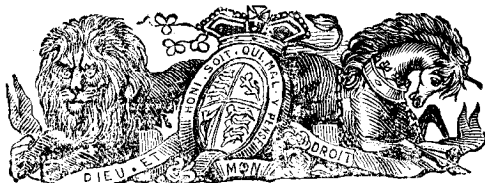

**NOTICE TO DISTRICT ROAD BOARDS, &c.**—  
The following portion of Section IX of the Otago Roads Ordinance 1865, is published for the information of Local Boards, &c. :—

“No person elected a member of any such Local Board shall directly or indirectly derive any emolument or profit from any business or work of any description performed or to be performed by him under this Ordinance nor be capable while he holds office of enjoying any place of profit to be created or established by virtue of this Ordinance.”

*Note.*—The Government has not been able to pass some of the Local Board accounts in consequence of the provisions of the above Section of the said Ordinance not having been observed.
