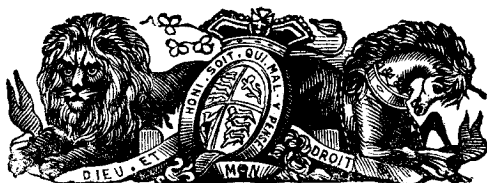

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, the eleventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

**WHEREAS** by Proclamation, bearing date the twenty-third day of June last past, made by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the

advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and published in the Otago Provincial Government Gazette, No. 553, under the hand of the said Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and under the public seal of the said Province, the said Superintendent did appoint the several districts described in the first Schedule thereto to be Depasturing Districts, and did make certain Regulations for the depasturing of stock upon the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Otago Gold Field: And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the sixth day of October last past, published in the said Otago Provincial Government Gazette, No. 574, the said Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the said Executive Council of the said Province, did thereby revoke certain of the said regulations so made and published on the said twenty-third day of June last as aforesaid, and did make the Regulations therein contained in lieu thereof, and in addition to the said Regulations, so made and published as aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to appoint the area described in the Schedule hereto a Depasturing District under the said Regulations, and to make provision for issuing depasturing licenses in the said district:

Now therefore His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province of Otago, doth by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Otago in this behalf, and of the said Regulations, hereby appoint the area described in the said Schedule hereto to be a Depasturing District under the said Regulations, to be called the Switzer's Depasturing District, and doth appoint the Receiver of Gold Revenue at Switzer's as and to be the person to receive applications and to issue licenses for the depasturing of

stock within the said district, until a Board of Wardens shall be duly elected for the said district.

THE SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

All that area situate in the province of Otago, containing by estimation two thousand five hundred (2500) acres more or less, being part of Run numbered 326 on the map of the south-eastern districts of the Province of Otago aforesaid : bounded towards the north by the remaining portion of Run 326 ; towards the east by Argyle Burn : towards the south by Run 254B ; and towards the west by the Wakaiia river.

Also all that area situate in the Province of Otago, containing by estimation five thousand (5000) acres more or less, being part of Run numbered 254 B. on the map of the south-eastern districts of the said Province : bounded towards the north by Run 326 ; towards the east by Run 253 ; towards the south by the remaining portion of Run 254 B. ; and towards the west by the Waikaiia river.

PROCLAMATION.

*Road District of Catlin's River formed.*

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that, until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one Districts, which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B : And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it should be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts, and to increase the number of districts by forming and naming new districts :

And whereas it is expedient to form a new Road District to be named the Catlin's River Road District ;

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area bounded as described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from the day of the date hereof, be constituted a Road District, and shall be named the Catlin's River Road District.

SCHEDULE.

Catlin's River Road District comprises all that area situate in the Province of Otago, bounded towards the north-east by the ranges and the south-western boundary of the Ahuriri Road District, extending from the western boundary of Catlin's Hundred to the Ocean ; towards the south by the Ocean and Catlin's River, and towards the west by the western boundary of Catlin's Hundred.

PROCLAMATION.

*Cancellation of Lease to Depasture Stock on certain Crown Lands in the Province of Otago.*

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in Council.

WHEREAS by the 16th section of the Gold Fields Act 1866," it is enacted that when any Gold Mine or Gold Field shall be discovered and proclaimed upon any Crown Lands, which at the date of the passing of the said Act shall have been held under license or lease, for depasturing purposes, it should be lawful for the Governor at his discretion to cancel the license or lease under which such land shall have been held in occupation, as regards the whole or any part of the lands so held under such license or lease, or with the concurrence of the licensee, or lessee, to suspend such lease or license as regards the whole or any part of such lands : And whereas Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described, including amongst other lands the lands hereinafter described, to be a Gold Field, under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field." And whereas by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance, it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time, as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he may think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation : And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council : and whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions, delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago, all such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last-mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago : And whereas the said lands hereinafter described are Crown Lands, subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and the said lands are now, or lately were, held in occupation by Mr. Charles Lambert Swanston, under a lease for Depasturing purposes, issued under the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1866," and bearing date the twenty-seventh day of February, 1867 : And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of

Otago have determined to cancel the said lease as to so much and such part of the lands held under the same as are comprised within the area hereinafter described :

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby cancel the said lease, in so far as the lands comprised within the area hereinafter described are affected by the said lease, but no further or otherwise (that is to say)—

All that area situate in the Province of Otago, containing by estimation five thousand (5000) acres, more or less, being part of Run numbered 254B on the map of the south-eastern districts of the said Province; bounded towards the north by Run 326; towards the east by Run 253; towards the south by the remaining portion of Run 254B; and towards the west by the Waikaia river.

**W**HEREAS by Proclamation bearing date the  
twelfth day of February last, made by His  
Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Pro-  
vince of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of

virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the  
Executive Government of the said Province of Otago in  
that behalf, under the provisions of the Gold Fields  
Act, 1866, certain regulations were made for the Otago  
Gold Field, prescribing the mode in which application  
might be made for leases of land for agricultural pur-  
poses : And whereas it is expedient to add an additional  
Regulation to the Regulations so proclaimed as  
aforesaid :

Now, therefore, His Honor, James Macandrew,  
Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the  
advice and consent of the Executive Council of the  
Province of Otago, doth, by virtue and in exercise of  
the powers delegated to the Executive Government of  
the Province of Otago in this behalf, hereby make the  
Regulation following in addition to the said Regulations  
proclaimed as aforesaid, on the said twelfth day of  
February last :

REGULATION.

33. *Applicants for Agricultural Leases must be of full  
age, and must apply in person, or by a duly  
authorised Agent.*

Every application for an Agricultural Lease must  
be made by the applicant in person, or by an agent  
thereunto authorised in writing by the applicant, and  
the Warden shall not entertain any application unless  
he is satisfied that the same is made by or on behalf of  
a person resident in the Province of Otago of the full  
age of twenty-one (21) years, and legally capable of  
being bound by the contract into which it is thereby  
proposed to enter.

Fields Act 1866," it is enacted that it shall be  
lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Procla-  
mation, to constitute and appoint any portion of the  
Colony to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the  
said Act, and the limits of such Gold Field from time

to time to alter, as occasion may require : And whereas  
Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the  
Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the  
powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf,  
did, by Proclamation in the Government *Gazette*, of the  
said Province, bearing date the 29th day of January,  
one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute  
and appoint all the territory therein described to be a  
Gold Field, under the provisions of the "Gold Fields  
Act 1866," to be called the Otago Gold Field : And  
whereas the limits of the said "Otago Gold Field," as  
described in the said Proclamation, has been from time  
to time altered and extended : And whereas by  
"The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it  
is enacted that within any Province in which by  
any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Super-  
intendent shall, in the administration of the Govern-  
ment thereof, act by and with the advice and consent  
of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the  
Governor in Council, under his hand and under the  
Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion  
may require, to delegate to the Executive Government  
for the time being of such Province, subject or not to  
any restrictions or limitations as he shall think fit, all  
or any of such powers vested in the Governor or the  
Governor in Council by the "Gold Fields Act 1866,"  
as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth  
section of the said Act may be delegated by the

therein the area of land hereinafter described :

Now, therefore, His Honor James Macandrew,  
Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with  
the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the  
said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the  
powers delegated to the Executive Government of the  
said Province of Otago in this behalf, and of the "Gold  
Fields Act 1866," doth hereby proclaim and declare  
that all that area of land hereinafter described shall  
henceforth be included in, and form part of, the Otago  
Gold Field (that is to say)—

All that area situate in the Province of Otago, con-  
taining by estimation one hundred and forty-five thou-  
sand acres, more or less, bounded by a line proceeding  
from the boundary of the present Gold Field along the  
southern boundary of Run 28 and the Otakaik Stream  
to the Waitaki River ; thence to the eastern boundary  
of the Marawhenua Hundred ; thence along the said  
eastern boundary of the Marawhenua Hundred and the  
northern and western boundaries of the Kakanui Hun-  
dred, and a direct line from the south-west corner of the  
said Kakanui Hundred to Kakanui Peak ; and thence  
northerly along the boundary of the present Gold Field  
to the starting point.
