PROCLAMATION

Varying and altering the Licensing District of Dunedin, so as to include the Taieri Licensing District, under the "Licensing Ordinance, 1865."

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS it is expedient to vary and alter the Licensing District of Dunedin, in the Province of Otago, so as to include therein the Taieri Licensing District:

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me, under the eleventh section of the Licensing Ordinance 1865, and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf: do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the day of the date hereof, and until further notice, Dunedin Licensing District, as proclaimed in the Otago Provincial Government *Gazette*, No. 465, by a proclamation bearing date the fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, shall be altered, and that the boundaries of the said Dunedin Licensing District shall hereinafter include the area following, being the same area as was proclaimed on the said fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, as the Taieri Licensing District (that is to say):

All that area bounded towards the north by a line proceeding from the western watershed of the Upper Taieri River due east through Rock and Pillar Mountain to the Waikouaiti Licensing District; towards the east by the Waikouaiti and present Dunedin Licensing Districts; towards the south by the Taieri River, Waihola Lake, and Meggat Burn to the boundary of the Hun-

dreds; thence towards the west by the Lawrence and Mount Benger Licensing Districts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, the seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

Present:

WHEREAS by Proclamation, bearing date the twenty-third day of June last past, made by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and published in the Otago Provincial Government *Gazette*, No. 553, under the hand of the said Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and under the public seal of the said Province, certain Regulations were made for the depasturing of stock upon the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Otago Gold Field: And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the

sixth day of October last past, published in the said Otago Provincial Government *Gazette*, No. 574, the said Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the said Executive Council of the said Province, did thereby revoke certain of the said Regulations so made and published on the said twenty-third day of June last as aforesaid, and did make the Regulations therein contained in lieu thereof, and in addition to the said Regulations, so made and published as aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the Regulation No. 22, so made by the said Order in Council of the said sixth day of October last past, and to make another Regulation in lieu thereof, and also to add another Regulation to the said Regulations—

Now therefore His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province of Otago, doth by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Otago in this behalf, hereby revoke the Regulation No. 22, so made by the said Order in Council of the said sixth day of October last past, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, and in addition to the said Regulations so made and published as aforesaid (that is to say):—

DEPASTURING REGULATIONS.

Otago Gold Field.

22. The Tuapeka Depasturing District shall comprise all those several areas described in the Schedule hereto, in addition to the area described as the Tuapeka Depasturing District in the First Schedule to the said Regulations, so made and published on the twenty-third day of June last past.

24. The Chairman of the Board of Wardens for the time being of the Tuapeka Depasturing District, shall be and he is hereby authorised to receive applications for the Depasturing of Stock within that portion of the Tuapeka Depasturing District described in the said Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

All that area situate in the Province of Otago comprising 3,800 acres more or less: bounded by a line proceeding from Scrub-burn at its junction with the Clutha river, along the north-east boundary of the Waitahuna Hundred, to Crookburn; thence in a south-westerly direction along Crookburn to the Clutha river; thence in a northerly direction along the Clutha river to Scrub-burn, the starting point.

Also, all that area in the Province of Otago, comprising twenty thousand (20,000) acres, more or less; bounded by a line proceeding from a point on the Tokomairi River, intersecting a direct line from Trig. Station F to Trig. Station E, Table Hill District; thence to Trig. Station E aforesaid; thence to Trig. Station D; thence to Trig. Station C; thence to Trig. Station K—all in the Table Hill District aforesaid; thence to Trig. Station L; thence to Trig. Station W—both in Tokomairi Survey District; thence to Trig. Station V, Hillend District; thence in a direct line towards Trig. Station Z, in the same district, to the boundary of the Hundreds; and thence in a north-easterly direction along the boundary of the Hundreds to the starting point.

Also, all that area in the Province of Otago, comprising two thousand five hundred (2500) acres, more or less, situate in the south-eastern district, being part of Run numbered 178, as delineated on the map deposited in the Survey Office, Dunedin: bounded by a line commencing at a point seven hundred (700) links; thence north-east from the Saddle on the Main Interior Road, and extending due south twenty-three thousand two hundred (23,200) links; thence by a line in an easterly direction five thousand two hundred (5,200) links, to a point one thousand (1,000) links distant from the Clutha River; thence by a line in a northerly direction parallel to, and one thousand (1,000) links

distant from, the Clutha river, thirty-six thousand (36,000) links, be the same more or less; thence by a line in a westerly direction, three thousand (3,000) links, to the starting point.
