### PROCLAMATION.

*Boundaries of Pine Hill Road District altered and extended.*

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted, that until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one districts, which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it should be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time, by proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts: And whereas it is expedient to alter and extend the boundaries of the Pine Hill Road District in manner hereinafter described:

Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Pine Hill Road District shall, from the day of the date hereof, be altered and extended, and that the boundaries of the Pine Hill Road District shall henceforth be as follows, that is to say—

THE PINE HILL ROAD DISTRICT is bounded on the north by block II, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District; on the west by the western boundary of block III, in the same district, then following the southern boundary of the said block III to the Water of Leith, thence by the Water of Leith and Dunedin Town Belt; on the south-east by part of North-east Valley Survey District to section numbered 13 thereof, thence by sections numbered respectively 10, 11, 14, and 15, block X, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District aforesaid, thence in a direct line through sections numbered respectively 16 and 18, block X aforesaid to the north-west angle of section numbered 1, block XI, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District aforesaid, thence by sections numbered respectively 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, and 15, block XI aforesaid; on the east by the eastern boundary of the said block XI, thence by a direct line to the south-west angle of block XII, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District aforesaid, thence by the western boundaries of blocks XII and I respectively, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District aforesaid to the southern boundary of block II thereof.

### PROCLAMATION

*Declaring a portion of the Province of Otago an Infected District, under the provisions of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."*

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province.

WHEREAS John Hyde Harris, Esquire, the then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him as such Superintendent in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, dated the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, proclaim

and declare a certain District or portion of the said Province, in the said Proclamation particularly described, to be an Infected District within the meaning and for the purposes of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861." And whereas by another Proclamation published in the said *Gazette*, and bearing date the sixth day of November following, the said John Hyde Harris, as such Superintendent as aforesaid, did extend the limits of the said Infected District, so as to include therein another portion of the said Province in the said last-mentioned Proclamation particularly described: And whereas by another Proclamation published in the said *Gazette*, and bearing date the twenty-seventh day of December following, the said John Hyde Harris, as such Superintendent as aforesaid, did again extend the limits of the said Infected District, so as to include therein another portion of the said Province in the said last-mentioned Proclamation particularly described: And whereas it is expedient still further to extend the limits of the said Infected District, so as to include therein the whole of the territory hereinafter described;—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province of Otago, by virtue and exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the twelfth day of December next, the limits and boundaries hereinafter described shall be the limits and boundaries of the said Infected District, and shall include the territory hereinafter mentioned, which territory shall be deemed an Infected District within the meaning and for the purposes of the said "Diseased Cattle Act 1861," (that is to say)—

All that area within the Province of Otago, bounded towards the north by the Province of Canterbury, from Awarau Bay to the eastern shore of the Wanaka Lake, thence by the said eastern shore of the Wanaka Lake and the Clutha River to the Dunstan Mountains, thence by the Dunstan Mountains to Mount Saint Bathans, thence by the Hawkdun Mountains, the Kakanui Mountains, and the Horse Ranges to the Ocean, thence towards the east by the Ocean to the Taieri River, thence by the Taieri River to the Waipori Lake and River, thence due west from Waipori River to Waitahuna Hill, thence in a direct line to the northern corner of the North Tokomairiō Hundred, thence in a direct line to Trig. Station E, Table Hill District, thence by the leading ridge to and across the road line forming the north-eastern boundary of block I, Table Hill District, thence along the south-western boundary of the said road line and its continuation to the Main South Road, thence by the north-western side of the Main South Road proceeding in a north-easterly direction to the Taieri River, thence by the Taieri River across the Main South Road, thence proceeding in a south-westerly direction by the south-eastern side of the Main South Road to the eastern Branch of the Tokomairiō River, thence by the said eastern branch to its junction with the western branch of the said Tokomairiō River, thence by the said western branch of the Tokomairiō River to the Main South Road, thence by the south-eastern side of the Main South Road in a south-westerly direction to the Coal Reserve in Block X, North Tuakitoto District, thence by a line proceeding in a south-westerly direction along the south-eastern boundary of the aforesaid Coal Reserve and its continuation in the same direction to the head of the Tuakitoto Lake, thence in a southerly direction along the Tuakitoto Lake and Stream to the Kaitangata Lake, thence along the Kaitangata Lake and Stream to the Clutha River, thence in a northerly direction along the Clutha River to the Tallaburn, thence by a line to the summit of the Tapanui Range, thence to Rankleburn at its source, and by Rankleburn, Pomahaka, and Waipahi Rivers to the southern boundary line of Run numbered 167, thence by the said southern boundary line to the Waikaka Stream, and by the Waikaka Stream to the Mataura River, and by the Mataura River and the northern boundary line of the Province of Southland to the Manipori Lake, thence

by the Waiau River to the Ocean, and thence towards the south and west by the Ocean to Awarua Bay, the starting point.

**WHEREAS** by the "Otago Loan Ordinance, 1861," passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, provision was made for raising a loan of fifty thousand pounds for the public service of the said Province and for liquidation of the public debt.

And whereas by the "Otago Loan Ordinance, 1861-2," provision was made for the appointment by the Governor of trustees for receiving such sums as by the said Ordinance are required to be paid to them.

And whereas by the said last-mentioned Ordinance it is further provided that every sum so paid should be invested on the security of debentures issued by the General Government, or otherwise, as His Excellency the Governor and Superintendent should direct.

And whereas by the "Otago Loan Ordinance, 1862," provision was made for raising a loan of five hundred thousand pounds for the public service of the Province of Otago, and providing a sinking fund for the liquidation thereof.

And whereas by the said Ordinance it was further provided that every sum so paid should be invested in the security of debentures issued by the General Government, or otherwise, as His Excellency the Governor and the Superintendent should direct.

And whereas Alfred Rowland Chetham Strode, of Dunedin, and John Jones, of Waikouaiti, have been duly appointed trustees under and by virtue of the powers in the said respective Ordinances in that behalf contained.

And whereas the said trustees have received, and now hold, for the purposes of the said sinking funds, by the said respective Ordinances provided for certain

sums as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say—for the purposes of the "Otago Loan Ordinance, 1861," and the "Otago Loan Ordinance, 1861-2," the sum of seven thousand and twenty-three pounds and ten shillings.

And whereas it is expedient that the sum of seven thousand and twenty-three pounds and ten shillings, and other sum or sums that may now or hereafter be so held by the said trustees should be invested on the security of debentures issued by the Government of the Province of Otago, pursuant to request from His Honor the Superintendent of the said Province of Otago.

**T**HE following sections of "The Aliens Act, 1866," relating to the mode of applying for Letters of Naturalization, are published for general information.

E. W. STAFFORD.

V. When any alien friend now residing in or who shall hereafter reside within the Colony of New Zealand desires to be naturalized if he be of good repute and if he take the oath prescribed in the Schedule hereto the Governor may if he think fit grant to him under the seal of the Colony letters of naturalization subject to such conditions (if any) as he may consider necessary or advisable and may thereby grant to him all the rights and capacities of a natural-born British subject within the Colony except the rights and capacities (if any) specially excepted in and by such letters of naturalization.

VII. When any person desires to obtain naturalization under this Act he may present to the Governor a memorial signed by himself and verified upon oath stating his name age birth-place residence and occupation the length of his residence in the Colony and his desire to settle therein and praying that letters of naturalization may be granted to him and also a certificate signed by some Resident Magistrate or Justice of the Peace to the effect that the applicant is known to the person so signing and is to the best of such person's belief and knowledge a person of good repute.

VIII. If the Governor think fit to grant such letters he shall direct the applicant to take the oath prescribed by this Act before some Judge of the Supreme Court or of a District Court or before some Resident

Magistrate or Justice of the Peace and upon the certificate of such Judge or Magistrate or Justice that the applicant has taken before him the said oath he shall issue to the applicant letters of naturalization accordingly and upon such letters of naturalization being issued to him the applicant shall enjoy all the rights and capacities which a natural-born subject of the United Kingdom can enjoy or transmit within this Colony except such rights and capacities (if any) as are specially excepted in the letters of naturalization granted and issued to him.

IX. When any person resident in New Zealand has previously obtained any certificate or letters of naturalization in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland or any part thereof or in any British Colony on the Continents of Australia Africa or America or in the Colony of Tasmania and desires to be naturalized in New Zealand if he submit such certificate to the Governor in Council and if he further state in his memorial as aforesaid that he is the person named in such certificate and that the same has been obtained without any fraud or intentional false statement and that the signature and the seal (if any) thereto are to the best of his belief and knowledge genuine the Governor may at his discretion grant the letters of naturalization without requiring from the applicant any further residence in New Zealand or (if the applicant has previously taken a similar oath) the oath prescribed by this Act.

X. The Colonial Secretary shall enrol for safe custody as of record all such letters of naturalization and a certified copy of every such certificate as aforesaid and shall demand and receive from every person to whom such letters are granted the fee of one pound in respect of such enrolment and shall cause to be made proper indices to such letters and certificates and shall permit every person desirous of so doing to inspect the same and make copies of such letters and certificates on payment of the fee of one shilling for every such inspection.

SCHEDULE.

I do sincerely promise and swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Victoria as lawful Sovereign of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of this Colony of New Zealand. So help me God.

CAP. CVI.

*An Act to authorize Loans in aid of the construction of Docks in British Possessions.* [5th July, 1865.]

WHEREAS with a view to secure accommodation for vessels of the Royal Navy in British Possessions abroad it is expedient to authorize loans in aid of the formation there of docks of dimensions greater than would be requisite for commercial or other private purposes only.

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :
