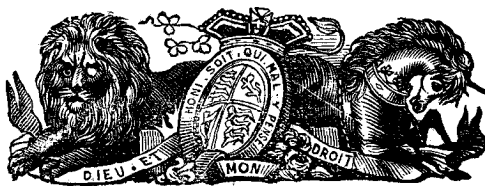

PROCLAMATION.

Under the "Sheep Ordinance 1867."

By his honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the Twentieth Section of the "Sheep Ordinance 1867," it is enacted that no sheep shall be introduced into the Province of Otago by land from the Province of Canterbury, except at such ford or fords, place or places on the Waitaki River as the Superintendent may direct by Proclamation to be published in the Provincial Government *Gazette*, and it is therefore expedient and necessary to proclaim a place on the Waitaki River, at which sheep may be introduced into the Province of Otago from the Province of Canterbury; and, also, to proclaim a place where sheep, so introduced from the Province of Canterbury, may be dressed before travelling, in accordance with the provisions of the "Sheep Ordinance Amendment Ordinance 1868."

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf by the "Sheep Ordinance 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and direct, that from and after the date of the publication hereof in the Provincial Government *Gazette*, the ford or place known as the "Upper Crossing" on the Waitaki River, near the Kuroa Station in the said Province of Otago, shall, until further notice, be the place where all sheep, introduced into the Province of Otago by land from the said Province of Canterbury, shall be so introduced, and that the place aforesaid shall be the place where all such sheep, so introduced from the said Province of Canterbury, shall be dressed before being driven or depastured in the said Province

of Otago in accordance with the provisions of the said "Sheep Ordinance 1867 Amendment Ordinance 1868."

Given under my hand and issued under the Public Seal of the said Province of Otago, at the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, this twenty-third day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

NOTICE.—Whereas it is intended to stop up those Roads and portions of Roads which are severally described in the Schedule hereunder written, and are delineated on the map or maps mentioned and referred to in the "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1868," Session XXIV, copies of which maps or plans, so far as as they relate to the particular roads or portions of roads intended to be stopped up in the Road District specified in the Schedule, have been deposited at the public School mentioned immediately after the description of the respective roads or portions of roads intended to be stopped up in such district: Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the power vested in me in that behalf by the "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1868," Session No. XXIV, do hereby give notice that all persons objecting to the stopping up of such roads, or portions of roads, or any of them, are required to set forth a statement in writing of any well grounded objections they may have to the stopping up of such roads, or portions of roads, and to leave such statement, addressed to me, at my office in Dunedin, within sixty days from the first publication hereof, otherwise such objections will not be considered by me.

Abbotsford Road District. (No. 44).

1. All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement 14a. 2r. 8p., more or less; being a road line situate in the Dunedin and East Taieri and Taieri Survey Districts; bounded on the north-west by Section No. 14, Block VI, Dunedin and East Taieri; Section No. 42, Irregular Block, Taieri; Section No. 15, Block VI, Dunedin and East Taieri; and Sections numbered 12, 13, 14, 15, and part of 16, Block VII, Dunedin and East Taieri, 14,300 links, more or less; and on the south-east by Section No. 14, Block VI, Dunedin and East Taieri; Section No. 42, Irregular Block, Taieri; Section No. 15, Block VI, Dunedin and East Taieri; and Sections numbered 6 and 7, a Bush Reserve; and Sections numbered 11, 25, and part of 26, Block VII, Dunedin and East Taieri, 14,300 links, more or less.

2. All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement 1a. 2p. 24p., more or less, being a road line situate in the Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District; bounded on the north-east by a Bush Reserve, Block VII, 3,300 links, more or less; and on the south-west by Section No. 11, and portion of Section No. 10, Block VII, Dunedin and East Taieri, 3,300 links, more or less.

3. All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement 2a. 2r. 0p., more or less, being a road line situate in the Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District; bounded on the north by Sections numbered 1 of 20, 2 of 20, and part of Section No. 21, Block VI, Dunedin and East Taieri, 5000 links, more or less, and on the south by Sections numbered 30 and 31, Block VI, Dunedin and East Taieri, 5000 links, more or less.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

Members of the Executive Council of the Province of Otago, being also Members of the Provincial Council of the said Province.

WHEREAS by Proclamation, bearing date the twenty-third day of June last past, made by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and published in the Otago Provincial Government *Gazette*, No. 553, under the hand of the said Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and under the public seal of the said Province, certain Regulations were made for the depasturing of stock upon the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Otago Gold Field: And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the sixth day of October last past, published in the said Otago Provincial Government *Gazette*, No. 574, the said Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the said Executive Council of the said Province, did thereby revoke certain of the said Regulations so made and published on the said twenty-third day of June last as aforesaid, and did make the Regulations therein contained in lieu thereof, and in addition to the said Regulations, so made and published as aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the Regulation No. 21, so made by the said Order in Council of the said sixth day of October last past, and to make another Regulation in lieu thereof—

Now therefore His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire-Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province of Otago, doth by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Otago in this behalf, hereby revoke the Regulation No. 21, so made by the said Order in Council of the said sixth day of October last past, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, (that is to say):—

DEPASTURING REGULATIONS.

Otago Gold Field.

21. The Wakatipu Depasturing District shall comprise all those two several areas described in the Schedule hereto, instead of the area described as the Wakatipu Depasturing District in the first Schedule to the said before-mentioned Regulations.

The Schedule above referred to.

All that area in the Province of Otago, comprising Runs numbered 16, 17, and 18, on the map of Wakatipu Pastoral District, and containing by admeasurement sixty thousand one hundred and eighty-nine (60,189) acres, more or less; bounded by a line proceeding in a south easterly direction from the source of Afton Burn to the water-shed between Lochy River and Long Burn; thence by the water-shed of Long Burn to Symmetry Peak; and thence by the water-shed of Short Burn to the Wakatipu Lake; thence in a northerly and westerly direction along the shore of the Wakatipu Lake to a point north of Walter Peak; thence in a south-westerly direction by the ranges to the source of Afton Burn, the starting point.

Also, all that area bounded by a line proceeding in a westerly direction from the north-east corner of Run numbered 7 on the map of Runs in the Wakatipu District, along the northern boundary of the said run to the Shotover River; thence in a southerly direction along the said river to the right hand branch, and along the watershed of Skipper's Creek to Stony Creek; thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundary of Run No. 6 to Run 346; thence in a southerly direction along the boundary of the said Run 346 and Lake Wakatipu to White Point; thence in an easterly direction along Lake Wakatipu and the Kawarau River to the western boundary of Run 340; and thence in a northerly direction along the boundary of Run 340 and the ranges forming the watershed between the Arrow and Motatapu Rivers to the north-east corner of Run No. 7, the starting point.

RETURN OF SHEEP IN THE PROVINCE
OF OTAGO, FOR THE YEAR ENDED
SEPTEMBER 30, 1868.

The following is published for general information.

SIR,—I have the honor to forward for the information of the Government, Return of Sheep in the Province of Otago, for the year ended 30th September, 1868.

The accompanying list shows a total of two millions eighty-eight thousand four hundred and twelve (2,688,412) sheep above six months old, of which number one million six hundred and sixty-four thousand one hundred and twenty-one (1,664,121) are depastured on runs; three hundred and fifty-seven thousand four hundred and eighteen (357,418) on freehold; twenty-six thousand eight hundred and forty-three (26,843) on hundreds; and forty thousand and thirty (40,030) on gold fields.

I am happy to be able to report that of the number returned as diseased, forty-five thousand nine hundred and fifty-two (45,952), only about 8000 are actually so, but in consequence of the lambing, it was found impossible to muster the sheep on the larger stations for inspection, and this cannot now be done till shearing, when I hope to grant clean certificates for them and report that disease has entirely disappeared from the Province.

On referring to the Monthly Report of Diseased Sheep, it will be seen that some good service has been done to the Province by the inspectors, 300,000 having been cleaned during the year. With a view to prevent the further introduction of disease, I would strongly recommend the settlers to dress carefully any imported stock they may purchase; should this be attended to, I have no doubt the sheep throughout the country would be kept clean.

As anticipated in my last report, there has been a considerable increase in the number of sheep depastured on freehold property, and this will now, no doubt, continue yearly to be the case.

The lambing over the Province has been quite equal to the best years.

I have given the number of sheep in the Province from actual returns received, but there are still about 50,000 unreturned, which will increase the total to two millions one hundred and thirty-eight thousand four hundred and six (2,138,406).
