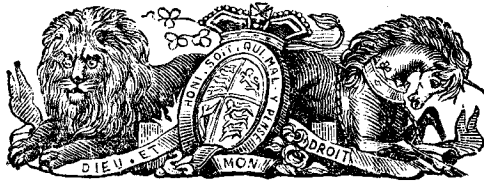

PROCLAMATION

Of Licensing Districts under the Licensing Ordinance, 1865.

WHEREAS by the eleventh section of the "Licensing Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that the Superintendent of Otago, as soon after the coming into operation of the said Ordinance as conveniently may be, shall for the purposes of this Ordinance, divide the settled portions of the said Province into such and so many districts as he may think fit to be called Licensing Districts, and when and so soon as such divisions shall have been made, the Superintendent shall, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, declare such districts, and by such proclamation define the boundaries thereof;

Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby Proclaim and Declare that from and after the day of the date hereof, and until further notice, there shall be within the Province of Otago, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, Eleven Licensing Districts, to be called respectively as follows:

1. Clyde Licensing District
2. Queenstown Licensing District
3. Oamaru Licensing District
4. Waikouaiti Licensing District
5. Dunedin Licensing District
6. Port Chalmers Licensing District
7. Taieri Licensing District
8. Tokomairiro Licensing District
9. Clutha Licensing District
10. Hamilton Licensing District
11. Lawrence Licensing District.

And I do hereby Proclaim and Declare that the said several districts shall be respectively bounded and defined in manner following, that is to say—

1. **CLYDE LICENSING DISTRICT** shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise the towns of Alexandria, Clyde, Cromwell, Gladstone, Newcastle, Pembroke, and Wakefield, together with all that area bounded towards the north by the Province of Canterbury; towards the east by the Province of Canterbury and the Otamakau Creek to the Hawkdun Mountains; towards the south by the Dunstan Gold

Field; and towards the west by a direct line from Parkburn at its source to the Wanaka Lake, and by the Wanaka Lake to the Province of Canterbury, also that area within the Dunstan Gold Field which has been or may be withdrawn from the operation of the Gold Fields Act.

2. **QUEENSTOWN LICENSING DISTRICT** shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise the towns of Queenstown, Kingston, and Frankton, together with all that area bounded towards the north by the Province of Canterbury; towards the east by the Clyde Licensing District; towards the south by the Dunstan Gold Field; and towards the west by the Wakatipu Gold Field, also all that area within the Wakatipu Gold Field, which has been or may be withdrawn from the operations of the Gold Fields Act.

3. **OAMARU LICENSING DISTRICT** shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded on the north by the Clyde Licensing District; on the east by the Province of Canterbury; on the south by the Ocean; and on the west by the Horse Range and Kakanui Mountains and the Mount Ida and Dunstan Gold Fields.

4. **WAIKOUAITI LICENSING DISTRICT** shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded on the north by the Oamaru Licensing District; on the east by the Ocean; on the south by a line running due west from Brinn's Point to the Taieri Gold Field; and on the west by the Taieri and Mount Ida Gold Fields.

5. **DUNEDIN LICENSING DISTRICT** shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by Waikouaiti and Port Chalmers Licensing Districts; towards the east by the Port Chalmers Licensing District and the Ocean; towards the south by the Ocean; and towards the west by the Taieri River and the Taieri Gold Field.

6. **PORT CHALMERS LICENSING DISTRICT** shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area including the Town of Port Chalmers, the Lower Harbor West Survey District, the Sawyer's Bay Survey District, Sections numbered 88 to 115 inclusive, North-East Valley Survey District, and Blocks 4, 5, 6, and part of 7, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District: bounded from the north-west corner of Block 4, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District; in a southerly direction by the

western boundary line of the said Block 4, to the northern boundary line of Block 6, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District, thence by the said northern boundary line of the said Block 6, and the northern boundary line of Block 7, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District, to the Main North Road, thence by the Main North Road to the northern boundary line of the North-East Valley Survey District thence in a westerly direction by the said northern boundary line of the North-East Valley District to a road line between Sections 87 and 89 of the said District, thence by the said road line continued between Sections 86 and 88, North-East Valley District to the northern boundary line of Block 9, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District; thence in an easterly direction by the said northern boundary line of the said Block 9, to the north-west corner of Section 33, Sawyer's Bay Survey District; thence in a south-easterly direction by the boundary line of the said Sawyer's Bay Survey District to Otago Harbor, and thence by high-water mark to the starting point.

7. TAIERI LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by the Tuapeka and Taieri Gold Fields; towards the east and south by the Dunedin Licensing District; and towards the west by the Taieri River, the Waihola Lake, and Megget Burn; also, all that area within the Taieri Gold Field, and south of the Rock and Pillar Mountain, which may be withdrawn from the operation of the Gold Fields Act.

8. TOKOMAIRO LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by the Tuapeka Gold Field; towards the east by the Taieri and Dunedin Licensing Districts; towards the south by the Ocean; and towards the west by the Clutha District.

9. CLUTHA LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by the Nokomai and Mount Benger Gold Fields; towards the east by the Mount Benger and Tuapeka Gold Fields to Lovell's Creek, thence by Lovell's Creek, the Tuakitoto Lake, Kaitangata Lake and Creek, and the Clutha River, to the Ocean; towards the south by the Ocean; and towards the west by the Province of Southland.

10. HAMILTON LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise the town of Hamilton and all that area within the Mount Ida and Taieri Gold Fields north of the Rock and Pillar Mountain, which may be withdrawn from the operation of the Gold Fields Act.

11. LAWRENCE LICENSING DISTRICT shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise the town of Lawrence and all that area within the Tuapeka and Waitahuna Gold Fields, which has been or may be withdrawn from the operation of the Gold Fields Act.

PROCLAMATION,

Fixing and appointing the Resident Magistrates' Courts at Dunedin, Clyde, Lawrence, Oamaru, and Queenstown, as the places for holding Quarterly Licensing Meetings in the Licensing Districts of Dunedin, Clyde, Lawrence, Oamaru, and Queenstown respectively.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by Section XII of the "Licensing Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted (amongst other things) that if at any time there shall be more than

one Resident Magistrate's Court usually holden within any Licensing District, the Superintendent shall, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, fix and appoint at which of the Courts within the Licensing District the Quarterly Licensing Meetings thereafter mentioned should be held;

Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby fix and appoint the Resident Magistrate's Court adjoining the Supreme Court House at Dunedin as the court at which the quarterly licensing meetings for the Dunedin Licensing District shall be held; and the Resident Magistrate's Court at Clyde as the court at which the quarterly licensing meetings for the Clyde Licensing District shall be held; and the Resident Magistrate's Court at Lawrence as the court at which the quarterly licensing meetings for the Lawrence Licensing District shall be held; and the Resident Magistrate's Court at Oamaru as the court at which the quarterly licensing meetings for the Oamaru Licensing District shall be held; and the Resident Magistrate's Court at Queenstown as the court at which the quarterly licensing meetings for the Queenstown Licensing District shall be held.

PROCLAMATION

Rescinding the 4th and 7th of the Clauses, Provisoes, and Conditions heretofore applicable to Agricultural Leases on the Gold Fields, and proclaiming others in lieu thereof.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS John Hyde Harris, the then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, did, by Proclamation in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Otago, on the tenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in him vested in that behalf, proclaim and declare the Clauses, Provisoes, and Conditions in the said Proclamation contained, as applicable to any Agricultural Leases thereafter granted by him under the several provisions of the "Gold Fields Act, 1862," relating thereto: And whereas it is expedient that the fourth and seventh of the said Clauses, Provisoes, and Conditions so proclaimed and declared as aforesaid should be rescinded, and that others should be made in lieu thereof:—

Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, do hereby rescind the fourth and seventh of the said Clauses, Provisoes, and Conditions accordingly, and do order that the same shall stand rescinded from the day of the date hereof; and in lieu of the said fourth Clause, Proviso, or Condition, I do proclaim and declare the following (that is to say)—

4th. The annual rent charged on every Agricultural Lease shall be at the rate of two shillings and sixpence per acre, payable yearly in advance from the date of application, and any fractional part of an acre will be considered as an acre and charged accordingly.

And in lieu of the said seventh Clause, Proviso, or Condition, I do proclaim and declare the following (that is to say)—

7th. The fees charged for Surveys will be as follows:—
For any ordinary Survey, where the area does

not exceed twenty acres, one pound.
 For any larger area at the rate of one shilling per acre or any portion of an acre.
 And thirty shillings per diem extra when the time occupied in such Survey extends beyond one day.
 One shilling per acre to be charged for Survey, and one pound to be the minimum fee in any case.

Reserving for purposes of Sale, and exempting from Mining Operations the Town of Naseby, in the Province of Otago.

described and included within the said Town of Naseby to be exempt from occupation under any Miner's Right or Business License.

ORDER

Revoking certain Rules and Regulations of the Otago Gold Fields, and making others in lieu thereof.

WHEREAS John Hyde Harris, the then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, did, on the twenty-first day of October last, under and by virtue of the powers delegated to him by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act, 1862," make certain Rules and Regulations relating to Licenses for the sale of Spirituous and Fermented Liquors on the Otago Gold Fields: And whereas by Order in Council, made on the seventh day of March last, the said Superintendent, by virtue and in exercise of the powers then vested in him, did thereby revoke and cancel Clause 3, Section X of the said Rules and Regulations, and did order that the same should stand revoked and cancelled from the day of the date thereof; and in lieu of the said Clause 3, Section X, made the Rule therein following: And whereas it is expedient that Clauses 2 and 3, Section X of the said Rules and Regulations relating to Licenses for the sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors should be revoked and cancelled, and that other provisions in lieu of the said Clauses should be made;—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor as aforesaid, do hereby revoke and cancel the said Clauses 2 and 3, Section X of the said Rules and Regulations; and do order that the same shall stand revoked and cancelled from the day of the date hereof; and in lieu of the said Clauses hereby revoked and cancelled as aforesaid, I do make the Rules following:—

2.—Liquor Licenses.

Every holder of a License for the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors upon any Gold Field shall pay for the same the annual fees hereinafter specified, in respect of a License of the description of which he shall be the holder (that is to say)—

The holder of a General License, Twenty Pounds.

The holder of a Wholesale License, Ten Pounds.

The holder of a Bottle License, Ten Pounds.

The holder of a Night License, Five Pounds.

The holder of a Temporary License, One Pound.

The holder of a Brewer's License, Five Pounds.

Provided that all Licenses, except "Temporary Licenses," whensoever issued, shall have effect until the first day of January then next following, and no longer, and the fees payable for such Licenses shall be as follows:—

For all Licenses, the applications for which shall be made between the first day of January and the last day of March in any year, the full amount of the before-mentioned License Fees respectively.

For all Licenses, the applications for which shall be made between the last day of March and the first day of July in any year, three-fourths of the before-mentioned License Fees respectively.

For all Licenses, the applications for which shall be made between the last day of June and

the first day of October in any year, one-half of the before-mentioned Fees respectively

For all Licenses, the applications for which shall be made between the last day of September and the second Tuesday in December in any year, one-fourth part of the before-mentioned License Fees respectively.

3.—Transfers.

For the Transfer of any of the aforesaid Liquor Licenses from the holder thereof to another person, the fee of one pound shall be paid; and for the Transfer of any such License to other premises, the fee of two pounds shall be paid.

3A.—Billiard and Bagatelle Licenses.

Every person having a Billiard or Bagatelle Table in any Hotel or other Place of Public Entertainment, whether licensed or not, shall pay for a "Billiard License" an annual fee of five pounds, and for a "Bagatelle License" an annual fee of ten shillings.

DELEGATION under the "Gold Fields Acts Amendment Act, 1865," to the Superintendent of Otago, published for general information.

Delegation of the Governor's powers under the "Gold Fields Acts Amendment Act, 1865," to the Superintendent of Otago.

Whereas by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, entitled the "Gold Fields Acts Amendment Act, 1865," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the Act now in recital, or by the "Gold Fields Act, 1862," or by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1863," except the powers conferred by Sections nineteen, thirty-one, thirty-three and sixty-one, of the said "Gold Fields Act, 1862," and Sections nineteen and twenty-nine of the Act now in recital, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers; provided always that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to revoke and annul any Proclamation or Regulation made by the Superintendent of any Province, in exercise of any power delegated to him by the Governor, under the provisions of the Act now in recital, and from and after the publication of such Proclamation by the Governor, any such Proclamation or Regulation made by such Superintendent shall become absolutely void and of no effect:—Now therefore I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto Thomas Dick, Esquire, as Superintendent of the Province of Otago, all the powers vested in me, under or by virtue of the said "Gold Fields Acts Amendment Act, 1865," the said "Gold Fields Act, 1862," and the said "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1863," except the powers conferred by sections nineteen, thirty-one, thirty-three and sixty-one, of the said "Gold Fields Act, 1862," and Sections nineteen and twenty-nine of the said "Gold Fields Acts Amendment Act, 1865," to have,

hold, and exercise, within the Province of Otago, the said powers hereby given to the said Thomas Dick, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer; provided always that copies of all Rules and Regulations made under the delegation aforesaid shall be forthwith transmitted to the Colonial Secretary, in order that the same may be laid before the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the sixty-third clause of the "Gold Fields Act, 1862."

And that from the day of the date hereof all Rules and Regulations previously made for the management of the said Jetties and Wharves shall cease and determine: Provided that so far as regards the Lessees of the Dues of the said Jetties and Wharves, and the duties and obligations of such Lessees, nothing herein contained shall in any way affect the Rules, Regulations, and Conditions made on the twenty-eighth day of March last.

SCHEDULE.—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

I. The Landing Steps at all Jetties shall be open to the Public, and no charge shall be made for Watermen's Boats plying to and from said Landing Places.

II. The Jetty Dues shall be at the following rates, viz. :—

IMPORTS.—Flour, salt, potatoes, grain, hay, coal, bricks, lime, wooden posts and rails, and sawn timber, 8d. per ton of 20 cwt.; stone, 8d. per ton measurement; firewood, 1s. 3d. per cord; horses, 1s. 3d. each; cattle, 1s. each; sheep, 2d. each; pigs, 3d. each; all other goods at the rate of 1s. 4d. per ton of 20 cwt. or 40 cubic feet. When goods are chargeable by the cwt. or cubic feet the Lessee shall have the option of charging them either way.

EXPORTS.—Wool, 6d. per bale; all other goods, &c., free.

III. The Jetty Dues must be paid by the master or owner of the vessel bringing or taking away goods, &c., before the same are landed or shipped, as the case may be.

IV. The Shed on the new Jetty, Jetty Street, Dunedin, will be at all times available for Passengers and Immigrants' Luggage. The charge for receiving, including delivery, of luggage and goods will be at the rate of not more than 2s. per ton; and for storage at the rate of not more than 2s. per ton, per week.

No charge for storage will be made for Immigrants' Luggage for the first 48 hours.

V. Water not to exceed the rate of 2s. 6d. per ton; but his Honor the Superintendent will not be in any way responsible for the continuance of the water supply.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," it is amongst other things enacted that if any goods enumerated or described in the Table of Prohibitions, contained in the 32nd section of the said Act, shall be imported or brought into New Zealand, then and in every such case, such goods shall be forfeited, and shall be destroyed or disposed of as the Commissioner of Customs may direct.

And whereas in the said Table of Prohibitions of Goods absolutely prohibited to be imported, are included infected cattle, sheep, or other animals, and hides, skins, horns, hoofs, or any other part of cattle or other animals, which the Governor in Council may prohibit in order to prevent any infectious or contagious distemper or disease;—Now therefore his Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in pursuance of the hereinbefore recited provisions of the said Act, by this present Order, absolutely prohibit the importation from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or from any part of the Continent of Europe into New Zealand, of any cattle, sheep, goats, horses, pigs, or poultry, and of hides, skins, horns, hoofs, and all other parts of such animals, in order to prevent the infectious or contagious distemper or disease now prevalent in the said United Kingdom, and in divers parts of the Continent of Europe, among animals of the several kinds aforesaid, from spreading in New Zealand.
