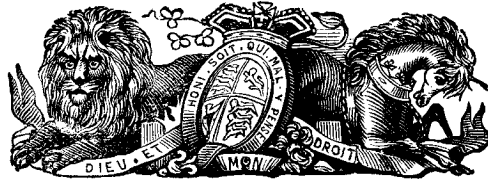

PROCLAMATION :

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

I, JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf by the "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1866," hereby proclaim and declare that all those roads and all those portions of roads in the Province of Otago, mentioned and referred to in the said "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1866," and particularly described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from and after the day of the date hereof, cease to be public roads or thoroughfares, and shall no longer form part of the public roads in the Road District in the Province of Otago, mentioned in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed.

SCHEDULE.

Port Molyneux Road District (No. 14).

1. Twenty-two chains in length, one chain wide, from new district road through section six, block two, Glenomaru survey district, to district road between block two, Glenomaru survey district, and block five, South Molyneux survey district. Boundaries: both sides section six, block two, Glenomaru survey district.

2. Fourteen chains in length, one chain wide, from new district road on section six, block two Glenomaru survey district, to said road on said section and block. Boundaries: south-east, section six, block two, Glenomaru survey district; north-west, part of section six, said survey district, and new district road.

3. Forty-three chains in length, one chain wide, from new district road, on section six, block two, Glenomaru survey district, to district road between block two, said survey district, and block five South Molyneux survey district. Boundaries: both sides section six, block two, Glenomaru survey district.

4. Fourteen chains in length, one chain wide, from district road between block two, Glenomaru survey district, and block five, South Molyneux survey district, to Port Molyneux road. Boundaries: both sides section two, block five, South Molyneux survey district.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

I, JAMES MACANDREW, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf by the "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1864," hereby proclaim and declare that all those portions of roads in the Province of Otago, mentioned and referred to in the said "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1864," and particularly described in the Schedule hereto shall, from and after the day of the date hereof, cease to be Public Roads or Thoroughfares, and shall no longer form part of the Public Roads in the Road District in the Province of Otago, mentioned in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed:—

SCHEDULE.

Port Molyneux Road District.

1.—71 chains in length, 60 links wide, from Trunk Road to District Road, on section 2, block iii; boundaries, east, block iii; west, block v, South Molyneux.

2.—30 chains in length, 60 links wide, from road line between blocks iv and vi to New Road on section 11, block v; boundaries, section 11, block v; south, section 1, block vi, South Molyneux.

3.—34 chains in length, 60 links wide, from New Road on section 12, block v, to block line between block v, South Molyneux, and block ii, Glenomaru; boundaries, north, section 12, block v; south, section 2, block vi, South Molyneux.

4.—120 chains in length, 60 links wide, from block xiv, Clutha, to District Road on section 4, block vi, South Molyneux; boundaries, east, blocks v and vi, South Molyneux; west, block ii, Glenomaru.

5.—36 chains in length, 60 links wide, from Trunk Road to District Road on section 5, block x, Clutha; boundaries, east, part of block vi, Clutha, and section 12, block iii, South Molyneux; west, section 1, block v South Molyneux, and sections 1 and 3, block x, Clutha.

6.—76 chains in length, 60 links wide, from road line between blocks iii and v, South Molyneux, to Trunk Road on section 1, block xiv, Clutha; boundaries, north, block x, and part of section 1, block xiv, Clutha; south, block v, South Molyneux, and part of block ii, Glenomaru.

PROCLAMATION.

Varying the boundaries of the Road District of Caversham.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one districts, which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts: and whereas it is expedient to alter and enlarge the boundaries of the Caversham Road District, in manner and as described in Schedule hereto: Now therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of said Province, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Caversham Road District, shall, from the day of the date hereof, be so altered as described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Caversham Road District.

Comprises all that area commencing at the north-west angle of section 42, block vi, Town District, and bounded towards the north by sections 46, 58, 59, 63, 64, 65, and 99, block vi, and section 4, block vii, and the Main South Road to Cemetery Reserve; thence by the Town Belt to the Anderson's Bay Road; thence on the east by the said road to the north angle of section 69, block vii; thence on the south by the said section 69; thence on the east by sections 69 and 82, block vii, and that line continued to the Ocean Beach; thence on the south by the Ocean Beach to road line, continued south from section 32, Ocean Beach District; on the west by the said road line and part of section 77, Ocean Beach District; north by section 23, Ocean Beach District; thence on the west by the said section 23, 22, and 21, and a direct line from northern angle of section 21, Ocean Beach District, to south-west angle of section 28, block vi, Town District; thence by said section 28 to the Main South Road; thence on the

south by the Main South Road to section 45 of the said block vi; thence on the west by the said section 45, and section 31, Lower Kaikorai District to point of commencement.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, passed in the twenty-fifth Session of the said Provincial Council, number 280, and intituled an Ordinance to Incorporate the University of Otago, it is granted, amongst other things, that the Council of the University of Otago should be nominated and appointed by the Superintendent of the said Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, within six months after the passing of the said Ordinance, and should consist of twelve Councillors, of whom six at least should be laymen: And whereas it is expedient that the Council of the said University should be appointed without delay: Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and in pursuance of the power for this purpose vested in me under or by virtue of the said Ordinance, do hereby nominate and appoint

ORDER IN COUNCIL,

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, the twelfth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

Members of the Executive Council of the Province of Otago, being also Members of the Provincial Council of the said Province.

WHEREAS Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf did, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the ter

ritory therein described (including amongst other lands the lands described in the Schedule hereto, and comprising certain sections in the town of Frankton), to be a Gold Field, under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called the "Otago Gold Field." And whereas by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance, it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time, as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he shall think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: and whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions, delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago, all such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last-mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago: And whereas by Clause XLIX of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is provided, that if a Depasturing Lease or License shall not, at the date of the passing of the said Act, have been granted, or shall have been, or shall be, cancelled, over any Crown Lands within a Gold Field, it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by Proclamation, to declare such lands, or any part thereof, open for sale or selection, in sections of such size and form as he may determine, and any lands so proclaimed may thereafter be sold at a like price, and subject to the like terms and conditions, or as near thereto as may be, as Crown lands of the same class not within a Gold Field; and it shall not be necessary to withdraw lands from the operation of the said Act for the purposes aforesaid: And whereas at the date of the passing of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," all Depasturing Licenses hitherto existing over the Crown Lands situated in the town of Frankton, specified in the Schedule hereto had been cancelled: And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago have determined to open up for sale the Crown Lands situate and being within the said town of Frankton, specified in the Schedule hereto, in sections of the size and form in which the same have already been surveyed, and as the same are laid off and delineated in the maps of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Otago relative thereto: Now, therefore, His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, doth hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by his Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling the said Executive Government in this behalf proclaim and declare, that from and after the date hereof, all the Crown Lands in the said town of Frankton, specified in the Schedule

hereto, shall be open for sale in sections of the size and form in which such Lands respectively have already been surveyed, and as the same are laid off and delineated on the Map in the Office of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Otago relative thereto.

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, the 21st day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

Members of the Executive Council of the Province of Otago, being also Members of the Provincial Council thereof.

WHEREAS Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, of the said Province, bearing date the 29th day of January, 1867, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described (including amongst other Lands the Lands described in the Schedule hereto, and comprising certain sections in blocks ii and iii, Table Hill District, to be a Gold Field, under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called the "Otago Gold Field": And whereas by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and under the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion

may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he shall think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under: or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions, delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last-mentioned Act, may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago: And whereas, by clause XLIX of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is provided, that if a Depasturing Lease or License shall not, at the date of the passing of the said Act, have been granted, or shall have been or shall be cancelled over any Crown Lands within a Gold Field, it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by Proclamation, to declare such Lands or any part thereof, open for sale or selection, in Sections of such size and form as he may determine, and any Lands so proclaimed may thereafter be sold at a like price, and subject to the like terms and conditions or as near thereto as may be as Crown Lands of the same class not within a Gold Field, and it shall not be necessary to withdraw Lands from the operation of the said Act for the purposes aforesaid: And whereas at the date of the passing of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," all Depasturing Licenses hitherto existing over the Crown Lands situated in Blocks ii and iii, Table Hill District, as the same are described in the Schedule hereto had been cancelled: And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago, have determined to open up for sale the Surveyed Crown Lands, situate and being within the said Blocks ii and iii, Table Hill District, in Sections of the size and form in which the same have already been surveyed, and as the same are laid off and delineated in the maps of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Otago relative thereto: Now, therefore, His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent Executive Council of the said Province, doth hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in any wise enabling the said Executive Government in this behalf, proclaim and declare, that from and after the date hereof, all the Surveyed Crown Lands in the said Blocks ii and iii, Table Hill District, specified in the Schedule hereto, shall be open for sale in Sections of the size and form in which such Lands respectively have already been surveyed, and as the same are laid off and delineated on the map in the Office of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Otago relative thereto.
