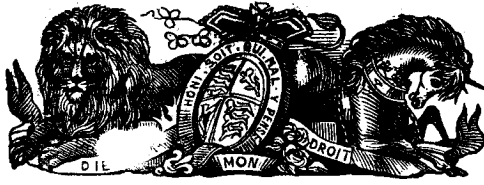

PROCLAMATION.

Road District of Caversham altered and extended, and the Road District of Anderson's Bay altered and diminished.

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that, until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one Districts which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it should be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of such districts by forming and naming new districts:

And whereas it is expedient to alter and enlarge the Road District of Caversham, and to alter and diminish the Road District of Anderson's Bay:

Now therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area bounded as described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from the day of the date hereof, be the Caversham and Anderson's Bay Road Districts.

SCHEDULE.

Caversham Road District shall comprise all that area commencing at the North-west angle of Section 42, Lower Kaikorai Survey District, and bounded on the North by Sections 46, 58, 59, 63, 64, 65 and 99, Block VI, and Section 4, Block VII, Town District, and the Main South Road to Cemetery Reserve; thence by portion of Cemetery Reserve to Section 11, Block VII, Town District; thence on North by said Section 11,

to the Main Road to Anderson's Bay; thence on the East by said road to the North angle of Section 69, said Block VII; thence on the East by Sections 69 and 82, said Block VII, and that line continued to the Ocean Beach; thence on the South by the Ocean Beach to road line continued from Section 32, Ocean Beach District; on the West by said road line and part Section 77, Ocean Beach District; North by Section 23; thence on West by said Section 23, 22 and 21, and a direct line from Northern angle of Section 21, Ocean Beach, to the South-west angle of Section 28, Town District; and thence by Section 28, Town District, to the Main South Road; thence on the North by Main South Road to Section 45, Lower Kaikorai Survey District; thence on West by said Section 45, to point of commencement.

Anderson's Bay Road District shall comprise all that area commencing at the Eastern angle of Section 45, Upper Harbor East Survey District, and bounded on the East by the continuation of the boundary line between Sections 44 and 45, to road line between Section 41, Block III, Tomahawk Survey District, and Section 24, Block I, Otago Peninsula Survey District; on the South-east by that road line to Section 22, Block VIII, Anderson's Bay Survey District; thence along North-eastern boundary of Sections 22, 21, 20, 19, 18 and 17, said Block VIII; thence along North-western boundary of said Section 17, and its continuation in the same direction to the Lagoon; thence by Lagoon to the Northern boundary of Block VII, Otago Peninsula Survey District; thence by said Northern boundary to the Eastern boundary of Caversham Road District; thence on the West by the Eastern boundary of said Road District to North-west angle of Section 10, Block VII, Town District; thence on the West by Section 11, on South-west by road line to Dunedin Town Belt, and by said Dunedin Town Belt to Otago Harbor; thence following beach line of said Otago Harbor in an Eastern direction to South-east angle of Section 13 (Quarry Reserve), Block V, Anderson's Bay Survey District; thence on the North and North-west by the South and South-eastern boundaries of the North-east Harbor

Road district to starting point at Eastern angle of Section 45, Upper Harbor East Survey District.

Road District of Windsor altered and enlarged.

And whereas it is expedient to alter and enlarge the Road District of Windsor:

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area bounded as described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from the day of the date hereof, be the Windsor Road District.

SCHEDULE.

Commencing at the Trig. Station, (Big Hill), situate on the boundary line between the Awamoka and Papakio Survey Districts, and bounded on the North by a straight line from the said Trig. Station to the South-east angle of Block VI, Awamoka Survey District; and thence by said Block VI; on the West by the western boundary of the Awamoka Survey District to the Kakanui River; on the South by the southern boundary of the said Awamoka Survey District; on the East by the boundary line between the Awamoka and Papakio Survey Districts to point of commencement.

and to increase the number of such districts by forming and naming new districts:

And whereas it is expedient to alter and enlarge the Road Districts of Coomb Hay and Tuakitoto:

Now therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area bounded as described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from the day of the date hereof, be the Coomb Hay and Tuakitoto Road Districts.

SCHEDULE.

Coomb Hay Road District shall comprise all that area bounded on the West by Sections 33, 32, 31, 30, 29, 28, 27, 26, 25 and 24, Block I, Kaitangata, and Sections 39, 38, 37, 36, 35 and 34, Block II, Kaitangata, and by road line forming portion of Western boundary of Block III, Kaitangata; thence on the South by the Northern boundary of the Wangaloa Road District to the Ocean; on the South-east by the Ocean to the Tokomairi River; and on the North-east by the Tokomairi River and Sections 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 Block XXVIII, Tokomairi Survey District.

Tuakitoto Road District shall comprise all that area bounded on the North-east by a direct line from Mount Misery to the North-east angle of Section 25, Block II, Kaitangata; thence by Section 24, and by a straight line from South-west angle of said Section, through Trig. Station H., to the North-east angle of Section 8, Block IV, North Tuakitoto; thence by Section 16, Block XXXVIII, Tokomairi, and Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, Block X, North Tuakitoto Survey District, to the Main South Road; on the North by the Main South Road; on the West by Lovell's Creek, Tuakitoto and Kaitangata Lakes to the North-west angle of Section 3, Block I, South Tuakitoto Survey District; thence on the South by the boundary line between Sections 3 and 4, said Block I, and that line continued to the Watershed; thence on the East by said Watershed to Two Stone Hill; thence on the South-east by straight line to Trig. Station J; thence on the East by the Western boundary of Coomb Hay Road District to Mount Misery.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-sixth day of November, 1867.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Steam Navigation Act, 1866," power is given to the Governor in Council to make Regulations whereby a sea-going certificate duly issued to any steam vessel by the lawfully constituted authorities of any British Colony shall be as valid and effectual for the purposes of the said Act as a similar certificate duly issued and in force under the provisions of the said Act: Provided that it shall be lawful for the Postmaster-General at any time to suspend the operation within New Zealand of any such certificate issued in any other British Colony:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth, by this order, make the Regulations following, that is to say—

Regulations.

A sea-going certificate duly issued to any steam vessel by the lawfully constituted authorities of the Colony of Victoria shall be as valid and effectual for the purposes of "The Steam Navigation Act, 1866," as a similar certificate duly issued and in force under the provisions of the said Act.

It shall be lawful for the Postmaster-General at any time to suspend the operation within New Zealand of any such certificate.

LETTERS PATENT and Letters of Registration in New Zealand.—The sections two to seven inclusive and section twenty of "The Patents Act, 1860," and the Supplementary Matters required in the Patents Office, are published for the information of persons desiring to obtain Letters Patent for inventions or improvements, or Letters of Registration for inventions or improvements already patented elsewhere.

SECTIONS OF "PATENTS ACT, 1860."

2. Any person being the originator or discoverer of any new invention or improvement for which no patent or instrument in the nature of letters patent has been issued or granted in New Zealand or any other country and being desirous of obtaining letters patent under this Act shall deposit with the Colonial Treasurer the sum of ten pounds and shall leave at the Office or in the custody of such person as the Governor may from time to time or for any particular case appoint a petition addressed to the Governor stating clearly and succinctly the object to be attained by his invention or discovery and praying that letters patent may be granted to him for the exclusive use thereof in the Colony.

3. The inventor shall deliver a written description or specification in duplicate of his invention or improvement and of the manner and process of compounding the same in such full clear and exact terms as to distinguish the same from all other things before known and to enable any person skilled in the art or science of which it is a branch or with which it is most nearly connected to make compound and use the same.

4. In the case of any machine he shall fully explain the principle and the several modes in which he has contemplated the application of that principle or character by which it may be distinguished from other inventions.

5. He shall accompany the whole with drawings and written references made in duplicate where the nature of the case admits of drawings or specimens of the ingredients or the composition of matter sufficient in quantity for the purpose of experiment.

6. The applicant for a patent shall furnish duplicate drawings wherever the case admits of drawings one of which shall be deposited in the office of the Colonial Secretary or other officer appointed in that behalf and the other shall be annexed to the patent and considered a part of the specification thereof and a copy of the specification shall be in all cases annexed to the patent.

7. Notice of the said application shall be inserted in the *Government Gazette* and in one newspaper published in the principal town of each Province in the Colony and requiring any person who may wish to prefer any objection to the granting of such letters patent to send within four months of the said publication to the office or address of such person so appointed as aforesaid a statement in writing setting forth the grounds of such

objection subscribed with his proper name and address.

20. No person shall receive a patent under this Act for an invention or discovery which has been previously patented in Great Britain or any other country but it shall be lawful for the Governor in his discretion on the application of any person being the holder or assignee of any patent granted in Great Britain or any other country for any new discovery or invention and upon such proof as the Governor may deem sufficient that such person is the *bona fide* holder or assignee of the said patent and that the same is in full force and upon payment to the Colonial Treasurer of the sum of ten pounds to grant letters of registration under the Seal of the Colony to the holder of such patent as aforesaid or his assignee and such letters of registration shall be deposited in the office of the Colonial Secretary and shall be deemed to be letters patent granted under this Act for such invention or improvement and shall have the same force and effect as letters patent granted thereunder and shall unless repealed by writ of *scire facias* or otherwise enure to the benefit of the holder during the continuance of the original patent in the country in which it was granted and no longer and all the provisions of this Act shall apply to such letters of registration in the same way *mutatis mutandis* and as fully as to letters patent granted under this Act.

SUPPLEMENTARY MATTERS REQUIRED

In respect of an application for Letters Patent.

A Statutory Declaration made by the applicant before a Justice of the Peace or Notary Public, that the statements contained in the petition are true, and that the applicant believes himself to be the originator or discoverer of the invention or improvement. Such declaration, if made out of the Colony, must be made before a person authorized to administer oaths, whose authority to do so must be certified by a Notary Public.

A copy of each Newspaper in which, under the seventh section of the Act, the applicant is to advertise notice of the application.

In respect of an application for Letters of registration under Section 20 of the Act.

Duplicate copies of original Patent and Specification, certified by a Notary Public.

Statutory declaration by a professional person, not the claimant, that he has searched the Registry of Patents of the Colony or Country in which the patent issued,—or that there is no such Registry,—and that such patent is, according to the laws of the colony or country, still in force, and not assigned or parted with.

Statutory declaration by applicant that he is the person named in the original Letters Patent, and the *bona fide* holder thereof; or (if claimed under assignment of Patent or Grant of Right), certified copy in duplicate of the Deed or Instrument of Assignment or Grant, with statutory declaration by Claimant annexed, made before a Notary Public, that he is the person named in the copy deed annexed, and that it is a true copy of the original deed.
