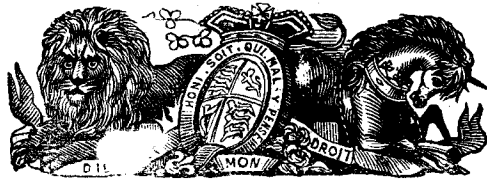

## PROCLAMATION.

### *Road District of West Harbor formed.*

By His Honor THOMAS FRASER, Esquire, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**W**HEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that, until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one districts which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided, that it should be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts by forming and naming new districts.

And whereas it is expedient to form a new Road District, to be named the West Harbor Road District:—Now therefore I, Thomas Fraser, Esq., Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area bounded as described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from the day of the date hereof, be constituted a Road District, and shall be named the West Harbor Road District.

### SCHEDULE.

The *West Harbor Road District* shall comprise all that area commencing at N.W. angle of Section 51, Block IX, North Harbor and Blueskin, and bounded on the North by Sections 50, 30, 29, 28, 27, 31, 32, 39, 37, said Block IX; thence on the West by Section 36, said Block IX, and Section 82, North East Valley, to the Main Road to Port Chalmers; thence on the North by said road to Port Chalmers Town Belt; on the East by said Town Belt to Sawyers' Bay; thence on the South by the Otago Harbor to the Dunedin

Town Belt; thence on the West by said Dunedin Town Belt to point of commencement.

## PROCLAMATION.

### *Road District of Akatore formed.*

By His Honor THOMAS FRAZER, Esquire, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**W**HEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that, until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one districts which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts by forming and naming new districts.

And whereas it is expedient to form a new Road District, to be named the Akatore Road District;—Now therefore I, Thomas Frazer, Esquire, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area bounded as described in the Schedule hereto shall, from the day of the date hereof, be constituted a Road District, and shall be named the Akatore Road District.

## SCHEDULE.

*Akatore Road District* shall comprise all that area commencing at the mouth of the Akatore River and bounded on the east and south-east by the ocean to Koaura or Shag Creek; thence by said creek to the northern boundary of Block V, Akatore Survey District; on the north by a portion of said boundary of Block V; thence on the west by the eastern boundary of Block IX, and a continuation of that line to a point of intersection in line drawn from Trig. Station F, Block III, Akatore Survey District, to Trig. Station I, in Block VIII, said Survey District; thence on the north by portion of said Block VIII, and by Block VI, Clarendon, to the Ocean.

*Boundaries of Maungatua (late Waipori) Road District altered and enlarged, and the boundaries of West Taieri Road District altered and diminished.*

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one Districts, which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such Districts: and whereas it is expedient to alter and enlarge the boundaries of the Maungatua (late Waipori) Road District, and to alter and diminish the boundaries of the West Taieri Road District in manner and as described in Schedule hereto:—Now therefore I, Thomas Fraser, Esquire, Deputy Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Maungatua (late Waipori) and West Taieri Road Districts shall, from the day of the date thereof, be so altered as described in the Schedule hereto.

## SCHEDULE.

*Maungatua (late Waipori) Road District* shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west by the boundary of Hundred; on the south and south-west by the Waipori River; on the south-east by Blocks VI, V, IV, and III, Maungatua Survey District, to the western corner of Section 4, Block II, Taieri Survey District; thence on the north-east by Section 11, Block II, and Section 5, Block VI, Taieri Survey District; thence on the north by Sections 11, 10, 9, 8, and 7, Block VI, Taieri Survey District; thence on the north-east by the centre line of the Block road between Blocks V and VI, and Sections 16 and 17, Irregular Block, Taieri Survey District; thence following the southern boundary of Applications 2175 and 2176 to the Main Road into the interior; thence on the east by the said Main Road to the boundary of the Hundred.

*West Taieri Road District* shall comprise all that area bounded on the north-west by the boundary of the Hundred, on the east by the Taieri River to the east corner of Block IV, Maungatua Survey District; on the south-west by said Block IV to Section numbered

38, Irregular Block, Taieri Survey District; thence along the western boundary of Block III, Maungatua Survey District, to the north-eastern boundary of Maungatua (late Waipori) Road District, on Section 12, Block II, Taieri Survey District; thence following the boundary line of said Road District to the boundary of the Hundred.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is provided that there shall be within the Colony, Courts of Record to be called District Courts, and the Governor is empowered by proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, districts within which such Courts shall be respectively held, and from time to time, by notification in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to fix the times and places within the district at which every such Court shall be held.

And whereas by a proclamation bearing date the eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, a district was constituted in the Province of Otago within which a District Court should be held under the said "District Courts Act, 1858," to be designated "The District Court of the Otago Gold Fields." And whereas by a Warrant under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, bearing date the tenth day of January last past, certain times and places were fixed and appointed for holding sittings of the said Court; and whereas by a proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of April last past, certain additional sittings of the said Court were appointed to be held, and whereas it is expedient that there should be further sittings of the said Court within the said Province:

Now therefore I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority in me vested for this purpose fix and appoint that sittings of the said District Court, additional to those already appointed, shall be held as follows:—

In the Resident Magistrate's Court at Lawrence: On the second Tuesday in October, and the second Tuesday in December;

In the Resident Magistrate's Court at Naseby: On the second Wednesday in November, and the second Wednesday in January;

In the Resident Magistrate's Court at Clyde: On the Monday next after the second Wednesday in November, and the Monday next after the second Wednesday in January;

In the Resident Magistrate's Court at Queenstown: On the Monday second after the second Wednesday in November, and the Monday second after the second Wednesday in January; in every year, or as soon as conveniently may be after such days respectively.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Imperial Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted, that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by the Superintendent, as in the said Act provided, the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor, at any time within three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him, to declare by proclamation his disallowance of such Bill; and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the

day of the date of such proclamation, or any subsequent day to be named therein.

And whereas the Ordinances hereafter specified have been enacted by the Superintendent of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, and the said Ordinances were received by the Governor on the eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven :

And whereas it is expedient that the said Ordinances should be disallowed :

Now therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby proclaim and declare my disallowance of the following Ordinances passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, namely :—

“The Administration of Justice Ordinance, 1867.”

“The Provincial Wardens Courts Jurisdiction Extension Ordinance, 1867.”

“The Fencing Ordinance, 1867.”
