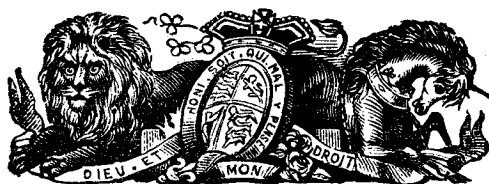

## PROCLAMATION

*Of Limits and Boundaries of Ports and Harbors in the Province of Otago, in the Colony of New Zealand.*

By his Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the "Marine Board Act, 1863," I, Thomas Dick, as Superintendent of the Province of Otago, am empowered and required amongst other things to define for the purposes of the said Act the limits of any Port within the said Province of Otago;—Now therefore I, the said Thomas Dick, as such Superintendent as aforesaid, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and define the limits of the several Ports hereinafter specified in manner following (that is to say)—

### I. *The Port of Dunedin*

shall comprise all navigable waters within the Harbor of Otago, between the Ocean Beach and the Otago Heads, and within a radius of three miles from Tairoa's Head.

### II. *The Port of Oamaru*

shall comprise all navigable waters within a radius of three miles of the Flagstaff at the said Port.

### III. *The Port of Moeraki*

shall comprise all navigable waters within a radius of three miles of the Jetty at the said Port.

### IV. *The Port of Waikouaiti*

shall comprise all navigable waters within a radius of three miles of the Waikouaiti River.

### V. *The Port of Molyneux*

shall comprise all navigable waters within Molyneux Bay, and within a line drawn from the "Nuggetts" to "Coal Point."

### VI. *The Port of Waikawa*

shall comprise all navigable waters within a radius of three miles from the mouth of Waikawa River.

## PROCLAMATION

*Of Governor having assented to certain Ordinances.*

WHEREAS in the twenty-first Session of the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, held in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of her Majesty Queen Victoria, there were passed by the said Council the following Bills, that is to say—

- "Oamaru Reserves Bill, 1865."
- "Oamaru Mechanics Institute Reserve Management Bill, 1865."
- "Frankton Mill Reserves Bill, 1865."
- "Interpretation Bill, 1865."
- "The Education Reserves Management and Leasing Bill, 1865."
- "Otago Dock Trust Bill, 1865."
- "Southern Trunk Railway Guaranteed Interest Bill, 1865."
- "Dunedin Reserves Management Bill, 1865."
- "Road Districts Loan Bill, 1865."

And whereas the said Bills above-named were, upon the fifth day of January last, presented to the Superintendent of the Province of Otago for the assent of the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand: And whereas the said Superintendent did declare that he

reserved the said Bills for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon: And whereas the said Bills have been laid before the said Governor, and he has assented to the same: Now therefore I, the said Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby proclaim that the said Bills have been laid before His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, and that he has assented to the same.

**PROCLAMATION**

*Of the Municipality of Cromwell.*

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**WHEREAS** by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, made and passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intitled "An Ordinance to Amend the Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice of his Executive Council, and he was thereby authorised and required, on the petition of not less than fifty persons, comprising a majority of the householders resident in any Township within the Province, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, to extend the Provisions of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," to such Township, by such name or incorporation as he should deem fit, with such modification as to the names and number of the members of such proposed Corporation, and the Office-bearers thereof, and any other municipal matters and regulations as should seem to such Superintendent and his Executive Council suitable for the area and population of such Municipality; and, in accordance with such petition or otherwise, should define the boundaries of the Municipality so created, and declare the number of Wards into which such Municipality might be divided, and define the boundaries of such Wards respectively, and declare which of the provisions of the said Ordinance should be applicable to and within the limits of such Municipality: And whereas a Petition of fifty-seven persons, comprising a majority of the householders resident in the Township of Cromwell, in the said Province of Otago, has been presented to me, Thomas Dick, as Superintendent of the said Province, praying that the provisions of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," may be extended to the said Township;—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice of my Executive Council, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare, that from and after the day of the date hereof, the provisions of the said "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," specified in the first Schedule hereto, shall extend to the said Township of Cromwell, by and under the name of the Corporation of the Town of Cromwell, and shall be applicable to and within the Municipality hereby created. And I do, with the like advice of my said Executive Council, proclaim and declare that such of the said provisions as are contained in the sections of the said last-mentioned Ordinance, specified in the first column of the second Schedule hereto, shall extend to the said Township, and be applicable to the Municipality hereby created, with and subject to the respective modifications contained herein, and in the second column of the said second Schedule hereto. And I hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, proclaim and

declare, that the boundaries of the Municipality hereby created shall be those specified in the third Schedule hereto. And I do hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, declare that the said Municipality hereby created shall be divided into two Wards, to be known respectively as Bridge Ward and Kawarau Ward, and that the boundaries of the said Wards shall be those respectively defined in the fourth Schedule hereto.

**FIRST SCHEDULE.**

The Sections of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," containing the provisions of the said Ordinance, extended to and applicable within the Incorporated Town of Cromwell, that is to say, Sections numbered 6 to 11, both inclusive, Sections numbered 13 to 27, both inclusive, Sections numbered 29 to 97, both inclusive, Sections numbered 99 to 113, both inclusive, and Sections numbered 116 and 122 respectively.

**SECOND SCHEDULE.**

Sections of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," applicable to the Incorporated Town of Cromwell, with respective modifications set opposite the numbers of the Sections.

NUMBERS OF SECTIONS.	MODIFICATIONS.
Section Five ... ..	The style shall be "The Corporation of the Town of Cromwell," instead of "The Corporation of the City of Dunedin."
Section Twelve ... ..	Instead of "each of the said four several Wards of the City of Dunedin," the following modification, "each of the said two several Wards of the Incorporated Town of Cromwell."
Section Twenty-eight ...	Instead of the words "City of Dunedin" in this Section, the words "the Incorporated Town of Cromwell."
Section Ninety-eight ...	Instead of the words "one hundred thousand pounds" in this Section, the words "ten thousand pounds."

**THIRD SCHEDULE.**

*Boundaries of the Incorporated Town of Cromwell, as delineated on the Record Maps of the said Town, deposited in the Survey Office in Dunedin, in the said Province.*

All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement six hundred (600) acres, more or less, bounded towards the north by a line commencing on the west bank of the Clutha River, and proceeding in a westerly direction, with a magnetic bearing of 269° 25' to the north-east corner of Cemetery Reserve, 4100 links; thence along a line in the same direction, 7100 links; thence by a line at a right angle in a southerly direction, 6940 links; thence by a line at a right angle in an easterly direction to the Kawarau River, 4900 links; thence along the Kawarau and Clutha Rivers to the starting point, as delineated on the Record Map of the said Town, deposited in the Survey Office at Dunedin.

**FOURTH SCHEDULE.**

*Ward Boundaries, Incorporated Town of Cromwell.*

BRIDGE WARD comprises all that area bounded towards the west by a line commencing at a point on the north bank of the Kawarau River opposite the centre of Murray-street, thence to and along the centre

of the said street, thence by a line in the same direction to the Clutha River, towards the east by the Clutha River, and towards the south-west by the Kawarau River.

KAWARAU WARD comprises all the remaining portion of the said Town of Cromwell not included in the description of Bridge Ward.

#### ORDER

*Adding another Section to the Fourth Rule of the Rules and Regulations of the Otago Gold Fields.*

WHEREAS doubts have arisen as to the effect of certain sections of the Fourth Rule of the Rules and Regulations of the Otago Gold Fields, made and published on the eleventh day of April last, may have upon the rights of the holders of water-races constructed and used previously to the day of the date of the making and publication of such Order; and whereas it is advisable that such doubts should be settled.

Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers delegated to me in this behalf, do hereby add the section following, to be numbered as section seventeen, to the sixteen sections of the said Fourth Rule so made and published as aforesaid; that is to say:—

17. Nothing contained in the preceding sections of this Rule shall extend or be construed to extend to deprive the registered occupier of any water-race, being the holder of a miner's right, of any rights or privileges which he had acquired previously to the eleventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six; and every such registered occupier shall, and shall be deemed to hold, occupy, and use such water-race and the water thereof, under and subject to the regulations in force as to water rights and races at the time when such claim was originally registered; and the preceding sections of this Rule made and published on the eleventh day of April last shall and shall be deemed to apply to such water-races only of which the first registration shall have been or shall be made subsequently to such last-mentioned date.

#### ORDER.

*Jetty Dues, &c., Dunedin.*

HIS Honor, Thomas Dick, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, directs it to be notified that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him in that behalf by the "Jetties and Wharves Ordinance, 1858," he has, with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, made, ordained, and appointed the following Additional Rules and Regulations set out for the management of the Jetties at Dunedin.

VI. Vessels under 40 tons register shall be allowed four, and vessels above that tonnage shall be allowed six, working days to load and unload at the Jetties, as the case may be; and any vessel remaining longer at any Jetty shall be charged one penny per registered ton per day.

VII. No Jetty Dues shall be charged on Emigrants' and passengers' personal luggage.
