PROCLAMATION.

*Opening Arrowtown, in the Province of Otago,
for the purposes Sale.*

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in Council.

WHEREAS Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described (including amongst other lands the lands described in the Schedule hereto, and comprising Arrowtown) to be a Gold Field, under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866" to be called "Otago Gold Field." And whereas by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance, it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time, as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he shall think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth Section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of

the said Province shall, in the administration of the government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions, delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last-mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago: And whereas by Clause LXIX of the Gold Fields Act 1866, it is provided, that if a Depasturing Lease or License shall not, at the date of the passing of the said Act, have been granted, or shall have been or shall be cancelled over any Crown Lands within a Gold Field, it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, by Proclamation, to declare such lands, or any part thereof, open for sale or selection, in Sections of such size and form as he may determine, and any lands so proclaimed may thereafter be sold at a like price, and subject to the like terms and conditions, or as near thereto as may be as Crown Lands of the same class not within a Gold Field, and it shall not be necessary to withdraw lands from the operation of the said Act for the purposes aforesaid: And whereas at the date of the passing of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," all Depasturing Licenses heretofore existing over the Crown Lands situated in Arrowtown, as the same are described in the Schedule hereto had been cancelled: And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago have determined to open up for sale the Crown Lands, situate and being within Arrowtown aforesaid, in Sections of the size and form in which the same have already been surveyed, and as the same are laid off and delineated

in the map of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Otago relative thereto.

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, do hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare, that from and after the day of the date hereof all the Surveyed Crown Lands in Arrowtown aforesaid shall be open for sale in sections of the size and form in which the same have already been surveyed, laid off, and delineated in the map of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Otago relative thereto.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Otago, in the presence of George Duncan and Julius Vogel, Esquires, two of the Members of the Executive Council of the said Province, being also Members of the Provincial Council thereof, this third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

Arrowtown.

All that area situate in the Gold Field of Otago, containing by admeasurement one hundred and forty-two (142) acres, more or less, in the Interior District of the Province of Otago, at the junction of Bush Creek with the Arrow River, with roads, sections and reserves as pegged off and shown on the record map of the said town; bounded towards the north by the Crown Lands, towards the north-east by Crown Lands, towards the south by Crown Lands, and towards the west by Crown Lands.

WARRANT.

WHEREAS by the second section of the Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled the "Diseased Cattle Act 1861," it is enacted that the Governor shall from time to time appoint proper persons at such ports and places as to him shall seem fit to be Inspectors of Diseased Cattle to perform the duties required by the said Act, and may from time to time remove such persons, and appoint other persons in their respective places:

And by the said Act it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may, by warrant under his hand, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the Colony, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he might think fit: And whereas by "The Governor's Delegation Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the public seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations he may think fit, all or any of such powers as are or may be vested in the Governor, or Governor in Council, and which by any Act or Ordinance now in force, or by any Act passed during the

then present Session of Parliament, may be delegated to the Superintendent of a Province, or to any person or persons by the Governor, or the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Government hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Otago all such powers within the said Province as are by the "Diseased Cattle Act 1861," and the "Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865," vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, and by virtue thereof may be delegated to have and exercise such powers within the said Province, subject to the provisions of "The Governor's Delegation Act 1867":

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, do hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province of Otago in this behalf, by this warrant appoint

JOHN ANDERSON,

of Wyndham, in the Mataura district, in the Province of Otago, Settler, as, and to be an Honorary Inspector of Diseased Cattle, to perform the duties required by the "Diseased Cattle Act 1861," in the Mataura district aforesaid, and in other places in the said Province of Otago adjacent thereto; and I declare that this appointment shall take effect from the 22nd day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the twelfth day of March, 1868.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS certain Wardens' Courts have from time to time been constituted within the various Gold Fields of the Colony under the provisions of "The Gold Fields Act, 1862," which said Act has been repealed by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," and it is expedient to reconstitute under the said last-mentioned Act the said Courts, and to reappoint the persons who are at present acting as Wardens thereof.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him in this behalf under "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," doth, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, order that the several Wardens' Courts within the portions of the Colony mentioned in the first Schedule hereto, at any town heretofore constituted under any of the Acts of the General Assembly mentioned in the second Schedule hereto, shall be and the same are hereby constituted Wardens' Courts; and doth appoint the persons named in the third Schedule thereto to be Wardens of such Courts, with power to act alone or with assessors, and in such manner as by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," or any Act amending the same, is provided, and to exercise all such powers as are mentioned in the said last-mentioned Acts, and which the Governor has power to direct them so to exercise.
