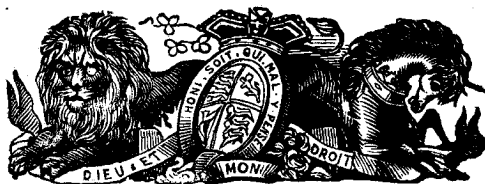

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Public Revenues Act 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to proclaim and bring into operation the said Act, or from time to time any parts thereof, at such time as the Governor shall think fit, and that no part of the said Act except the second section thereof (which it is enacted shall come into operation on the passing of the said Act), shall come into operation until such part shall be so proclaimed and brought into operation, or until the time fixed in the proclamation for the coming into operation thereof:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the sections of "The Public Revenues Act 1868" aforesaid, numbered respectively four, five, seven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, and fifteen, shall come into operation on the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and that the remainder of the said Act, exclusive of the sections lastly hereinbefore enumerated, and of the section numbered two, shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and

Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House at Wellington; and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, this twenty-third day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

To ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:
