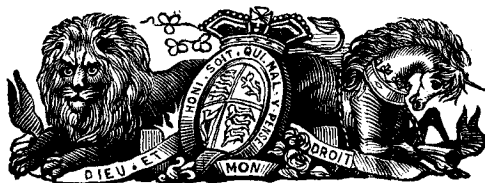

Schedule.

All that area lying between terrace-edge and terrace-edge, constituting the bed of Skippers Creek, including both the right and left hand branches, and extending on the one hand from the junction of Skippers Creek with the Shotover to a point one and a-half miles above the Scandinavian Engine-house, and on the other from the Forks up to a point near the source of the Mountain Race, where the left hand branch begins to broaden out upon shingle.

All that area comprised within the following boundary, viz.:—Four acres of land commencing at a point 300 yards from the junction of Swiper's Creek with the Arrow River, and fronting Swiper's Creek, being 894 links by 447 links.

THE following Rules and Regulations have been submitted to the Superintendent and Executive Council in terms of the "Cemeteries Reserves Management Ordinance 1864," and are published for general information.

WEST TAIERI CEMETERY RULES AND REGULATIONS,

Made in pursuance of Section V. of the "Cemetery Reserves Management Ordinance 1864," for the management of the Public Cemetery at West Taieri.

1. The managers shall divide a portion of the Cemetery into two classes, viz:—

2. Class 1st being ground of which the perpetual and exclusive right may be acquired, but the purchasers shall not have the right of enclosing it with a fence or erecting a headstone or monument thereon unless with the consent of the managers as stated in Clause 7 of the "Cemetery Reserves Management Ordinance 1864," a portion of land of this class shall be staked off in lots for single graves, 8 feet by 4 feet. These lots shall be sold: one lot for £1, two lots for £1 10s.

3. Class 2nd being a portion of ground which has been set aside for the interment of such persons as are not purchasers of, and have not acquired a right to private ground. On ground of this class no monument or memorial whatever shall be allowed, and no grave shall, under any circumstances, be opened for any new interment sooner than after the expiry of five years from the time of the first or last interment as the case may be.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

4. All graves shall be six feet deep, but in the event of the purchasers of private ground desiring greater depth, an extra charge of 3s. per foot shall be made.

5. The managers shall provide all necessary furniture and attendance for properly conducting interments.

6. Any purchasers of private ground in which no interment shall have taken place, may transfer his or her interest in said ground to any other person, upon payment being made to the Clerk for the time being a fee of 5s. for such transfer.

7. A plan of the Cemetery shall be prepared shewing particularly the lots so laid off together with the numbers thereof.

8. The Clerk for the time being shall keep a book in which he shall enter from time to time the number of every lot sold, the name of the purchaser thereof, together with the date of the sale of the same, and shall keep a record of the burials in the Cemetery.

9. The Clerk for the time being shall receive the purchase money for the sale of such lots and shall give a receipt for the same, which receipt shall be held conclusive evidence of the purchase and selection of the lots mentioned therein.

10. In all cases of intended interment, the person having the management or control of the same shall apply to the Clerk for the time being for warrant for such interment which warrant the said Clerk is hereby authorised to grant upon payment to him of the fol-

lowing fees, viz:—Digging grave, above 10 years of age, 15s.; under 10 years of age, 10s.; attendance and dressing ground, above 10 years of age, 5s.; attendance and dressing ground, under 10 years of age, 3s.

11. The said warrant when received by the grave-digger shall be sufficient authority to him for such interment.

12. The moneys arising from the sale of such lots, and the said fees shall (after deducting thereout all necessary expenses incurred and to be incurred) be expended in improving the Cemetery.

13. The managers shall publish a statement once a year, shewing the amounts received and paid by them on account of the Cemetery.

14. All ordinary meetings of the managers shall be held on the first Wednesday of every alternate month at 6 o'clock p.m., commencing in January, 1869. Special meetings may be called by the Clerk at any time.

15. The said Record book shall be open for the inspection of the public on paying a fee of one shilling for each inspection.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Weights and Measures Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to appoint an Inspector of Weights and Measures for any Province, or for each of two or more divisions of any Province, the boundaries of which divisions shall be proclaimed from time to time in the *New Zealand Gazette* by the Governor:

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise of the power conferred on me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim that from and after the 10th day of February next, the Province of Otago shall be divided, for the purposes of the said Act, into seven divisions, as defined in the Schedule hereto.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; at the Government House at Wellington; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this twenty-eighth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

SCHEDULE.

PROVINCE OF OTAGO:
Hawksbury Division.

Comprising all that area bounded towards the North by the Province of Canterbury; towards the East by the Pacific Ocean; towards the South by the Waitati Stream, the Silver Peak Hills, and the Taieri and Sutton Streams; and towards the West by the Rock and Pillar Mountains; thence by the ranges to Deep Dell Creek, by the Deep Dell Creek and the ranges to the Kakanui Mountains; thence by the Kakanui, the Hawkdun and the Dunstan Mountains.

Dunedin Division.

Comprising all that area bounded towards the North by the Hawksbury District aforesaid; towards the East by the ocean aforesaid; towards the South by the Taieri and Waipori Rivers; and towards the West by the Verter Burn and Lammermoor Ranges.

Tokomairiro Division.

Comprising all that area bounded towards the North by the Umbrella Ranges to Mount Benger; thence by the ranges to the Tapanui Mountains; thence by Black Cleugh Burn, by the Clutha and Waitahuna Rivers; thence by the Dull Burn; thence by the Stuart and Waitahuna Ranges; thence by the Waipori and Taieri Rivers; towards the East by the ocean aforesaid; towards the South by the ocean aforesaid; and towards the West by the Mataura River.

Tuapeka Division.

Comprising all that area bounded towards the North by the Ranges between Mount Benger and Lammerlaw; towards the East by the said Districts of Dunedin and Tokomairiro; towards the South by the Tokomairiro District aforesaid; and towards the West by the Tokomairiro District aforesaid.

Mount Ida Division.

Comprising all that area bounded towards the North-east by the Hawksbury District aforesaid; towards the South-east by the Dunedin and Hawksbury Districts aforesaid; and towards the West and North-west by Rough Ridge; thence to the Hawkdun Mountains aforesaid.

Dunstan Division.

Comprising all that area bounded towards the North by the said Province of Canterbury; towards the East by the aforesaid Hawksbury and Mount Ida Districts; towards the South by the Tuapeka District aforesaid; and towards the West by the Umbrella, Cairnmuir, Pisa, and Earnslaw Ranges.

Wakatipu Division.

Comprising all that area bounded towards the North by the Canterbury Province aforesaid; towards the East by the said Districts of Dunstan and Tokomairiro; towards the South by the Province of Southland and the ocean; and towards the West by the said ocean.
