PROCLAMATION,

Exempting Certain Districts from the Regulations for Depasturing Stock in the Province of Otago.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, did, upon the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, by Proclamation in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority delegated to and vested in me in that behalf, make, proclaim, and declare the Regulations in the said Proclamation contained for the depasturing of Stock upon land within proclaimed Gold Fields, and particularly within the Districts after mentioned; And whereas I, the said Superintendent did upon the twenty-fourth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, by another Proclamation in the said *Gazette* cancel one of the said Regulations, and substitute another in lieu thereof; And whereas it is expedient to exempt the Districts aftermentioned from the said Regulations;—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, as such Superintendent as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date hereof, the Districts hereinafter mentioned (that is to say)

Arrow,
Cardrona,
Queenstown, and
Shotover,

in the Province of Otago, shall be exempt from the said Regulations made and published as aforesaid, with the exception of all those pieces or parcels of land hereinafter described, (that is to say)—

First, All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement eight thousand six hundred and seventy-eight (8678) acres, more or less, situate in the Interior district, being portion of run originally numbered 386, and now known as run numbered one (1), bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of "One-mile Creek," thence along that creek to its

source, thence by a line in a northerly direction to the watershed, thence along the watershed to Ben Lomond Peak, thence along the watershed in a northerly direction to the junction of Moonlight Creek with Moke Creek, thence along Moonlight Creek to the Shotover River, thence along the Shotover River to the western boundary of block II, Shotover District, thence along the western boundary of the said block to block I, thence along the western boundary of the said block I. to the township of Frankton, thence along the northern boundary of Frankton to the Wakatip Lake, thence along the Wakatip Lake to Queenstown, thence round the northern boundary of Queenstown and along the Wakatip Lake to One-mile Creek, the starting point.

Second, All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement seventeen thousand and eighteen (17,018) acres, more or less, situate in the Interior district, being portion of run originally numbered 356, and now known as run numbered ten (10), bounded by the Shotover River from the bridge near Arthur's Point to Deep Creek, thence along Deep Creek to its source, thence by a straight line to the Coronet, thence by a line to the source of Bush Creek, thence along Bush Creek to the foot of the range near Arrowtown, thence by a line in a westerly direction along the foot of the range to the bridge near Arthur's Point.

Third, All that area in the Province of Otago containing by admeasurement nineteen thousand four hundred and eight (19,408) acres, more or less, situate in the Interior District, being portion of Run originally numbered 340, and now known as Run numbered eleven (11), bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the Swift Burn with the Arrow River, thence along the Arrow River to the eastern boundary of block VIII, Shotover District, thence by a line due north to the northern boundary of block X, Shotover District, thence along the northern boundary of the said block X to the Arrow River, thence along the Arrow River and Soho Creek to the dividing range between Soho Creek and the south branch of the Motatapu River, thence along the watershed of the

Cardrona River and Solo Creek in a southerly direction to the Peak, thence by a straight line to the source of the nearest tributary to the Cardrona River in a north-easterly direction, thence along that tributary to its junction with the Cardrona River, thence along the Cardrona River to its source, thence by a line to the source of the Swift Burn, and along that stream to its junction with the Arrow River, the starting point.

Fourth, All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement seven thousand six hundred (7600) acres, more or less, situate in the Interior District, being portion of Run originally numbered 340, and now known as Run numbered thirteen (13), bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the Arrow River with the Kawarau River, thence along that river to the Swift Burn, thence along the Swift Burn to its source; thence by a line to the source of the Cardrona River, thence along the Cardrona River to Boundary Creek, thence along Boundary Creek to its source, thence by a line over Quartz Knoll and Rock Peak to the Kawarau River, thence along the Kawarau River to the Arrow River, the starting point.

Regulations for Supplementing Local Road Boards, &c.

THE following Regulations for supplementing Local Road Boards and Works carried out by Private Subscriptions and Rates, having been approved by the General Road Board, are now published for general information:—

1. Any Local Board desirous of availing itself of the money or subsidy voted by the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago must give notice in writing to that effect to the Superintendent of the said Province, and state approximately the amount it is estimated will be raised.

2. The money or subsidy allowed to any such Local Road Board will be at the rate of two pounds for every one pound raised by a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound or one shilling an acre.

3. Upon the Treasurer of any Local Board, or other authorised person, paying from time to time to the Provincial Treasury of Otago the amounts raised by rates by such Board, credit will be given for it, together with two pounds additional for every one pound paid in to the Road Board paying such money, but when rates are expended without being paid into the Treasury, credit will be given to the Local Board expending such money for a sum equal to two pounds for every one expended, upon satisfactory proof being afforded of such expenditure.

4. All payments will be made on vouchers signed by two members of the Local Board paying such money, and the same must be countersigned by the Treasurer of the Board.

5. Every payment into the said Treasury by a Local Board must be of a sum not less than twenty (20) pounds, and be accompanied by a statutory declaration that the money was raised by rates collected.

6. The Government shall have the right to examine all books, accounts, and other documents, of asking for verified copies or statements of the same, of inspecting works, and, if deemed necessary, of approving or disapproving of the same, but there will be no desire to interfere with the exercise of local control except when early necessary.

In all cases, returns of expenditure and of the works executed must be furnished to the said Government immediately after the completion of such works, or sooner, from time to time as the said Government may require.

Works carried out by subscription.

1. When it is desired to secure a subsidy to supplement local subscriptions for constructing any road or roads, a statement in writing must be laid before and approved by the Superintendent of Otago of the proposed work, together with an approximate estimate of the outlay required; and the advantages likely to arise from the work.

2. When the road or roads proposed is or are situated within a Road District, such statement must be forwarded to the said Superintendent through the Local Board of such district.

3. The Government will, without unnecessary delay, decide whether it is prepared to assist in carrying out such work, and, if willing, to what extent it will grant two pounds for every one pound subscribed.

Upon such last mentioned sum being paid into the said Treasury, or sufficient security given for the same to the satisfaction of the Government, credit will be given for it, together with two pounds additional for every one pound paid in or for which such security is given.

4. Payments will be made as the work progresses, and the Government will, if deemed advisable, lend the assistance of its own officers to inspect such work, and if it considers it necessary shall have the power of inspecting. The conditions of the sixth clause hereinbefore contained, as far as the circumstances admit, are applicable to this clause.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the twelfth day of January, 1867.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Marine Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted; that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make such regulations as may be found necessary respecting the anchoring and mooring of vessels.

in any port, the packing, landing, deposit, and removal of gunpowder, the erection of magazines for the safe keeping thereof, the watering and ballasting and discharging of ballast of or from vessels, and other matters relating to the safe and commodious navigation of any port, harbour, or river, or the entrance thereto, and the order and management of vessels, resorting thereto; and for the purpose of giving effect to such regulations to impose any penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for any one offence against any provisions of such regulations:

Now therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following regulations, that is to say,—

That the flag to be carried by any vessel from other than New Zealand ports when entering any port in New Zealand, until boarded and cleared by the Health Officer, shall be No. 8 of Marryatt's Code of Signals at the main.

That the flag to be carried by any vessel in any port in New Zealand which has gunpowder on board in excess of the usual ships' stores until such gunpowder be landed or transhipped, shall be a red flag at the main.

That the flag to be carried by any vessel employed in carrying Her Majesty's Mails, when entering any port in New Zealand, shall be Marryatt's telegraph flag at the main.

And I do further declare that the master of any vessel failing to comply with these regulations, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten pounds for each and every offence. And I do further declare that all existing regulations inconsistent herewith are hereby revoked.

This order in Council shall take effect from and after the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.
