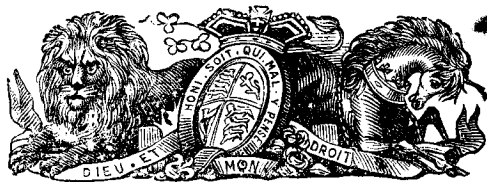

PROCLAMATION

Rescinding Proclamations of 17th October and 26th November, 1866, and Declaring a certain Portion of the Province of Otago an Infected District under the provisions of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in me in that behalf, I did by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the Province of Otago, bearing date the seventeenth day of October, 1866, proclaim and declare that from and after the day of the date thereof the territory therein mentioned should be deemed an Infected District within the meaning and for the purposes of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861." And whereas by virtue of the powers so delegated and invested as aforesaid, I did by another Proclamation in the said *Gazette*, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of November, 1866, proclaim and declare that from and after the nineteenth day of December then next, the limits and boundaries therein described should be the limits and boundaries of the said Infected District, and that the said Infected District should include the territory therein mentioned, which territory should be deemed an Infected District within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act. And whereas it is expedient to rescind the said Proclamations of the seventeenth day of October and the twenty-sixth day of November, 1866, and to proclaim and declare the lands hereinafter described to be an Infected District within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act. Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby proclaim and declare that I do hereby rescind the said Proclamations of the seventeenth day of October and the twenty-sixth day of November, 1866, and I do hereby further proclaim and declare that from and after the *sixth day of March* next the territory hereinafter described shall be deemed an Infected District within the meaning and for the purposes of the

said "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," that is to say:—

All that area within the Province of Otago, bounded towards the north by the Province of Canterbury from Awarua Bay to the eastern shore of the Wanaka Lake, thence by the said eastern shore of the Wanaka Lake and the Clutha River to the Dunstan Mountains, thence by the Dunstan Mountains to Mount St. Bathans, thence by the Hawkdun Mountains, the Kakanui Mountains, and the Horse Ranges to the Ocean, thence towards the east by the Ocean to the Clutha River, thence in a northerly direction along the Clutha River to *Scrubburn*, thence due west across the Clutha River, thence by the watershed of Black Cleughburn to the Tapanui Ranges, thence to Rankleburn at its source, and by Rankleburn Pomahaka, and Waipahi Rivers, to the southern boundary line of Run numbered 167, thence by the said southern boundary line to the Waikaka Stream, and by the Waikaka Stream to the Mataura River, and by the Mataura River and the northern boundary line of the Province of Southland to the Manipori Lake, thence by the Waiau River to the Ocean, and thence towards the west and south by the Ocean to Awarua Bay, the starting point.

PROCLAMATION

Of Regulations for the Depasturing of Stock upon certain Lands within the proclaimed "Otago Gold Field," and of the Appointment of Wardens.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

I, THOMAS DICK, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of

the power and authority delegated to and vested in me in this behalf, make, proclaim, and declare the regulations aftermentioned for the Depasturing of Stock upon Lands within the proclaimed "Otago Gold Field," over which no Pastoral Lease or License exists, or the licenses for which have been cancelled or suspended, namely, upon the Gold Field Reserves within the Districts of Manuherikia, Clyde, Arrow, Upper Shotover, Waitahuna, and Queenstown, in the said Province, that is to say:—

1. Every holder of a miner's right or of a business license shall be entitled to run two head of great cattle or horses free of charge.

2. All other cattle running in the before-mentioned lands shall be assessed and paid for half-yearly, and paid for at the following rates, namely:—

For every head of great cattle... 1s. 3d.

For every head of small cattle... 3d.

The words "great cattle" shall be construed to mean horned cattle, horses, mules, and asses, male and female, with their weaned offspring above six months of age; and the words "small cattle" shall be construed to mean sheep and goats, male and female, with their weaned offspring.

3. Every person desirous of running cattle on the said Lands shall first deposit with the Warden of the District an application in writing for a Depasturing License, which license the Warden is hereby authorised to grant in the form hereinafter mentioned; and every person depositing any such application shall pay therewith a fee of 2s. 6d.

4. Any person infringing these regulations by depasturing cattle on the before-mentioned lands without a license, or depasturing cattle in excess of the number for which any such license has been issued, will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten Shillings per head for every head of cattle so depastured, as provided by Section XV. of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866."

5. A list of the Depasturing Licenses issued, and of the names of the licensees, with the quantity and description of stock which each person is authorised to depasture, shall be posted in the Warden's office, so that it can be inspected at any time by the public.

6. Any person depasturing swine on the before-mentioned lands without a license will be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for the first offence, and twenty pounds for any second or subsequent offence.

PROCLAMATION,

Exempting Certain Districts from the Regulations for Depasturing Stock in the Province of Otago. Proclaimed and Declared in the Proclamation of even date herewith.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS I, Thomas Dick, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, did, upon the day of the date hereof, by Proclamation in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority delegated to and vested in me in that behalf, make, proclaim, and declare the Regulations in the said Proclamation contained for the depasturing of Stock upon land within the proclaimed Otago Gold Field; And whereas it is expedient to exempt the Districts aftermentioned from the said Regulations;—Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, as such Superintendent as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date hereof, the Districts hereinafter mentioned (that is to say)

Arrow,
Cardrona,
Queenstown, and
Shotover,

in the Province of Otago, shall be exempt from the said Regulations made and published as aforesaid, with the exception of all those pieces or parcels of land hereinafter described, (that is to say)—

First, All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement eight thousand six hundred and seventy-eight (8678) acres, more or less, situate in the Interior district, being portion of Run originally numbered 386, and now known as Run numbered one (1), bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of "One-mile Creek," thence along that creek to its source, thence by a line in a northerly direction to the watershed, thence along the watershed to Ben Lomond Peak, thence along the watershed in a northerly direction to the junction of Moonlight Creek with Moke Creek, thence along Moonlight Creek to the Shotover River, thence along the Shotover River to the western boundary of block II, Shotover District, thence along the western boundary of the said block to block I, thence along the western boundary of the said block I. to the township of Frankton, thence along the northern boundary of Frankton to the Wakatip Lake, thence along the Wakatip Lake to Queenstown, thence round the northern boundary of Queenstown and along the Wakatip Lake to One-mile Creek, the starting point.

Second, All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement seventeen thousand and eighteen (17,018) acres, more or less, situate in the Interior district, being portion of Run originally numbered 356, and now known as Run numbered ten (10), bounded by the Shotover River from the bridge near Arthur's Point to Deep Creek, thence along Deep Creek to its source, thence by a straight line to the Coronet, thence by a line to the source of Bush Creek, thence along Bush Creek to the foot of the range near Arrowtown, thence by a line in a westerly direction along the foot of the range to the bridge near Arthur's Point.

Third, All that area in the Province of Otago containing by admeasurement nineteen thousand four hundred and eight (19,408) acres, more or less, situate in the Interior District, being portion of Run originally numbered 340, and now known as Run numbered eleven (11), bounded by a line commencing at the

junction of the Swift Burn with the Arrow River, thence along the Arrow River to the eastern boundary of block VIII, Shotover District, thence by a line due north to the northern boundary of block X, Shotover District, thence along the northern boundary of the said block X to the Arrow River, thence along the Arrow River and Soho Creek to the dividing range between Soho Creek and the south branch of the Motatapu River, thence along the watershed of the Cardrona River and Soho Creek in a southerly direction to the Peak, thence by a straight line to the source of the nearest tributary to the Cardrona River in a north-easterly direction, thence along that tributary to its junction with the Cardrona River, thence along the Cardrona River to its source, thence by a line to the source of the Swift Burn, and along that stream to its junction with the Arrow River, the starting point.

Fourth, All that area situate in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement twenty-one thousand five hundred acres more or less, situate in the Interior District, being portions of Runs originally numbered 386, 356, and 340 respectively, and now known as Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10, Shotover Survey District, and Waste Lands of the Crown, adjoining the said Blocks 4, 5, 6, and 7, Shotover District aforesaid, bounded towards the north by Runs numbered respectively 10 and 11, towards the east by Runs numbered respectively 11 and 13, towards the south by the Kawarau River, and towards the west by Runs numbered respectively 1 and 10, as before described.

PROCLAMATION

Varying and altering the Licensing Districts under the Licensing Ordinance, 1865.

By His Honor THOMAS DICK, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS it is expedient to vary and alter the Licensing Districts of the Province of Otago:

Now therefore I, Thomas Dick, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf under and by virtue of the eleventh section of the "Licensing Ordinance, 1865," do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the day of the date hereof and until further notice, there shall be within the Province of Otago fifteen Licensing Districts, to be called respectively as follows:—

1. Clyde Licensing District
2. Queenstown Licensing District
3. Oamaru Licensing District
4. Waikouaiti Licensing District
5. Dunedin Licensing District
6. Port Chalmers Licensing District
7. Taieri Licensing District
8. Tokomairiro Licensing District
9. Clutha Licensing District
10. Naseby Licensing District
11. Lawrence Licensing District
12. Saint Bathans Licensing District
13. Mount Benger Licensing District
14. Cromwell Licensing District
15. Arrow Licensing District

And I do hereby proclaim and declare that the said several Districts shall be respectively bounded and defined in manner following, (that is to say),—

1. *Clyde Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise the townships of Alexandra and Clyde, and all that area

bounded by a line proceeding from South Roughridge Hill to Cairn Hill; thence over the Obelisk to a point due south of the Carrick Mountains; thence to and along the Carrick Mountains to the Kawarau River; thence along the Kawarau River in an easterly direction to Bannockburn at its junction; thence to and along the northern boundary of Run numbered 325 to the Clutha River; thence along the Clutha River to Leaning Rock Creek; thence by Leaning Rock Creek to Leaning Rock Hill; thence to Chattoburn at its source, and by Chattoburn to the Manuherikia River; and thence in a direct line to South Roughridge Hill, the starting point.

2. *Queenstown Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise the townships of Kingston, Queenstown, and Frankton, and all that area bounded on the south-western corner of Run 193 by the Province of Southland to Eyre Peak; thence by the western and northern watersheds of the Wakatip Lake to Fox Peak; thence by the eastern watershed of the Shotover River to the Kawarau River; thence by the Kawarau River to the western boundary of the Clyde Licensing District; thence by the said western boundary of Clyde Licensing District to the Garvie Mountains; thence to Remarkable Gap; thence by the ranges to the Wakaia River; thence by Wakaia River and White Coombe Creek to White Coombe; thence by the Umbrella Mountains to the Black Umbrella Mountain; thence by the eastern boundaries of Runs numbered 254 and 193, and the southern boundary of Run 193, to the starting point.

3. *Oamaru Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by a line proceeding from Mount Ida along the west branch of the Otamatakau Stream to the Waitaki River; towards the east by the Province of Canterbury; towards the south by the Ocean; and towards the west by the Horse Ranges and Kakanui Mountains to Kyeburn Hill; thence by the ranges to Mount Ida, the starting point.

4. *Waikouaiti Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the south by a line proceeding from Brinn's Point due west to the Silver Peak Hills; thence proceeding in a northerly direction to the ranges north of Deepdell Creek; thence in a north-easterly direction to Highlay Hill; thence due east to the Oamaru Licensing District; thence by the western boundary of the said Oamaru Licensing District to the Ocean, and by the Ocean to the starting point.

5. *Dunedin Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by Waikouaiti and Port Chalmers Licensing Districts; towards the east by the Port Chalmers Licensing District and the Ocean; towards the south by the Ocean; and towards the west by the Taieri River and the boundary of the Gold Fields.

6. *Port Chalmers Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area including the Town of Port Chalmers, the Lower Harbour West Survey District, the Sawyer's Bay Survey District, Sections numbered 88 to 115 inclusive, North-east Valley Survey District, and Blocks 4, 5, 6, and part of 7, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District: bounded from the north-west corner of Block 4, North Harbor and

Blueskin Survey District in a southerly direction by the western boundary line of the said Block 4, to the northern boundary line of Block 6, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District; thence by the said northern boundary line of the said Block 6, and the northern boundary line of Block 7, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District, to the Main North Road; thence by the Main North Road to the northern boundary line of the North-east Valley Survey District; thence in a westerly direction by the said northern boundary line of the North-east Valley District to a road line between Sections 87 and 89 of the said district; thence by the said road line continued between Sections 86 and 88, North-east Valley District, to the northern boundary line of Block 9, North Harbor and Blueskin Survey District; thence in an easterly direction by the said northern boundary line of the said Block 9, to the north-west corner of Section 33, Sawyer's Bay Survey District; thence in a south-easterly direction by the boundary line of the said Sawyer's Bay Survey District to Otago Harbor; and thence by high-water mark to the starting point.

7. *Taiari Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of this Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by a line proceeding from the western watershed of the Upper Taiari River due east through Rock and Pillar Mountain to the Waikouaiti Licensing District; towards the east by the Waikouaiti and Dunedin Licensing Districts; towards the south by the Taiari River, Waihola Lake, and Meggat Burn to the boundary of the Hundreds; thence towards the west by the Lawrence and Mount Benger Licensing Districts.
8. *Tokomairiro Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the west by the Clutha Licensing District; towards the north by the Lawrence and Taiari Licensing Districts; and towards the east and south by the Dunedin Licensing District and the Ocean.
9. *Clutha Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by the Queenstown and Mount Benger Districts; towards the east by the Lawrence Licensing District, Lovell's Creek, the Tuakitoto Lake, Kaitangata Lake and Creek, and the Clutha River; towards the south by the Ocean; and towards the west by the Province of Southland.
10. *Naseby Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north and east by the Oamaru Licensing District; towards the south by the Waikouaiti and Taiari Licensing Districts; towards the west by the Mount Benger Licensing District to South Roughridge Hill; thence by the Roughridge to Mount Ida.
11. *Lawrence Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded by a line proceeding from the Clutha River along Fruid Burn to the Lammerlaw; thence by the eastern watershed of the Waipori River to the boundary of the Hundreds; thence by the boundary of the Gold Field to a point due east of Spylaw Burn; and thence in an easterly direction in a direct line to Fruid Burn at its junction with the Clutha River.
12. *St. Bathans Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded by a line proceeding from Mount St. Bathans due east to the Hawkdun Mountains; thence along the Hawkdun

Mountains to Mount Ida; thence along the western boundary of the Naseby Licensing District to South Roughridge Hill; thence in a north-westerly direction along the boundary of Clyde Licensing District to the Dunstan Mountains; thence in a north-easterly direction along the Dunstan Mountains to Mount St. Bathans, the starting point.

13. *Mount Benger Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by the Clyde Licensing District; towards the east by the ranges from South Roughridge Hill to the Lammerlaw; towards the south by the Lawrence Licensing District, the Spylaw Burn, and Parasol Creek; and towards the east by the Queenstown Licensing District.
14. *Cromwell Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north by the Province of Canterbury; towards the east by the Province of Canterbury and the Oamaru Licensing District; towards the south by the Clyde and St. Bathans Licensing Districts; and towards the west by the Arrow and Queenstown Licensing Districts, and a line from Fox Peak along the east branch of the Matukituki River to the Province of Canterbury.
15. *Arrow Licensing District* shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, comprise all that area bounded towards the north and east by a line proceeding from Mount Hyde to Mount Alpha; thence over Little Cruffel to Mount Pisa; thence along the ranges to Kirtleburn by its southern feeder; thence to Kawarau River; and towards the south and west by the Queenstown Licensing District.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

A Lighthouse has been erected on the Bluff at the south side of the entrance of Port Natal, at an elevation of 292 feet above high water, a light from which will be exhibited on the 23rd January, 1867.

The Lighthouse is in latitude 29° 52' 50" S., and longitude 31° 3' 35" E.

The building is an iron tower, in the form of a frustum of a cone, 81 feet high, painted white; centre of light being 70 feet above the base, exhibiting a revolving white light of the second class (dioptric), attaining its greatest brilliancy once every minute.

It is visible in all directions from North (round by East and South) to S. 59° W.; and can be seen from a ship's deck 24 miles in clear weather.

The above light is not visible from the Aliwal Shoal, which is 25 miles S., 53° W., from the Lighthouse; vessels should not, therefore, when coming from the southward and westward, approach the shore nearer than 4 miles, or shoal their water under 40 fathoms, using the lead freely until they make the light well out from the deck, when they may stand in until it bears N. 59° E.,—which bearing will keep them outside all known danger—until they are abreast of the Umlazi River (about 9½ miles below the Lighthouse), when they must keep it more to the northward, as the land trends more to the eastward, giving the shore a good berth of a mile, and when the light bears about E.N.E., they can haul in to the northward for the anchorage, anchoring in 8½ to 10 fathoms, with the Lighthouse bearing S.W. to S.W. half S., distant 1 mile.

CATTLE RETURNS.—The following Clause of the "Cattle Ordinance, 1864," is published for general information:—

"15. Every Owner of Cattle shall, in the month of February in each year, deliver in writing to the Registrar of the District in which the Cattle shall be depasturing, or be, a Return of the Cattle above three months old owned by him, or under his charge within such District, and shall append thereto a declaration that such Return is true to the best of his belief; and every such person neglecting to make such Return and Declaration shall forfeit and pay a penalty of not under Ten or not more than Fifty Pounds, and the Return and Declaration shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed."

Schedules may be obtained from the Registrar in Dunedin, or from the Deputy Registrars at the under-mentioned Police Stations.
