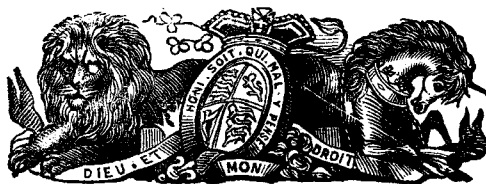

PROCLAMATION.

Road District of Wangoloa altered.

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that, until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one Districts, which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it should be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of such districts by forming and naming new districts:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the Road District of Wangoloa as proclaimed in the Provincial Government *Gazette*, 510, on the twentieth day of November, 1867:

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Road District of Wangoloa, as proclaimed in the said *Gazette*, No. 510, on the said twentieth day of November, 1867, shall be altered, and that the area bounded as herein described shall, from the day of the date hereof, be the Wangoloa District (that is to say):—

All that area commencing at the mouth of the Matau River, and bounded on the west by said river and Kaitangata Creek to the north-west angle of Section 3, Block I, South Tuakitoto Survey District; thence on

the north by a boundary line between Sections 3 and 4, said Block I; thence on the west by a road line to north-west angle of Section 12, Block IX, Kaitangata Survey District; thence on the north by Sections 1 and 2, said Block IX; thence again on the west by the centre of the road line between portion of Section 3 and Section 2, said Block IX, and continued by said centre of said road line to its junction with district road at Section 26, Block V, said Kaitangata Survey District; thence on the north by centre of road line bounding said Section 26; thence again on the west by centre of road line to the north-west angle of Section 17, Block VI, said Kaitangata Survey District; thence on the north by Blocks III and IV, said Kaitangata Survey District; thence on the east by Section 1, Block XIV, Coast District, to the Ocean, and on the south by the Ocean to the point of commencement.

PROCLAMATION.

Road District of Tuakitoto altered.

By his Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that, until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one districts,

which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it should be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts by forming and naming new districts.

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the Tuakitoto Road District, as proclaimed in the Provincial Government *Gazette*, No. 514, on the 18th day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven: Now therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Tuakitoto Road District, as proclaimed in the said *Gazette*, No. 514, on the 18th day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, shall be altered, and that the area bounded as hereinafter described shall, from the day of the date hereof, be the Road District of Tuakitoto (that is to say):—

All that area commencing at the Trig. Station, Mount Misery, and bounded on the north by a direct line to the north-east angle of Section 25, Block II, Kaitangata Survey District; thence by Section 24 and by a straight line from south-west angle of said Section 24, through Trig. Station H to north-east angle of Section 8, Block IV, North Tuakitoto; thence by Section 16, Block XXXVIII, Tokomairiro, and Sections 1, 2, and 3, Block X, North Tuakitoto to Main South Road; thence by the Main South Road to Lovell's Creek, thence on the west by Lovell's Creek, Tuakitoto and Kaitangata Lakes to north-west angle of Section 3, Block I, South Tuakitoto; thence on the north by Section 4, Block I, North Tuakitoto; thence on the east by a road line to north-west angle of Section 12, Block IX, Kaitangata Survey District; thence on the south by Sections 12 and 11, said Block IX; thence on the east by centre of road line between Section 2 and portion of Section 3, said Block IX and said centre of road line continued to its junction with district road at Section 26, Block V, said Kaitangata Survey District; thence again on the south by centre line of said road to south-east angle of said Section 26; thence again on the east by centre of road line continued to Trig. Station, Mount Misery, the point of commencement.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in me vested in this behalf by "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the second day of November next, the jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrates' Courts for the

CLUTHA DISTRICT, and

SOUTHLAND DISTRICT,

respectively, as the same are defined by Proclamation bearing date the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, shall be extended to One Hundred Pounds.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House at Wellington; and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, this twenty-eighth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.
