5. To distribute the net residue of the said trust
moneys between and amongst, and for the benefit of
all the creditors of the bankrupt, who were his creditors
at the time of the presentation of his said Petition, and
who shall duly prove their debts by affidavit, within
three calendar months from the date of this Order, by
way of *pro rata* distribution, subject to existing legal
priorities, but so that the said creditors shall not re-
ceive more than twenty shillings in the pound upon
their said respective debts.
