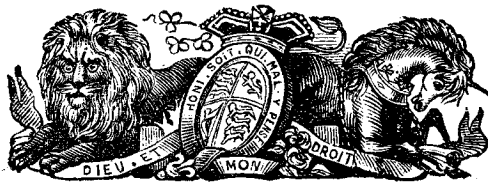

PROCLAMATION

*Of the Municipality of Oamaru.*

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, made and passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Ordinance to Amend the Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice of his Executive Council, and he was thereby authorised and required, on the petition of not less than fifty persons, comprising a majority of the householders resident in any Township within the Province, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, to extend the provisions of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," to such Township, by such name or incorporation as he should deem fit, with such modification as to the names and number of the members of such proposed Corporation, and the Office-bearers thereof, and any other municipal matters and regulations as should seem to such Superintendent and his Executive Council suitable for the area and population of such Municipality; and, in accordance with such petition or otherwise, should define the boundaries of the Municipality so created, and declare the number of Wards into which such Municipality might be divided, and define the boundaries of such Wards respectively, and declare which of the provisions of the said Ordinance should be applicable to and within the limits of such Municipality: And whereas a Petition of one hundred and twenty-five persons, comprising a majority of the householders resident in the Township of Oamaru, in the said Province of Otago, has been presented to me, Thomas Dick, as Superintendent of the said Province, praying that the provisions of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," may be extended to the said Township,—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice

of my Executive Council, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare, that from and after the day of the date hereof, the provisions of the said "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," specified in the first Schedule hereto, shall extend to the said Township of Oamaru, by and under the name of the Corporation of the Town of Oamaru, and shall be applicable to and within the Municipality hereby created. And I do, with the like advice of my said Executive Council, proclaim and declare that such of the said provisions as are contained in the sections of the said last-mentioned Ordinance, specified in the first column of the second Schedule hereto, shall extend to the said Township, and be applicable to the Municipality hereby created, with and subject to the respective modifications contained herein, and in the second column of the said second Schedule hereto. And I hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, proclaim and declare, that the boundaries of the Municipality hereby created shall be those specified in the third Schedule hereto. And I do hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, declare that the said Municipality hereby created shall be divided into four Wards, to be known respectively as High Ward, Jetty Ward, Severn Ward, and Thames Ward, and that the boundaries of the said Wards shall be those respectively defined in the fourth Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

The Sections of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," containing the provisions of the said Ordinance, extended to and applicable within the Incorporated Town of Oamaru, that is to say, Sections numbered 6 to 11, both inclusive, Sections numbered 13 to 27, both inclusive, Sections numbered 29 to 97, both inclusive, Sections numbered 99 to 114, both inclusive, and Sections numbered 116 and 122 respectively.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Sections of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," applicable to the Incorporated Town

of Oamaru, with respective modifications set opposite the numbers of the Sections.

NUMBERS OF SECTIONS.	MODIFICATIONS.
Section Five - -	The style shall be "The Corporation of the Town of Oamaru," instead of "The Corporation of the City of Dunedin."
Section Twelve - -	Instead of each of the said four several Wards of the City of Dunedin," the following modification, "each of the said four several Wards of the Incorporated Town of Oamaru."
Section Twenty-eight -	Instead of the words "City of Dunedin" in this Section, the words "The Incorporated Town of Oamaru."
Section Ninety-eight -	Instead of the words "one hundred thousand pounds" in this Section, the words "thirty thousand pounds."

#### THIRD SCHEDULE.

*Boundaries of the Incorporated Town of Oamaru as delineated on the Record Maps of the said Town, deposited in the Survey Office in Dunedin, in the said Province.*

All that area in the Province of Otago containing by admeasurement one thousand one hundred and eleven acres, more or less, bounded towards the north-west by blocks numbered respectively II and IV, Oamaru Survey District, four thousand five hundred and ninety-six links, also by block numbered II, three thousand two hundred and fifteen links; towards the north north-east by block numbered I, Oamaru District, six thousand four hundred and twenty-six links; towards the east by high-water mark of the ocean, fifteen thousand eight hundred links; towards the south-east by block numbered IV, Oamaru District, two thousand links; towards the south by block numbered IV, six thousand nine hundred and fifty links; towards the south-west by the said block numbered IV, six thousand five hundred and forty-four links; and towards the west-north-west by the said block numbered IV, four thousand five hundred and seventy-six links.

#### FOURTH SCHEDULE.

*Ward boundaries, Incorporated Town of Oamaru.*

**HIGH WARD** comprises all that area bounded towards the north-west by a line along the centre of Severn-street; towards the north by a line along the centre of Itchen-street; towards the east by a line along the centre of Wharf-street, and its continuation in a southerly direction to the Town Boundary; towards the south by the Town Boundary; and towards the south-west by the Town Boundary.

**JETTY WARD** comprises all that area bounded towards the north by a line along the centre of Itchen-street, and its continuation in an easterly direction to the ocean; towards the south and south-east by the Town Boundary; and towards the west by High Ward.

**SEVERN WARD** comprises all that area bounded towards the north-west by the Town Boundary; towards the south-east by High Ward; towards the east by a line along the centre of Thames-street; and towards the south-west by the Town Boundary.

**THAMES WARD** comprises the remaining portion of the said Town of Oamaru.

#### ORDER,

*Making an Additional Rule for the Retail of Spirituous Liquors on the Gold Fields in the Province of Otago.*

I, THOMAS DICK, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority delegated to me in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, do hereby make the Rule following as applicable to persons desirous of obtaining licenses for the retail of spirituous and fermented liquors on the Gold Fields within the said Province, which Rule shall be read with and form the last clause of Section "2—Liquor Licenses" made and published by me on the 31st day of January last (that is to say)—  
Temporary Licenses to be in force for six months may be issued between the first day of January and the thirtieth day of June in any year, on payment of Ten Pounds.
