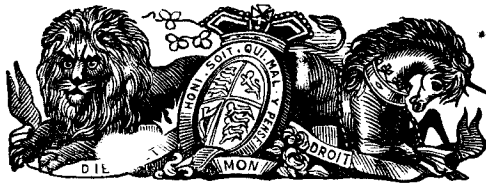

PROCLAMATION.

Road District of Waikouaiti formed, and the Road Districts of Merton and Clevedon diminished.

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance,

1865," it is amongst other things enacted that, until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one Districts which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it should be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of such districts by forming and naming new districts:

And whereas it is expedient to form the Road District of Waikouaiti, and to diminish the Road Districts of Merton and Clevedon:

Now therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the areas bounded as described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from the day of the date hereof, be the Waikouaiti, Merton and Clevedon Road Districts.

SCHEDULE.

The Waikouaiti Road District shall comprise all that area commencing at the south-east angle of section 14, block IV, Waikouaiti survey district; thence on the south and east by a road line through Trig. Station J to the north-west angle of section 33, block II, said survey district; thence on the east by sections 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, and 39, said block II; thence on the south by the southern boundary of section 40, said block II, and that line continued to the Waikouaiti River; thence on the west and north by the said Waikouaiti River to the north-east boundary line of section 14, said block IV; thence by said boundary line to point of commencement.

The Merton Road District shall comprise all that area commencing at the north-west angle of section 8ⁿ, block II, Waikouaiti survey district; thence on the north-west by a road line to the north-west angle of section 33, said block II; thence on the west by sections 41 and 40, said block II; thence on the south by

the southern boundary of said block II, and the southern boundary of sections 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, block III, said survey district, and the south-western boundary of sections 30 and 31, said block III, to the Ocean; thence by the Ocean to Maori Reserve; thence on the north-east and south-east by said Maori Reserve, to the north-east angle of section 1, said block III; thence on the north by southern boundary of block IV, said survey district, to point of commencement.

The Clevedon Road District shall comprise all that area commencing at the south-east angle of section 45, block IV, Waikouaiti survey district; thence on the east and north by the Maori Reserve and the Waikouaiti river, to the north-west angle of section 15, said block IV; thence on the south-west by section 14, said block IV; and thence on the north-west by the southern and eastern boundary of the Waikouaiti road district, to the south-west angle of section 34, said block IV; thence on the south by the southern boundary of said block IV, to point of commencement.

1. Twenty-six (26) chains in length, sixty (60) links wide, from district road on section one hundred and twenty-nine (129), block fifteen (15), Tokomairiro survey district, to north-east angle of section one hundred and seventy-six (176), block twenty-two (22), Tokomairiro survey district: Boundaries—north, by section forty-nine (49), block two (2), Taole Hill, and section one hundred and twenty-nine (129), block fifteen (15), Tokomairiro survey district; south, by section

one hundred and seventy-six (176), block twenty-two (22), Tokomairiro survey district.

2. Fifty-one (51) chains in length, one (1) chain wide from section twenty-seven (27), block one (1), Akatore, to section twenty-three (23), block one (1), Akatore: Boundaries—north, section twenty-six (26) and part of application two hundred and twelve (212), block one (1), Akatore; south, section twenty-five (25) and part of application two hundred and twelve (212), block (1), Akatore.

No. 10.—*Adamsthorpe Road District*

Fifteen (15) chains in length, sixty (60) links wide, from road line between block two (2), Tokomairiro, and block two (2), Waiholo Survey districts, to district road line on section eleven (11), block two (2), Tokomairiro: Boundaries—north, section twelve (12), block two (2), Tokomairiro; south, section (1), block one (1), Tokomairiro Survey District.

Plans to be seen at School-house, Waiholo Gorge.

No. 12.—*Warepa Road District.*

1. Fourteen (14) chains in length, sixty (60) links wide from district road on section thirty-eight (38), block one (1), Warepa: Boundaries—north, part of section one (1), block thirty-seven (37), Clutha survey district; south part of section thirty-eight (38), block one (1), Warepa.

2. Twenty-five (25) chains in length, sixty (60) links wide from district road on section two (2), block thirty-

seven (37), Clutha survey district, to road on section thirty-eight (38), block one (1), Warepa: Boundaries—north, part of sections one (1) and two (2), block thirty-seven (37), Clutha survey district; south, part of sections thirty-seven (37) and thirty-eight (38), block one (1), Warepa.

3. Twenty-two (22) chains fifty (50) links in length, sixty (60) links wide from west boundary of section eleven (11), block twenty-nine (29) Puerua road district to district road through sections two (2), block thirty (30), and twelve (12), block twenty-nine (29), Warepa Survey District.

4. Ninety (90) chains in length, sixty (60) links wide, from district road between block one (1) Warepa, and block thirty-seven (37), Clutha survey district, to road line between blocks thirty-seven (37) and thirty-eight (38), Clutha survey district: Boundaries—east, block twenty-nine (29); west, block thirty-seven (37), Clutha survey district.

No. 15.—*Puerua Road District.*

1. Eleven (11) chains in length, sixty (60) links wide, from boundary line between Otanomomo and Puerua road districts, to district road on section four (4), block twenty-five (25), Clutha survey district: Boundaries—east, part of sections four (4) and six (6), block twenty-five (25); west, parts of sections three (3) and five (5), block thirty (30), Clutha survey district.
