Regulations for Supplementing Local Road Boards, &c.

THE following Regulations for supplementing Local Road Boards and Works carried out by Private Subscriptions and Rates, having been approved by the General Road Board, are now published for general information:—

1. Any Local Board desirous of availing itself of the money or subsidy voted by the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago must give notice in writing to that effect to the Superintendent of the said Province, and state approximately the amount it is estimated will be raised.

2. The money or subsidy allowed to any such Local Road Board will be at the rate of two pounds for every one pound raised by a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound or one shilling an acre.

3. Upon the Treasurer of any Local Board, or other authorised person, paying from time to time to the Provincial Treasury of Otago the amounts raised by rates by such Board, credit will be given for it, together with two pounds additional for every one pound paid in to the Road Board paying such money, but when rates are expended without being paid into the Treasury, credit will be given to the Local Board expending such money for a sum equal to two pounds for every one expended, upon satisfactory proof being afforded of such expenditure.

4. All payments will be made on vouchers signed by two members of the Local Board paying such money, and the same must be countersigned by the Treasurer of the Board.

5. Every payment into the said Treasury by a Local Board must be of a sum not less than twenty (20) pounds, and be accompanied by a statutory declaration that the money was raised by rates collected.

6. The Government shall have the right to examine all books, accounts, and other documents, of asking for verified copies or statements of the same, of inspecting works, and, if deemed necessary, of approving or disapproving of the same, but there will be no desire to interfere with the exercise of local control except when eally necessary.

In all cases, returns of expenditure and of the works executed must be furnished to the said Government immediately after the completion of such works, or sooner, from time to time as the said Government may require.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Waste Land Board of Otago have resolved, with the sanction of the Superintendent and Provincial Council, to sell by auction, under the powers conferred by clause 35 of the "Otago Waste Lands Act, 1866," the unsold surveyed lands within the Hundreds of Dunedin, East and West Taieri, Waihola, North and South Tokomairiro, and East and West Clutha, at the upset price of 10s. per acre.

There are about 100 allotments in the Dunedin Hundred, containing from 7 to 90 acres.

THE following Clauses of "The Crown Land Sales Extortion Prevention Act" are published for general information:—

II. Every person who shall directly or indirectly offer or propose to accept or receive money or other valuable consideration as an inducement to abstain from bidding or competing as a purchaser or intending purchaser of land belonging to the Crown advertised for sale by public auction and whether or not the same land shall actually be put up for sale or otherwise shall be deemed to be guilty of a misdemeanour and be liable on conviction thereof to be imprisoned for any period not exceeding twelve calendar months and with or without hard labor or to be fined any sum not exceeding two hundred pounds sterling.

III. Every person who shall actually receive money or other valuable consideration for abstaining to bid or compete for the purchase of any Crown Lands which shall have been advertised for sale by public auction and whether or not the same land shall be put up for sale by public auction shall be deemed to have been guilty of a misdemeanour and shall on conviction thereof be liable to be imprisoned with or without hard labor for any period not exceeding two years or fined any sum not exceeding five hundred pounds.

IV. Every person from whom money or other valuable consideration shall have been extorted by the means aforesaid may recover the amount or value of the consideration so extorted in an action for money had and received.

V. It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands in any Province of the Colony or any other person conducting any sale by public auction of Waste Lands of the Crown or any person attending any such

sale to require that a declaration in the form of the Schedule to this Act appended shall be made and signed by any person desiring to bid or bidding at such sale and no bid from any such person shall be received until he shall have made and signed such declaration.

VIII. Any Commissioner of Crown Lands or other person connected with the administration of any of the Waste Lands of the Colony who shall cause or attempt to cause or knowingly permit any person to apply for the purchase of any portion of the Waste Lands of the Crown such applicant not being a *bona fide* intending purchaser or who shall knowingly countenance or permit any collusion or arrangement between intending purchasers of land having for its object to preclude or supersede the necessity of *bona fide* competition at any such auction sale as aforesaid shall on conviction thereof be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds and shall for ever thereafter be rendered incapable of holding any office or employment under the Crown.

OTAGO GOLD FIELD.—Boundaries as proclaimed in *Gazette*, January 30:—

That is to say, all that area comprising four millions eight hundred and eight thousand acres, more or less, situate in the Province of Otago, bounded by a line proceeding from Eyre Peak along the western and northern watershed of the Wakatipu Lake to Fox Peak, thence over Black Peak and Treble Cone and along the watershed east of the Shotover and Arrow rivers, and over Cardrona Mount to the Cardrona river at the junction of boundary creek, thence by boundary creek to its source, thence to and along Kirtleburn to its first feeder, thence to Parkburn at its source, thence along Parkburn to the Clutha river, thence by the Clutha river to Lindisburn, and along Lindisburn to the junction of the Cluden stream, thence by the ranges north of the said Cluden stream through the Dunstan Pass to Mount St. Bathans, thence to the Hawkdun Mountains, and by the Hawkdun Mountains to Mount Ida, thence to Kyeburn Hill, thence along the Kakanui Mountains and the north-eastern boundaries of Runs numbered respectively 255 and 109 to Mount Fortune, thence along the south-eastern boundary of Run 109 to the watershed between the Taieri and Waikouaiti rivers, thence by the Silver Peak Hills to Silver Stream, and by Silver Stream to the northern boundary line of the East Taieri Hundred, thence along the said boundary line to the eastern boundary of Block II, Dunedin and East Taieri District, thence by the said eastern boundary to the road line forming the southern boundary of sections numbered respectively 21, 22, 25, 6, 7, and 8, Block II aforesaid, thence along the said road line to the Taieri river, and by the said river to the Dunstan road, thence by the said Dunstan road and the southern boundary of the township of Outram to the boundary of the Hundreds, thence by the boundary of the Hundreds to the Tokomairiro river, thence by the said Tokomairiro river until it intersects a direct line from Trig. Station F to Trig. Station E Table Hill District, thence to Trig. Station E aforesaid, thence to Trig. Station D, thence to Trig. Station C, thence to Trig. Station K, all in the Table Hill District aforesaid, thence to Trig. Station L, thence to Trig. Station W, both in Tokomairiro Survey District, thence to Trig. Station V, Hillend District, thence in a direct line towards Trig. Station Z in the same District to the boundary of the Hundreds, thence in a south-westerly direction to Lovell's Creek, thence by Lovell's Creek to the boundary of Run numbered 54, thence by the boundary of

the said Run to a point situated north-east of the source of the Crook Burn, thence by a south-westerly line to the source of Crook Burn, thence by Crook Burn to its junction with the Clutha River, thence by the Clutha River to Scrub Burn, thence to a point opposite Scrub Burn, twenty chains distant from the west bank of the Clutha River, thence in a northerly direction and parallel to the Clutha River to Black Cleugh Burn, thence by Black Cleugh Burn and the Tapanui Ranges to a point due east of Spylaw Burn at its source, thence to and along Spylaw Burn, the Pomahaka River, and Parasol Creek, to the Black Umbrella Mountain, thence by the watershed of the Wakaia River to the south boundary of Run numbered 193, thence due west to the Mataura River, and by the Mataura River to the Eyre Peak, the starting point.
