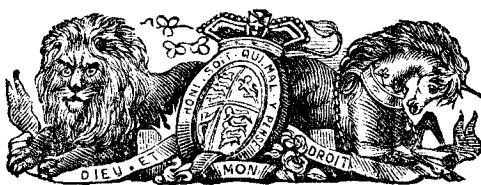

PROCLAMATION

Declaring a portion of the Province of Otago an Infected District, under the provisions of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province.

WHEREAS John Hyde Harris, Esquire, the then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him as such Superintendent in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, dated the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, proclaim and declare a certain District or portion of the said Province, in the said Proclamation particularly described, to be an Infected District within the meaning and for the purposes of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861." And whereas by another Proclamation published in the said *Gazette*, and bearing date the sixth day of November following, the said John Hyde Harris, as such Superintendent as aforesaid, did extend the limits of the said Infected District, so as to include therein another portion of the said Province in the said last-mentioned Proclamation particularly described: And whereas by another Proclamation published in the said *Gazette*, and bearing date the twenty-seventh day of December following, the said John Hyde Harris, as such Superintendent as aforesaid, did again extend the limits of the said Infected District, so as to include therein another portion of the said Province in the said last-mentioned Proclamation particularly described: And whereas it is expedient still further to extend the limits of the said Infected District, so as to include therein the whole of the territory hereinafter described;—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province of Otago, by virtue and exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and

declare that, from and after the day of the date hereof, the limits and boundaries hereinafter described shall be the limits and boundaries of the said Infected District, and shall include the territory hereinafter mentioned, which territory shall be deemed an Infected District within the meaning and for the purposes of the said "Diseased Cattle Act 1861," (that is to say)—

All that area within the Province of Otago, bounded towards the north by the Province of Canterbury, from Awarua Bay to the eastern shore of the Wanaka Lake, thence by the said eastern shore of the Wanaka Lake and the Clutha River to the Dunstan Mountains, thence by the Dunstan Mountains to Mount Saint Bathans, thence by the Hawkdun Mountains, the Kakanui Mountains, and the Horse Ranges to the Ocean, thence towards the east by the Ocean to the Taieri River, thence by the Taieri River to the Waipori Lake and River, thence due west from Waipori River to Waitahuna Hill, thence in a direct line to the northern corner of the North Tokomairiro Hundred, thence in a direct line to Trig. Station E, Table Hill District, thence by the leading ridge to and across the road line forming the north-eastern boundary of block I, Table Hill District, thence along the south-western boundary of the said road line and its continuation to the Main South Road, thence by the north-western side of the Main South Road proceeding in a north-easterly direction to the Taieri River, thence by the Taieri River across the Main South Road, thence proceeding in a south-westerly direction by the south-eastern side of the Main South Road to the eastern branch of the Tokomairiro River, thence by the said eastern branch to its junction with the western branch of the said Tokomairiro River, thence by the said western branch of the Tokomairiro River to the Main South Road, thence by the south-eastern side of the Main South Road in a south-westerly direction to the Coal Reserve in Block X, North Tuakitoto District, thence by a line proceeding in a

south-westerly direction along the south-eastern boundary of the aforesaid Coal Reserve and its continuation in the same direction to the head of the Tuakitoto Lake, thence in a southerly direction along the Tuakitoto Lake and Stream to the Kaitangata Lake, thence along the Kaitangata Lake and Stream to the Clutha River, thence in a northerly direction along the Clutha River to the Tallaburn, thence by a line to the summit of the Tapanui Range, thence to Rankleburn at its source, and by Rankleburn, Pomahaka, and Waipahi Rivers to the southern boundary line of Run numbered 167, thence by the said southern boundary line to the Waikaka Stream, and by the Waikaka Stream to the Mataura River, and by the Mataura River and the northern boundary line of the Province of Southland to the Manipori Lake, thence by the Waiiau River to the Ocean, and thence towards the south and west by the Ocean to Awarua Bay, the starting point.

PROCLAMATION.

Boundaries of Goodwood Road District altered and enlarged.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted, that until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one districts, which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such Districts: And whereas it is expedient to alter and extend the boundaries of the Goodwood Road District in manner and as described in the Schedule hereto;— Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Goodwood Road District shall, from the day of the date hereof, be altered and extended, and that the boundaries of the Goodwood Road District shall henceforth be as described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

THE GOODWOOD ROAD DISTRICT shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by sections 47, 46, 45, 56, and 35, block III, Hawksbury Survey District, by sections 67, 66, and 65, block IV, Hawksbury Survey District, and by section 80, block X, Moeraki Survey District; on the west by sections 12 and 16, block II, Hawksbury Survey District; on the south by sections 1, 2, and 3, block I, Hawksbury Survey District; again on the west by section 5, said block I, and by a direct line from the southern angle of section 5 to north-east angle of section 38, block I, Hawksbury Survey District, thence by Bush Reserve and section 33, block II, Hawksbury Survey District; on the south-west and south by Main North Road, section 44, block IV, Hawksbury Survey District, and

Pleasant River to the Ocean; on the east by Ocean to eastern angle of section 50, block III, Hawksbury Survey District.

PROCLAMATION.

Road District of Popotunoa formed.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance, passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that, until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one districts which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it should be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts by forming and naming new districts.

And whereas it is expedient to form a new Road District to be named the Popotunoa Road District;— Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area bounded as described in the Schedule hereto shall, from the day of the date hereof, be constituted a Road District, and shall be named the Popotunoa Road District.

SCHEDULE.

Popotunoa Road District shall comprise all that area bounded on the north by the Pomahaka and Clutha Rivers; on the east by road line through block IV, Pomahaka Survey District, same forming western boundary of Te Houka Road District to section 12, block LXXXVIII, Clutha Survey District; thence following northern boundary of Kaihiku Road District, and northern and eastern boundaries of the Waiwera Road District; thence by Waiwera River to southern boundary of block I, Kuriwao Survey District; thence on the south by southern boundaries of blocks I and II, Kuriwao Survey District, and said line continued to south-eastern boundary of said Waipahi Survey District; on the north-west by portion of south-eastern boundary of said Waipahi Survey District to north-western boundary of block IX, Pomahaka Survey District; thence by said boundary line to block XI, Pomahaka Survey District; on the west by western boundary of block II, Pomahaka Survey District to the Wairuna Creek; thence by said Creek to Pomahaka River.

KAIKORAI TOLL.—Notice is hereby given that on and after Saturday the first day of December proximo, the Tolls contained in the list appended hereto may be taken at the Kaikorai Toll Bar (that is to say):—

- (1.) For every horse or other beast drawing any coach, chariot, landau, brouche, chaise, phaeton, curricule, car, gig, or any such like carriage—one shilling.
- (2.) For every horse or other beast (but two oxen or neat cattle to count as one horse), drawing any waggon, wain, or other such like carriage—one shilling. When the tire of each wheel is four inches broad or upwards—ninepence.
- (3.) For every horse or other beast drawing any cart or dray on two wheels—sixpence.
- (3.) For every horse, mule, or ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing—sixpence.
- (5.) For every drove of horses, mules, or asses, unladen, and not drawing—threepence for every head.
- (6.) For every drove of oxen, cows, or neat cattle—the sum of three shillings and fourpence per score, and so in proportion for any greater or less number.
- (7.) For every drove of calves, swine, goats, sheep, or lambs—the sum of tenpence per score, and so in proportion for any greater or less number.

Delegation to the Superintendent, under the "Gold Fields Act."

G. GREY, Governor.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time, to delegate

to the Superintendent of any Province, or such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the Act now in recital, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven, of the said Act, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers.

Now therefore I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto

THOMAS DICK, Esquire,

as Superintendent of the Province of Otago, all the powers vested in me, under or by virtue of the said "Gold Fields Act, 1866," except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven, to have, hold, and exercise within the Province of Otago the said powers hereby given to the said

THOMAS DICK, Esquire,

so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer: Provided always that copies of all Rules and Regulations made under the delegation aforesaid shall be forthwith transmitted to the Colonial Secretary, in order that the same may be laid before the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the one hundred and tenth clause of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866."

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, at the Government House, at Wellington, and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this twelfth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.
