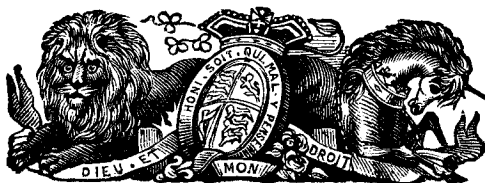

## ADDRESS

OF HIS HONOR THE SUPERINTENDENT ON PROROGUING  
THE TWENTY-FIRST SESSION OF THE PROVINCIAL  
COUNCIL OF THE PROVINCE OF OTAGO, FRIDAY,  
FIFTH JANUARY, 1866.

*Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the Provincial Council.*—At the close of a lengthened Session, I have to congratulate you on the results of your labors, and to thank you for the consideration you have given to the various matters brought under your notice.

The resolutions passed by you embrace subjects of considerable importance to the Province, and will receive the most careful attention during the recess.

I have to thank you for the liberal supplies you have voted for the public service, which will be administered with a due regard to the wishes of the Council.
