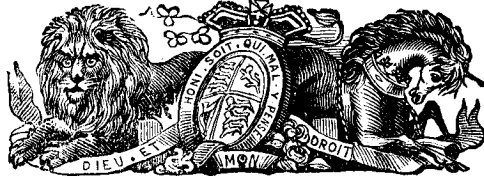

Starting from Cairn-hill by a direct line to the head of Butcher's Gully, thence to the Obelisk, thence to Blackman's Creek, thence along the northern watershed of the said creek to the south-eastern corner of pre-

emptive right B., Run No. 249, thence to and by the Nevis road to the Earnsclough river, thence by the Earnsclough river to a point on the eastern bank of the Clutha river opposite the junction of the said Earnsclough river, thence by the Clutha river and north and east boundaries of Alexandra to Manuherikia river, thence by the east bank of the Manuherikia river to a point opposite the junction of the Chatto Creek, thence by a direct line to the Dunedin road via the Rock and Pillar, thence by a direct line to the Manorburn three miles above its junction with the Manuherikia river, thence by the western watershed of the Manorburn to the Teviot road via the Knobbs, thence by the said main road to the starting point.
