ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, the eighteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

Present :

HIS HONOR JAMES MACANDREW, Superintendent ;
DONALD REED, and
GEORGE DUNCAN, Esquires,

Members of the Executive Council of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the second section of the "Salmon and Trout Act 1867," the Governor of New Zealand is authorised to make Regulations for preserving and propagating Salmon and Trout, and regulating fishing for Salmon and Trout, and for other purposes in the said section, particularly mentioned : And whereas by the 12th section of the said Act the Governor is empowered by order in Council under his hand, and the Public Seal of the Colony from time to time, to delegate to the Superintendent or the Provincial Executive of any Province, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said Act, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he might think fit : And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities for that purpose vested in him by the said Act delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Otago, all the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said Act, exercisable within the Province of Otago : And whereas it is deemed expedient by the Executive Government of the Province of Otago to make regulations under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter particularly specified :

Now, therefore, His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province of Otago, doth by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Council of the Province of Otago, and of every and any other power in anywise enabling the Provincial Executive in this behalf, hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say) :—

1. No person shall fish for in, or take fish from, the rivers Clutha, Tokomairiro, Silver Stream, Deep Stream, Lee's Stream, Boat Harbor Creek, Waitati, Waikouaiti, Waihemo or Shag, Kakanui, Water of Leith, and Island Stream, in the Province of Otago, nor in any tributary of the said rivers, under a penalty of not exceeding £10 for each breach of this regulation.

2. All nets, or other engines, instruments, or devices used for taking fish in the said rivers Clutha, Tokomairiro, Silver Stream, Deep Stream, Lee's Stream, Boat Harbor Creek, Waitati, Waikouaiti, Waihemo or Shag, Kakanui, Water of Leith, and Island Stream, or in any tributaries thereof, shall be seized and forfeited, destroyed or removed, as each case may require.

3. No person shall be allowed to use any net for the purpose of fishing within the mouth of the river Clutha under a penalty of not exceeding £100 for each breach of this regulation. And the mouth of the river Clutha is hereby defined to include all that portion of the sea within a straight line extending from Nugget Point to Coal Point.

4. All nets used in contravention of the foregoing regulations shall be seized and forfeited, destroyed or removed, as the case may require.

5. No person shall put, throw, cause to flow, or allow to flow, into the rivers Clutha, Tokomairiro, Silver Stream, Deep Stream, Lee's Stream, Boat Harbor Creek, Waitati, Waikouaiti, Waihemo or Shag, Kakanui, Water of Leith, and Island Stream, lime or any

other matter or liquid deleterious to fish, under a penalty of not exceeding £10 for each breach of this regulation.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At Auckland, this seventh day of January, 1870.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

* * * * *

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, and by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter clause fifty-six of the aforesaid Regulations, and doth revoke clauses two hundred and nine, two hundred and ten, and two hundred and eleven thereof, and doth make the alteration and substitutions specified in the Schedule hereinafter written; and further doth declare that this Order shall take effect on and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

SCHEDULE.

Registered Letters.

Clause 56. The Colonial fee on registered letters for places beyond the Colony will be reduced from one shilling to sixpence.

Late Letters.

Clause 209. Late letters for places beyond the Colony will be received until twenty minutes of the hour of despatch from the Post Office, providing such letters bear each, in postage stamps, an additional single rate of postage over and above the full postage rate.

Clause 210. Late letters for town delivery will be received until within ten minutes of the hour of despatch of the letter-carriers from the post office, providing such letters bear each, in postage stamps, an additional single rate of one penny over and above the full postage rates.

Late letters for delivery at any post office within the Province other than that at which they are posted will be received until within twenty minutes of the hour of despatch, providing such letters bear each, in postage stamps, an additional single rate of twopence over and above the full postage rates.

Late letters for delivery at any post office in any other Province within the Colony will be received until within twenty minutes of the hour of despatch from the post office, providing such letters bear each, in postage stamps, an additional single rate of threepence over and above the full postage rates.

In case any late letter is posted at a post office without the appropriate late fee, it will be detained until the next despatch.

Clause 211. Letters posted in receiving boxes on board of vessels also require the late fee and postage which would be required if posted as late letters at a post office. Should such late fee or postage, or any portion thereof, be unpaid, they must be taxed with the late fee and double the unpaid postage. Letters for places beyond the Colony found in these boxes without the late fee and full postage rates must be detained until the next despatch.
