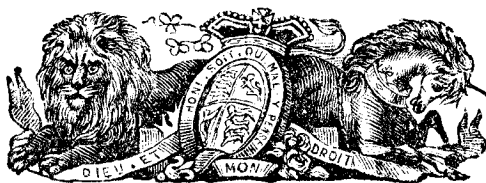

PROCLAMATION

Of a Gaol at Naseby.
