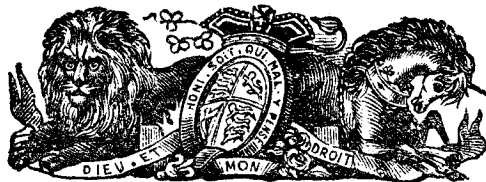

PROCLAMATION

Altering the Limits of the Tuapeka Gold Field, in the Province of Otago.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province.

WHEREAS it is desirable to alter the limits of the Tuapeka Gold Field by including in the said Gold Field the Lands hereinafter described;—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue of the powers delegated to me by His Excellency the Governor, under and by virtue of the "Gold Fields Acts Amendment Act, 1865," do hereby proclaim and declare that the Lands hereinafter described shall henceforth be included within and form part of the Tuapeka Gold Field, under the provisions of the said Act, and the "Gold Fields Act, 1862" (that is to say)—

All that area situate in the south-eastern District of the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement three thousand two hundred (3200) acres, more or less, bounded from a line connecting Trig. Stations C. and K., Table Hill District by the eastern boundary of the existing Tuapeka Gold Field to a line connecting Trig. Stations E. and F. in the said Table Hill District, thence in a south-easterly direction to Trig. Station E., thence in a southerly direction to Trig. Station D., and thence in a south-westerly direction over Trig. Station C., all in the Table Hill District, to and across the east branch of the Tokomairiro River to the boundary of the Tuapeka Gold Field aforesaid.

PROCLAMATION

Withdrawing from the Tuapeka Gold Field certain Waste Lands of the Crown, in the Province of Otago.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province.

WHEREAS by Proclamation, bearing date the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, published in the *Government Gazette* of the Province of Otago, certain Lands therein particularly described were constituted a Gold Field, under the name of the "Tuapeka Gold Field," and the limits of the said "Tuapeka Gold Field" were thereby defined: And whereas the Lands hereinafter described are within the limits of the said "Tuapeka Gold Field" as so defined, and it is expedient to withdraw the same from the said "Tuapeka Gold Field";—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue of the powers delegated to me in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Acts Amendment Act, 1865," do hereby proclaim and declare that I do withdraw from the said "Tuapeka Gold Field" the Lands hereinafter described (that is to say)—

All that area situate in the South-eastern District of the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement fourteen thousand four hundred (14,400) acres, more or less, bounded from the east branch of the Tokomairiro River in a westerly direction by the main South Road to Lovell's Creek, thence in a northerly direction by Lovell's Creek, and a direct line proceeding north by east until it intersects a line connecting Trig. Stations Z. and V., Hillend District, thence in an easterly direction by a line proceeding over Trig. Station V. to Trig. Station W., Tokomairiro District, thence to Trig. Station L., Tokomairiro District, and

over Trig. Station K., Table Hill District, to the east branch of the Tokomairiro River, and thence in a southerly direction by the Tokomairiro River to the Main South Road, the starting point.

PROCLAMATION

Of the Municipality of Port Chalmers.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, made and passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Ordinance to Amend the Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice of his Executive Council, and he was thereby authorised and required, on the petition of not less than fifty persons, comprising a majority of the householders resident in any Township within the Province, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, to extend the provisions of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," to such Township, by such name or incorporation as he should deem fit, with such modification as to the names and number of the members of such proposed Corporation, and the Office-bearers thereof, and any other municipal matters and regulations as should seem to such Superintendent and his Executive Council suitable for the area and population of such Municipality; and, in accordance with such petition or otherwise, should define the boundaries of the Municipality so created, and declare the number of Wards into which such Municipality might be divided, and define the boundaries of such Wards respectively, and declare which of the provisions of the said Ordinance should be applicable to and within the limits of such Municipality: And whereas a Petition of seventy-nine persons, comprising a majority of the householders resident in the Township of Port Chalmers, in the said Province of Otago, has been presented to me, Thomas Dick, as Superintendent of the said Province, praying that the provisions of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," may be extended to the said Township,—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice of my Executive Council, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare, that from and after the day of the date hereof the provisions of the said "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," specified in the first Schedule hereto, shall extend to the said Township of Port Chalmers by and under the name of the Corporation of the Town of Port Chalmers and shall be applicable to and within the Municipality hereby created. And I do, with the like advice of my said Executive Council, proclaim and declare that such of the said provisions as are contained in the sections of the said last-mentioned Ordinance, specified in the first column of the second Schedule hereto, shall extend to the said Township and be applicable to the Municipality hereby created, with and subject to the respective modifications contained herein, and in the second column of the said second Schedule hereto. And I hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Municipality hereby created shall be those specified in the third Schedule hereto. And I

do hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, declare that the said Municipality hereby created shall be divided into four Wards, to be known respectively as South Ward, Middle Ward, East Ward, and High Ward, and that the boundaries of the said Wards shall be those respectively defined in the fourth Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

The sections of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," containing the provisions of the said Ordinance, extended to and applicable within the Incorporated town of Port Chalmers, that is to say, sections numbered 6 to 11, both inclusive, sections numbered 13 to 27, both inclusive, sections numbered 29 to 97, both inclusive, sections numbered 99 to 114, both inclusive, and sections numbered 116 and 122 respectively.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Sections of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," applicable to the Incorporated Town of Port Chalmers, with respective modifications set opposite the numbers of the sections.

All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement two hundred and fifty (250) acres, more or less, bounded by a line proceeding from Mussel Bay along the eastern boundary of section numbered 62, Sawyer's Bay Survey District, to Lower Harbor West Survey District, thence by the south-eastern boundary of the said Lower Harbor West Survey District, to Otago Harbor, thence proceeding in a southerly direction by Otago Harbor round the Port Chalmers Peninsula and Mussel Bay to the starting point.

FORTH SHEDULE.

MIDDLE WARD comprises all that area bounded towards the north by a line extending from Mussel Bay to the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 176 and 177, thence along the boundary line between the said sections to section 178, thence along the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 176 and 178 to section 175, thence along the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 175 and 178 to section 174, thence along the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 174 and 178 to section 179, thence along the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 174 and 179, and at its continuation in the same direction to section 167, thence along the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 167 and 182, and its continuation in the same direction to the centre of Grey-street, thence along a line in the centre of Grey-street in a southerly direction to a line in the centre of Constitution-street, thence along a line in the centre of Constitution-street to a point opposite the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 380 and 381, thence along the boundary line between the said sections and its continuation in the same south-easterly direction to the beach; towards the east by the harbor; towards the south-west by the South Ward; and towards the west by Mussel Bay.

EAST WARD comprises all that area bounded by a line commencing at the Jetty, and proceeding along the centre of Grey-street, to a point opposite the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 17 and 19, thence to and along the said line to section numbered 18, thence along the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 18 and 19 to section 47, then along the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 20 and 47 to section 21, thence along the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 21 and 47 to section 22, thence along the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 21 and 22, and its continuation in the same direction to the centre of Currie street, thence along a line in the centre of the said street to a point opposite the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 162 and 163, thence to and along the said line to section 164, thence along the boundary line of sections numbered respectively 163 and 164 to section 168, thence along the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 165 and 168 to section 169, thence along the boundary line between sections numbered respectively 166 and 169, and its continuation in the same direction to Middle Ward, thence along the northern boundary of Middle Ward in an easterly direction to the Harbor, thence along the Harbor in a northerly direction to the starting point.

HIGH WARD comprises the remaining portion of the said Town, bounded by a line proceeding from Mussel Bay along the eastern boundary of section 62, Sawyer's Bay Survey District to Lower Harbor, West Survey District, thence by the south-eastern boundary of the said Lower Harbor, West District, to Otago Harbor, thence along the Otago Harbor in a southerly direction to East Ward, thence along the western boundary of East Ward to Middle Ward, thence along the northern boundary of Middle Ward in a westerly direction to

Mussel Bay, thence along Mussel Bay in a northerly direction to the starting point.

And I hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Municipality hereby created shall be those specified in the third Schedule hereto. And I do hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, declare that the said Municipality hereby created shall be divided into three Wards, to be known respectively as East Ward, West Ward, and South Ward, and that the

boundaries of the said Wards shall be those respectively defined in the fourth Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

The Sections of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," containing the provisions of the said Ordinance, extended to and applicable within the Incorporated Town of Clyde, that is to say, Sections numbered 6 to 11, both inclusive, Sections numbered 13 to 27, both inclusive, Sections numbered 29 to 97, both inclusive, and Sections numbered 99 to 113, both inclusive, and Sections numbered 116 and 122 respectively.

Boundaries of the Incorporated Town of Clyde as delineated on the Record Map of the said Town, deposited in the Survey Office in Dunedin, in the said Province.

All that area situate in the Province of Otago, and containing by admeasurement eight hundred (800) acres, more or less, bounded by a line proceeding from the north-west corner of section numbered one (1), block I, leaving Rock Survey District in a south-easterly direction along the boundary of the said block I; leaving Rock Survey District twelve thousand eight hundred and forty-eight (12,848) links, thence in a south-westerly direction along the boundary line of the said block I; leaving Rock Survey District to the Clutha River, thence in a north-westerly direction along the bank of the Clutha River to a point bearing 227° from the north-west corner of section numbered 1, block I; leaving Rock Survey District aforesaid, and thence in a direct line to the starting point.

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

three hundred and ten (310) links, to a point two hundred and fifty links distant from the Main South Road, and thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction across sections 131 and 130, block XVI, three thousand and thirty (3030) links, thence crossing the District Road in the same direction to section 102, block XII, sixty (60) links, thence at a right angle along the north-eastern boundary of the said road line in a north-westerly direction three hundred (300) links, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction across section 102, block XII, one thousand five hundred (1500) links, thence at a right angle in a south-easterly direction five hundred and fifty (550) links to the Main South Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the Main South Road, crossing the District Road, to the eastern corner of section 130, block XVI, one thousand five hundred and sixty (1560) links, thence crossing the Main South Road at a right angle to the northern corner of section 135, block XVII, thence along the north-east boundary of the said section numbered 135 two thousand one hundred and seventy (2170) links to section 136, thence along the north-western boundary of section 136 to section 137 two thousand six hundred (2600) links, thence along the north-eastern boundary of section 137 in a south easterly direction eight hundred and seventy-five (875) links to section 138, thence along the north-western boundary of section 138 to a District Road line along Tokomairi River bank four thousand four hundred and fifty (4450) links, thence in a north-western direction along the said road line four thousand five hundred (4500) links to the starting point

EAST WARD comprises all that part of the private Township of Milton hereinbefore described, situate on the south-east of the Main South Road, and bounded on the north-west by the said Main South Road, being sections numbered respectively 134, 135, and 137, block XVII, Tokomairi District, as delineated in the Record Map of the said district, deposited in the Survey Office, Dunedin, and as comprised in the plans of subdivision, deposited with the Registrar of Deeds for the Province of Otago by Peter M'Gill, James Smith, and William Steel Smith Reid.

WEST WARD comprises all that area being the portion of the Town of Milton hereinbefore described not being comprised in the East Ward.

ORDER

Revoking the IV. of the Rules and Regulations of the Otago Gold Fields, and making another in lieu thereof.

WHEREAS John Hyde Harris, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, under and by virtue of the powers delegated to him in that behalf, did, on the twenty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, make and ordain certain Rules and Regulations relating to Mining on the Otago Gold Fields, and the making of which Rules and Regulations was duly notified in the *Government Gazette* of the Province of Otago, published on the said twenty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four: And whereas it is expedient that the fourth of the said Rules and Regulations and all the sections thereof numbered respectively 1 to 26, both inclusive, relating to Water Rights and Races, and other matters relating thereto, should be revoked and cancelled, and that another Rule in lieu of the said Fourth Rule should be made.

Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the power delegated to me in this behalf, do hereby revoke and cancel the said Fourth Rule, and all the sections thereof, numbered respectively 1 to 26 as

aforesaid, and do order that the same shall stand revoked and cancelled from the day of the date hereof; and in lieu of the Fourth Rule, and the sections thereof, I do make the Rule following, contained in sixteen sections relating to Water Rights and Races, that is to say:—

IV.—WATER RIGHTS AND RACES.

1. *Races already Constructed.*—Races constructed prior to the proclamation of these Rules and Regulations must be registered with the Warden, as provided by Sub-section 1 of Section XVIII of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1865."

2. *Superiority of Right.*—Superiority of right to a supply of water shall be determined by priority of occupation, the earlier occupant having the superior right. In all cases when the occupier claims under a certificate or other authority in writing granted by a Warden or Commissioner, occupation shall be taken to have commenced at the date of such certificate or authority.

3. *Superiority of Right Forfeited by Disuse.*—If any race shall be entirely unused for a full period of thirty days at a time when water is available for it, occupation of the right shall be deemed to have recommenced at the last re-occupation thereof.

4. *Heads of Races.*—All races that may hereafter be cut shall have a point specified at which they shall be taken from the creek or river. In races already cut, this point shall be taken to be the spot from which the race now heads. No person shall shift or alter the head of any race without the written sanction of the Warden, nor to the prejudice of any existing right.

5. *Insufficient Supply of Water.*—If the water flowing in any creek or river is insufficient to supply all the races connected therewith, the owner of any right shall, on receipt of a written notice from the owner of a superior right, stating that the supply of such superior right is less than he is entitled to, immediately cease to use the water, or such portion thereof as may be necessary to make up the supply of the superior right.

6. *Water Gauge.*—In the construction, and for the purposes of these Regulations, a Head of Water shall be held and deemed to be forty (40) superficial inches of water, to be gauged by a box, 12 feet long, 10 inches deep, and 20 inches wide, all measured in the clear. The box shall be covered throughout. The upper or entrance end of such box may be left entirely open; but the lower end, or end of exit, shall be fitted with a bar 2 inches high, affixed to the floor of the box, and with a pressure or headboard, 6 inches deep, affixed to the top of the box, leaving an aperture of 2 inches in depth, and of the full width of the box.

(a.) If more than one sluice head of water requires to be gauged, the gauge-box should be enlarged horizontally to ensure accurate measurement. But when this cannot be done owing to natural obstacles, or other sufficient reasons, the gauge-box may be enlarged perpendicularly, in which case the dimensions of the box must be as follows:—

PROCLAMATION

Of the Municipality of Milton.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, made and passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Ordinance to Amend the Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice of his Executive Council, and he was thereby authorised and required, on the petition of not less than fifty persons, comprising a majority of the householders resident in any Township within the Province, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, to extend the provisions of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," to such Township, by such name or incorporation as he should deem fit, with such modification as to the names and number of the members of such proposed Corporation, and the Office-bearers thereof, and any other municipal matters and regulations as should seem to such Superintendent and his Executive Council suitable for the area and population of such Municipality; and, in accordance with such petition or otherwise, should define the boundaries of the Municipality so created, and declare the number of Wards into which such Municipality might be divided, and define the boundaries of such Wards respectively, and declare which of the provisions of the said Ordinance should be applicable to and within the limits of such Municipality: And whereas a petition of sixty persons, comprising a majority of the householders resident in the Township of Milton, in the said Province of Otago, has been presented to me, Thomas Dick, as Superintendent of the said Province, praying that the provisions of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," may be extended to the said Township;—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice of my Executive Council, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare, that from and after the day of the date hereof, the provisions of the said "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," specified in the first Schedule hereto, shall extend to the said Township of Milton, by and under the name of the Corporation of the Town of Milton, and shall be applicable to and within the Municipality hereby created. And I do, with the like advice of my said Executive Council, proclaim and declare that such of the said provisions as are contained in the sections of the said last-mentioned Ordinance, specified in the first column of the second Schedule hereto, shall extend to the said Township, and be applicable to the Municipality hereby created, with and subject to the respective modifications contained herein, and in the second column of the said second Schedule hereto. And I hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, proclaim and declare, that the boundaries of the Municipality hereby created shall be those specified in

the third Schedule hereto. And I do hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, declare that the said Municipality hereby created shall be divided into two Wards, to be known respectively as East Ward and West Ward, and that the boundaries of the said Wards shall be those respectively defined in the fourth Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

The Sections of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," containing the provisions of the said Ordinance, extended to and applicable within the Incorporated Town of Milton, that is to say, Sections numbered 6 to 11, both inclusive, Sections numbered 13 to 27, both inclusive, Sections numbered 29 to 97, both inclusive, Sections numbered 99 to 113, both inclusive, and Sections numbered 116 and 122 respectively.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Sections of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," applicable to the Incorporated Town of Milton, with respective modifications set opposite the numbers of the Sections.

All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement 183a. 3r. 3lp. more or less, being sections numbered respectively 134, 135, and 137, block XVII, Tokomairiro Survey District, and parts of sections numbered respectively 130, 131, and 132, block XVI, Tokomairiro Survey District, together with part of section numbered 102, block XII, of the said District, bounded towards the north-west by a line commencing at the western corner of section 134, block XVII, Tokomairiro District, proceeding in a north-easterly direction along the Main South Road one thousand and three (1003) links, thence crossing the Main South Road at a right angle in a north-westerly direction to a point two hundred and fourteen (214) links distant from the north-western side of the Main South Road, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction two hundred and thirty-five (235) links, thence at a right angle in a north-westerly direction three hundred and forty-six (346) links, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction one thousand six hundred and sixty-two (1662) links, thence at a right angle in a south-easterly direction

And so on in proportion for any greater number of sluice heads.

(b.) The gauge-box shall at all times be placed on a level. When water is taken from one source only, the supply shall be gauged at the head of the race, or the source of supply. But if the race is fed, or supplied in part, by any side stream, or streams, the gauge-box shall be placed immediately below such side stream, or the last of such side streams.

(c.) The velocity of the water above the gauge-box shall, if required, be lessened by the construction of a dam-bank, or by levelling the race for a distance of 30 feet; and such velocity shall not exceed an average of 1 foot per second in the said 30 feet, to be gauged by a float.

7. *Water not to be wasted.*—Holders of rights shall not allow any water to run to waste; but such water shall be appropriated to the use of the next holder of a right, according to the date of their respective registrations.

8. *Transfer or Assignment.*—The transfer or assignment of any race, or of any interest therein, shall not affect any right or privilege attached to such race; provided that any such transfer or assignment shall have been duly registered at the office of the Warden, and a memorandum thereof made upon the back of the original certificate.

9. *Working Ground occupied for Races.*—Any person desirous of working the ground on which any race or portion of a race is situated, may do so by first providing an equally good race for the use of the occupier; provided that the consent of the Warden thereto be first obtained.

10. *Causing Claims to be flooded.*—No person shall back the water of any creek, river, race, or water-course upon any claim, or otherwise cause any claim to be flooded, either willfully or by neglect.

11. *Obstructions to Water-Courses.*—No person shall deposit any earth, stones, tailings, or other substance in the bed of any water-course, so as to obstruct the flow of water therein.

12. *Construction of Tail-races.*—Before any person shall construct a tail-race, he shall first proceed by notice in the same manner as is directed in sub-section 1 of Section XVIII of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1865"; but such notice shall only require to be posted for seven (7) clear days, at the expiration whereof the applicant shall return to the Warden a copy of the notice, signed by the holders of the four (4) nearest claims, as expressing their assent to, or dissent from, the issue of a certificate for such tail-race. And the Warden shall enquire into any objection thereto, or into any cause of dissent as aforesaid; and shall thereafter issue or withhold a certificate of registration, according to the equities of the case.

13. *Use of Tail-races.*—Any person wishing to use a tail-race may do so on condition of first paying to the owner of such tail-race a proportionate share of the expense of construction; provided that the person so using any tail-race shall assist in clearing the same whenever it shall be necessary to do so.

14. *Flood-races.*—Any person may cut a flood-race through or by his claim, subject to such restrictions as the Warden may consider necessary for the public good.

15. *Races may be carried through Claims.*—Upon application being made to the Warden, it shall be competent for him to authorise the applicant to pass a head-race or tail-race over, under, or through any claim, or right; provided that compensation shall be allowed for estimated damage (if any), and prior to commencing the construction of such race such compensation shall be paid to the holder or holders of the claim or right

over, under, or through which the proposed race has to be constructed.

16. *Scale of Fees.*—For every sluicehead of water for which a certificate shall be granted, the annual fee of five shillings shall be charged; and the applicant for any water-right shall deposit the total amount of fees chargeable annually on making his application therefor. And if such application is thereafter refused or withdrawn, the said deposit shall be returned, less the fee of five shillings, to be in such case retained.
