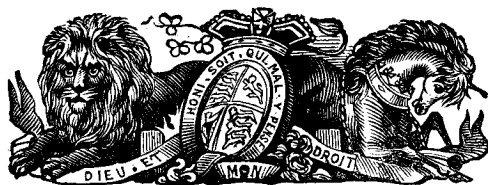

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, the
20th day of July, one thousand eight hundred
and sixty-nine.

HIS HONOR THE DEPUTY-SUPERINTENDENT,
DONALD REID,

GEORGE DUNCAN, Esquires,

Members of the Executive Council of the Province of
Otago, and of the Provincial Council thereof.

WHEREAS Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the Government *Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described (including amongst other Lands the Lands described in the Schedule hereto, comprising certain Sections in the Dunedin and East Taieri District, in the said Province of Otago) to be a Gold Field, under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field." And whereas by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and under the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he shall think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions, delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last-mentioned Act, may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago: And whereas, by clause XLIX of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is provided, that if a Depasturing Lease or License shall not, at the date of the passing of the said Act, have been granted, or shall have been or shall be cancelled over any Crown Lands within a Gold Field, it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by Proclamation, to declare such Lands or any part thereof, open for sale or selection, in Sections of such size and form as he may determine, and any Lands so proclaimed may thereafter be sold at a like price, and subject to the like terms and conditions, or as near thereto as may be as Crown Lands of the same class not within a Gold Field, and it shall not be necessary

to withdraw Lands from the operation of the said Act for the purposes aforesaid: And whereas at the date of the passing of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," all Depasturing Licenses heretofore existing over the Crown Lands mentioned in the Schedule hereto had been cancelled: And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago have determined to open up for sale the said Crown Lands mentioned in the said Schedule in Sections of the size and form in which the same have already been surveyed, and as the same are laid off and delineated on the maps of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Otago relative thereto:

Now, therefore, His Honor Thomas Fraser, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, doth hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by his Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867:" and of any and every other power in anywise enabling the said Executive Government in this behalf proclaim and declare, that from and after the day of the date hereof, all the Crown Lands mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be open for sale in Sections of the size and form in which such lands have already been surveyed, and as the same are laid off and delineated on the map of the Province of Otago relative thereto.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that in accordance with Section 7 of the "Depasturing Regulations for the Otago Gold Fields, dated 23rd June, 1868," the undermentioned Regulations for the election of Wardens for the Depasturing District of Tuapeka, having been passed by the Board of Wardens, and assented to by His Honor the Deputy-Superintendent, the election of Wardens for the year ending 31st July, 1870, will take place on Monday, the 2nd August, 1869.

Regulations referred to.

1. The Board of Wardens for the District aforesaid shall consist of nine Elective Members, and a Chairman hereafter to be appointed.

2. The Tuapeka depasturing district shall be divided into two divisions—the Tuapeka division shall constitute one portion and Waitahuna the other; the boundaries to be as previously laid down in the Provincial Government *Gazette*, July 8th, 1868.

3. The Tuapeka division shall return five members, Waitahuna division four members.

4. Nominations of candidates for the office of warden must be made in writing addressed to the Chairman of the Board, and must be signed by the proposer and seconder of the candidate, and must be forwarded to the Chairman, on or before Thursday, the 29th day of July, 1869.

5. If more than the requisite number of candidates are nominated for either division, a poll shall take place, and if there are not more than the requisite number nominated, then the candidates nominated shall be declared to have been duly elected.

6. No person shall be entitled to be so nominated for the office of warden, nor shall any person be entitled so to nominate or to second the nomination of any candidate, unless he holds the qualification stated in Clause 5 of the Depasturing Regulations published in the Provincial Government *Gazette* of the 24th June.

7. Voters shall record their votes personally within the district wherein they possess the requisite qualifications, and the document in respect of which they claim to vote must be produced to the Returning Officer, and he shall write on some part thereof—(Voted).

8. A poll, if taken, shall be held at Tuapeka division, and Waitahuna division, between the hours of 12 to 3 and 5 to 8 p.m., on the 2nd day of August.

9. The names of Candidates nominated shall be advertised in the local papers.

10. Any candidate not having the requisite qualifications (as hereinbefore contained) at the time of the election shall be incapable of being elected, and it shall be in the power of the Board to inquire into the qualification of all persons elected, and to declare the election of any unqualified person null and void; whereupon a fresh election shall be held to fill up the vacancy.

PROCLAMATION.

Guaranteeing payment out of the Revenues of the Province of Otago of Interest on certain paid up Capital of the Dunedin Water Works Company.

By His Honor Captain Thomas Fraser, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the "Dunedin Water Works Company Guaranteed Interest Ordinance 1864," the Superintendent of Otago was authorised and empowered, with the advice and consent of the

Executive Council of the said Province, to enter into any agreement with any Company, constituted and registered under the "Joint Stock Companies' Act 1860," for the purpose of providing the City or Town of Dunedin and suburbs with an increased supply of water for domestic and other uses, for the purpose of guaranteeing to the Shareholders thereof for and during any period not exceeding ten years the payment of any sum or sums of money either as dividend or interest on the paid up capital of such Company or any part thereof, at such rate as might be agreed upon between the Superintendent and such Company, not exceeding the rate of eight pounds per centum per annum: And whereas a Joint Stock Company called the Dunedin Water Works Company Limited, was duly formed for the purpose aforesaid and registered under the said "Joint Stock Companies' Act 1860," and the said Company was afterwards, by the "Dunedin Water Works Act 1864," continued a body corporate by the name of the Dunedin Water Works Company, with perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the works of the said Company were completed on or about the 9th day of December, 1867, and the said Company then commenced to supply water to the Town of Dunedin and its neighborhood; and the said Company thereupon applied to James Macandrew, Esq., as the Superintendent of Otago, to guarantee payment out of the Revenues of the Province of Otago of interest at the rate of eight per cent. per annum upon the paid up capital of the said Company, which the said James Macandrew, as such Superintendent as aforesaid, agreed to do: and on the 2nd day of April now last past, an agreement was made and entered into between the said James Macandrew as such Superintendent of the one part, and the said Dunedin Water Works Company of the other part, whereby the said Superintendent did amongst other things covenant and agree with the said Company that he the said Superintendent should and would by proclamation to be duly published in the Otago Provincial Government *Gazette*, guarantee payment yearly and every year for the term of ten years to be computed from the 1st day of January, 1868, by equal half-yearly payments out of the Revenues of the Province of Otago of interest at the rate of eight pounds per centum per annum to the Shareholders of the said Company on the paid up capital of the said Company, subject to the terms and conditions the said agreement contained.

Now therefore, I, Thomas Fraser, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and under and by virtue of the powers conferred on the Superintendent of the said Province of Otago by the said "Dunedin Water Works Company Guaranteed Interest Ordinance 1864," and in pursuance and performance of the said agreement of the 2nd day of April last past so entered into between the said James Macandrew as such Superintendent, and the said Dunedin Water Works Company as aforesaid, do (subject to the terms and conditions in the said agreement contained) hereby guarantee to the shareholders of the said Company the payment out of the revenues of the Province of Otago, yearly and every year for the term of ten years to be computed from the 1st day of January, 1868, of interest at the rate of eight pounds per cent. per annum in equal half-yearly payments on the paid-up capital of the said Company, mentioned in the said agreement exclusive of the capital represented by the shares enumerated in the Schedule to the said agreement and exclusive also of the sums which from time to time shall be secured by debentures of the said Company.

CITY OF DUNEDIN.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the following Regulations, made under Schedule 13 of the "Municipal Corporations Act 1867," were passed by the Council of the City of Dunedin on Wednesday, 23rd June, 1869:—

1st.—A Regulation made under the authority of section 4, subdivision 1, part 1 of schedule 13 of said Act:—"For regulating the height from the ground, shape, figure, dimensions, and materials of Porticos or Verandahs."

2nd.—A Regulation made under the authority of section 14, subdivision 3, part 1 of schedule 13 of said Act :—"For regulating the formation, &c., of drains to be laid under any footway or channel."

3rd.—A Regulation made under the authority of section 26, subdivision 4, part 1 of schedule 13 of said Act :—"For regulating the formation, &c., of crossings across or over footways and channels."

4th.—A Regulation made under the authority of section 45, subdivision 9, part 1 of schedule 13 of said Act :—"For appointing the hours during which it shall not be lawful to drive into or through the city, or any part thereof, any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment or travelling from one part of New Zealand or of any other colony, to any other place," &c., &c.

For appointing the rates and charges to be paid for the hire of any licensed cart, and the amount of rewards to be paid to water carters attending at fires," &c., &c., &c.
