicil has been found, nor has any circumstance come to the knowledge of the deponent from which to infer that any Will or Codicil is or has been in existence (or if there has been any Will or Codicil in existence), then that the same has been destroyed (setting out the facts relating to such destruction), and generally the party applying shall make affidavit that he or she verily believes that there is no Will or Codicil of the deceased in existence. The District Registrar shall also require any corroborative proof of intestacy as to him may seem fit.

63. Where a Will or a Codicil shall have been proved in some competent Court, the probate exemplification or office copy of such Will or Codicil may be admitted as evidence of such Will or Codicil for purposes of Registration, with such corroborative proof, if any, as the District Registrar shall require.

64. Where an original Will or Codicil shall be produced for the purpose of Registration, the District Registrar shall require proof thereof by at least one of the witnesses, if resident within the district, or such other proof as would be required of Wills or Codicils in Courts of Equity.

65. Provided that as regards Wills and Codicils executed out of the Province, or in case of the absence of witnesses, the District Registrar may dispense with proof by witnesses of such Will or Codicil, on receiving evidence to his satisfaction, as to the custody from which such Will or Codicil came, and such other evidence as may satisfy him of the genuineness and validity of such Will or Codicil.

66. If by the Will or Codicil of the deceased Proprietor the Land be devised to any person or persons absolutely, such person or persons shall be registered as Proprietor or Proprietors in place of the deceased Proprietor.

67. If such devise shall be subject to charges, which, in the judgment of the District Registrar, should be protected by Inhibition, the Title shall be registered subject to such Inhibition, which the District Registrar shall lodge accordingly.

68. If the Devise be to Trustees, such Trustees shall be registered as Proprietors, subject to Inhibition for protecting the rights of all parties interested under the Will or Codicil, which Inhibition the District Registrar shall lodge accordingly.

69. If the Devise be for particular Estates, or subject to limitations, powers or conditions, the Title shall be registered in the name of the devisee for the first estate of freehold, if he shall appear to the District Registrar a fit person to protect the rights of parties interested under the Will or Codicil, and if not then in the name of such other person as shall appear in the judgment of the District Registrar to be the fit person; subject to Inhibition for protecting the rights of all parties interested under the Will or Codicil, which Inhibition the District Registrar shall lodge accordingly.

70. The District Registrar shall not make any entry in the case of transfer of Title on the death of a deceased Proprietor, until he shall have first transmitted full particulars of the whole case to the Registrar General, who may direct the District Registrar what entries to make, and the District Registrar shall in all things conform to such directions of the Registrar General.

71. When an infant shall be entitled to be registered as Proprietor in the last mentioned cases, the guardian, or person entitled to be guardian, of such infant may be registered in his or her place, subject to an Inhibition for protecting the rights of such infant, which Inhibition the District Registrar shall lodge accordingly.

72. When a married woman shall be entitled to be registered as proprietor, in the last mentioned cases, the husband of such married woman may be joined on the Register with his wife as co-proprietor, in right of his wife; subject to the conditions and regulations applicable to the Registration of a husband in right of his wife.

73. Where the person entitled to be registered as Proprietor, shall appear to the District Registrar to be an idiot or lunatic, the District Registrar may register the Committee of such idiot or lunatic, as Proprietor in his or her place, subject to Inhibition for protecting the rights of such idiot or lunatic, which Inhibition the District Registrar shall lodge accordingly.

74. Where, upon the application of any person to register the Title to land of a deceased Proprietor, it shall appear to the satisfaction of the District Registrar, that the deceased Proprietor died intestate, the District Registrar shall cause an advertisement to be inserted in some newspaper circulating in the Province, calling on persons to come in and establish their claims as Heir or Heirs-at-law of the deceased, and he shall, in such advertisement, specify a day and time and place for hearing and determining such claims, at which time and place he shall examine such claims, and shall hear any parties then present, tendering evidence or information in reference thereto or to the heirship of the deceased; and he may from time to time adjourn such hearing, and he shall ascertain to his satisfaction, the heirship to the deceased; and shall compile or cause to be compiled a proper pedigree to the deceased, shewing such heirship, and the degree of consanguinity to the deceased; and shall transmit the same with the verifications thereof to the Registrar General.

75. Upon examining a married woman as to her assent to any disposition of Land whereof she and her husband are registered as co-proprietors, it shall be the duty of the District Registrar to explain to her her rights in the land, and the effect of the proposed disposition; and he shall enquire whether she intends to give up her interest in the Estate to be passed; and he shall make a record of her answer thereto; and where any such married woman, in answer to such enquiry shall declare that she intends to give up her interest without any provision, the District Registrar shall satisfy himself of the truth of such declaration;

and where any provision has been agreed to be made, the District Registrar shall satisfy himself that the same has been made; and he shall record the particulars thereof; and he shall not proceed with the proposed registration until he shall be satisfied as to the foregoing particulars.

#### LEASES.

76. No notice of a Lease or Agreement for a Lease shall be registered unless such Lease or Agreement be made by the registered Proprietor of the Land to which it relates, or his duly authorised Attorney, except in the case of Leases made by a deceased Proprietor, which may be registered as against the person succeeding on the Register to the title of the deceased Proprietor.

77. No Lease or Agreement for Lease shall be registered without a plan of the Land included therein, either contained in the instrument itself or annexed thereto, or without a reference to the register of Proprietorship, with a declaration by the party applying to the following effect:—

“I, A. B., of \_\_\_\_\_, declare that the annexed  
“Lease (or Agreement for Lease) relates to the  
“Land described in the annexed plan; and I  
“apply to register notice thereof in respect of  
“such Land.

“Dated \_\_\_\_\_ A. B., of \_\_\_\_\_”

If by Attorney, then add the words “by C. D.,  
of \_\_\_\_\_, his Attorney.”

Such plan shall be conformable to the Regulations, and shall precisely identify the Land included in the Lease or Agreement for Lease with the proprietary title thereto.

#### TITLES DERIVED THROUGH UNREGISTERED INSTRUMENTS.

78. Persons seeking to register Titles, whether to Land or Charges derived through unregistered instruments may do so, subject to the like regulations as in the case of an original application.

79. Persons seeking to register charges on Land to which title shall be derived through unregistered instruments may do so, on proof of title to the satisfaction of the District Registrar, subject to such regulations as the Registrar General shall from time to time prescribe.

#### INHIBITIONS.

80. Any Inhibition authorised by the Land Registry Act may be lodged either by delivery at the Registry Office or by sending the same by post in the usual way, addressed to the District Registrar, together with a statement shewing the nature of the interest sought to be protected by such Inhibition. Such interest shall be defined in such statement, as nearly as may be, in a simple and compendious form, and the Land affected thereby shall be accurately defined.

81. Sequestrations under the “Debtors and Creditors Act, 1862,” may be registered as Inhibitions.

82. On the District Registrar being satisfied that the Regulations have been complied with, the Inhibition shall be forthwith registered in the Register of Inhibitions, each Inhibition being entered separately in consecutive order.

83. Notice of such Inhibition shall be given forthwith to the registered Proprietor of the Land or Charge to which the Inhibition relates or to his Agent, in such manner as the Registrar General shall from time to time direct.

84. In all cases of proposed transfer by the registered Proprietor of any Land or Charge subject to Inhibition, notice of such proposed transfer shall be

given to the Inhibitors. Such notice shall be given by the District Registrar in such form and manner as the Registrar General shall from time to time direct, and Inhibitors shall be entitled to be heard by the District Registrar in objection to any proposed transfer.

85. Charges, notices of Lease, and Inhibitions shall be cancelled by the District Registrar writing across the respective instruments a minute indicating such cancellation, with his signature, and the necessary entries shall at the same time be made in the Registers.

86. Every application to register a Charge, notice of Lease or Inhibition, with the instruments attached, shall be filed as soon as deposited, and shall be marked forthwith with a number indicating the order of deposit, and which shall be the Register number.

87. The mode of registering instruments under the said Act shall be by the District Registrar writing, or causing to be written, or stamped across the application or instrument or both, a word or minute indicating the fact of Registration and the Register number, and by his signing such word or minute and causing his seal of office to be affixed or impressed on the registered application or instrument. And all Applications and Instruments so signed and sealed shall be deemed to be duly registered and shall have priority according to the order of their respective register numbers.

#### INSPECTION OF REGISTER.

88. Before inspecting any register or document in the custody of the District Registrar, the person applying for inspection shall subscribe the following declaration:—

“I, A. B., of \_\_\_\_\_ do declare that I am the Proprietor of (or as the case may be, authorised by the Proprietor of \_\_\_\_\_ or by C. ### ASSURANCE FUND.

90. The value of land for the purpose of the Land Assurance Fund shall be estimated according to the value declared by the Applicant. If the District Registrar shall be dissatisfied with such declared value he may surcharge the applicant at such value as they may think fit. If the applicant shall be dissatisfied with such surcharge and the applicant and the District Registrar shall be unable to agree on the value, the Applicant may demand a valuation, and the value shall in that case be determined by some competent surveyor, to be nominated by the District Registrar. If such valuation shall amount to or exceed the amount surcharged, the cost of the valuation shall be borne by the Applicant, otherwise by the Government.

91. No Certificate of land shall be issued without pre-payment of the Assurance Fund Assessment.

### NOTICES.

92. Every person making an application to Register, lodging an Inhibition or taking any other proceeding under the Land Registry Act shall, at the same time, specify in writing, some known place of address situate in the same town as the Register Office, at which place notices may be left. The leaving of notices at such places shall be deemed good service thereof under the Act and under these Regulations.

93. The same persons may, by writing left with the District Registrar, from time to time change such place of notices.

94. These Regulations may from time to time be altered and rescinded by the Governor in Council, and the Registrar General may rescind, alter, and vary the same so far as may be consistent with the powers vested in him in that behalf.

### POSTAL.

*Patterns of Merchandise may be sent by Post at the Book Postage Rate.*

General Post Office,

Wellington, 25th April, 1865.

IT is hereby notified for public information, that on and after the first day of May next, a system of Pattern Post will be established between places within

the Colony of New Zealand, and also between the Colony and the United Kingdom, and the Colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, whereby patterns of merchandise of no intrinsic value may be sent by post under the same regulations and at the same rates of postage as those of the Book Post.

- (1.) No packet of patterns must exceed 24 ounces.
- (2.) The patterns must not be of intrinsic value. This rule excludes all articles of a saleable nature, and, indeed, whatever may have a value of its own apart from a mere use as a pattern; and the quantity of any material sent ostensibly as a pattern must not be so great that it can be fairly considered as having on this ground an intrinsic value.
- (3.) There must be no writing or printing other than the address of the person for whom the packet is intended, the address of the sender, a trade mark and numbers, and the prices of the articles.
- (4.) The patterns must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination.
- (5.) In all other respects the regulations of the Book Post will apply to the Pattern Post.
- (6.) Any packets not in accordance with the above regulations will be treated as letters.
