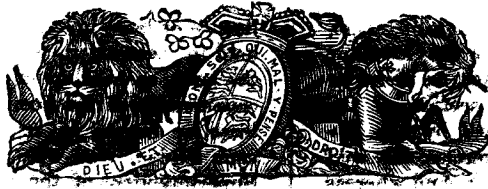

IN pursuance of the power and authority vested in me in that behalf, I do hereby fix and proclaim that the twenty-seventh Session of the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago shall be holden within the Provincial Council Hall, Dunedin, in the said Province, and shall commence upon Tuesday, the nineteenth day of April, 1870, at 12 o'clock noon; and the Members of the said Council are hereby warned to give their attendance at such time and place accordingly.

PROCLAMATION.

Cancellation of Lease to Depasture Stock on certain Crown Lands in the Province of Otago.

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in Council.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is enacted that when any Gold Mine or Gold Field shall be discovered and proclaimed upon any Crown Lands, which at the date of the passing of the said Act shall have been held under license or lease for depasturing purposes, it shall be lawful for the Governor, at his discretion, to cancel the

license or lease under which such land shall have been held in occupation, as regards the whole or any part of the lands so held under such license or lease, or with the concurrence of the licensee, or lessee, to suspend such lease or license as regards the whole or any part of such lands: And whereas Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described, including amongst other lands the lands hereinafter described to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field." And whereas by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he may think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under, or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the ad-

ministration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions, delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago, all such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last-mentioned Act, may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago: And whereas the said lands hereinafter described are Crown Lands, subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and are now, or lately were, held by Mr. Francis Dillon Bell, under a lease for depasturing purposes, issued under the provisions of the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1866," and bearing date the 28th February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven: And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago have determined to cancel the said lease as to so much and such part of the lands held under the same as are comprised within the area hereinafter described:

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby cancel the said lease, in so far as the lands comprised within the area hereinafter described are affected by the said lease, but no further or otherwise (that is to say)—

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, the eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

Members of the Executive Council of the Province of Otago, being also Members of the Provincial Council of the said Province.

WHEREAS Thomas Dick Esquire then Superintendent of the Province of Otago by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf did by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the said Province bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven constitute and appoint all the territory therein described (including amongst other lands the lands described in the Schedule hereto) to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866" to be called the "Otago Gold Field": And whereas by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867" it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall in the administration of the government thereof act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council under his hand and under the Public Seal of the Colony from time to time as occasion may require to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province

subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he shall think fit all or any of such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the "Gold Fields Act 1866" as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861" it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall in the administration of the government thereof act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866" and subject to its provisions delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said last mentioned Act as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council to have hold and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago: And whereas by Clause XLIX of the "Gold Fields Act 1866" it is provided that if a Depasturing Lease or Licence shall not at the date of the passing of the said Act have been granted or shall have been or shall be cancelled over any Crown Lands within a Gold Field it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by proclamation to declare such lands or any part thereof open for sale or selection in sections of such size and form as he may determine and any lands so proclaimed may thereafter be sold at a like price and subject to the like terms and conditions or as near thereto as may be as Crown Lands of the same class not within a Gold Field and it shall not be necessary to withdraw lands from the operation of the said Act for the purposes aforesaid: And whereas all Depasturing Licenses and Leases heretofore existing over the Crown Lands specified in the Schedule hereto have been cancelled: And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago have determined to open up for sale the said Crown Lands specified in the Schedule hereto in sections of the size and form in which the same have been surveyed and as the same are now laid off and delineated in the maps of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Otago relative thereto: Now therefore His Honor James Macandrew Superintendent of the Province of Otago by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province doth hereby by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867" and of any and every other power in anywise enabling the said Executive Government in this behalf proclaim and declare that from and after the day of the date hereof all the Crown Lands specified in the Schedule hereto shall be open for sale in sections of the size and form in which such lands respectively have already been surveyed and as the same are now laid off and delineated on the maps in the Office of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Otago relative thereto respectively.

Varying the Boundaries of the Road District of Te Houka.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one districts, which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts: And whereas it is expedient to alter and enlarge the boundaries of the Te Houka Road District, in manner and as described in Schedule hereto: Now therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of said Province, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Te Houka Road District, shall, from the day of the date hereof be altered, and that the boundaries of the said District shall henceforth be as described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Te Houka Road District.

All that area in the Province of Otago, and Colony of New Zealand, bounded on the north-east by the Clutha River, from the confluence of the Waiwera Stream to the Main South Road to the eastern boundary of the Kaihiku Road District, and by the northern boundaries of Kaihiku and Waiwera Road Districts; and towards the west by the eastern boundary of the Kaihiku Road District and the Waiwera Stream, from the northern boundary of the said Kaihiku Road District to the Clutha River.

Varying the Boundaries of the Road District of Popotunoa.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that until otherwise provided, pursuant to the provisions of the said Ordinance, there should be sixty-one districts, which should be named as specified in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed, marked B: And it is also by the said Ordinance provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, from time to time, by proclamation in the *Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such districts: and whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the Popotunoa Road District, in manner and as described in Schedule hereto: Now therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of said Province, with the advice and consent of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Popotunoa Road District shall, from the day of the date hereof, be altered, and that the boundaries of the said District shall henceforth be as described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Popotunoa Road District

Comprises all that area in the Province of Otago, in the Colony of New Zealand, bounded on the north by the Pomahaka and Clutha rivers; on the east by the Waiwera river; on the south by the southern boundary of Block II, Kuriwao Survey District; on the south-west by the south-western boundary of Block I, Kuriwao Survey District, and the same line continued in a north-westerly direction to the Waipahi Survey District; towards the west by the Waipahi Survey District along the boundaries of Blocks IX and XI, Pomahaka Survey District, to the Wairuna stream, and by the said Wairuna stream to the Pomahaka river.

Incholme Road District—Powers Suspended—Commissioner appointed.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1865," it is amongst other things enacted in the 12th section thereof, that if any Local Board shall refuse or neglect to carry the said Ordinance into operation, the Superintendent may, with the advice of the General Road Board, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, declare the powers of such Board to be suspended, and may, by such Proclamation, appoint a Commissioner, or such number of Commissioners as he may think fit for each district; and the several rights, privileges, and duties of such Board shall, from the date of such Proclamation, vest in and be exercised by such Commissioner or Commissioners on behalf of the Board:

And whereas the Local Board of the Incholme Road District have neglected to carry this said Ordinance into operation, and it is therefore deemed expedient

and necessary to suspend the powers of the said Local Board, and to appoint a Commissioner for the said Incholme Road District :

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice of the Otago General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare the powers of the Local Board of the Incholme Road District to be and the same are hereby suspended, and I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, appoint.

ROBERT M'AULEY,
of Incholme, in the said Province of Otago, Settler, a Commissioner for the said district, to exercise the rights, privileges, and duties of the said Local Board of the said district.

WHEREAS by Proclamation bearing date the twenty-third day of June last past, made by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and published in the Otago Provincial Government Gazette, No. 553, under the hand of the said Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and under the public seal of the said Province, certain Regulations were made for the depasturing of stock on the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Otago Gold Field :— And whereas it is expedient to revoke certain of the said regulations so published and proclaimed as aforesaid, and to make other regulations in lieu thereof, and in addition thereto.

Now, therefore, His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province of Otago, doth by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Otago in this behalf, hereby revoke the regulations numbered 10, 11, and 12, of the said regulations so made and published on the twenty-third day of June last as aforesaid, and doth make the regulations following in lieu thereof (that is to say)—

DEPASTURING REGULATIONS.

Otago Gold Field.

10. The person, or in the case of a lease to two or more persons jointly, the persons holding or occupying any land within a district, under or by virtue of any grant from the Crown, or any mining mineral or agricultural lease, shall be entitled to run three head of great cattle free of charge, provided that in the case of a Crown Grant, or a lease to two or more persons jointly, the number of cattle which they shall be together entitled to run shall be no more than three head.

11. Holders of miners' rights or business licenses, and holders of land under grant from the Crown, or under any mining, mineral, or agricultural lease within a district, may run cattle there in excess of the number which they are allowed to run free of charge, on obtaining a depasturing license under these regulations, and other persons resident in such district not being holders of miners' rights or business licenses, or such grantees or lessees as aforesaid, may run cattle within the district on obtaining a depasturing license under these regulations.

12. Persons desirous of obtaining a depasturing license must first deposit with the nearest gold receiver an application in writing in the form contained in the schedule hereto.

GOVERNMENT INSURANCE AND ANNUITIES REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations are made under the
authority of "The Government Annuities Act
1869"—

Proposals to be made at Money Order Offices.

1. Every Post Office, being a Money Order Office,
at which the Government Annuities Commissioner
shall permit proposals for the Insurance of Lives or
the purchase of Government Annuities to be received,
shall be opened for such purpose, and for the receipt
of the premiums becoming due to the said Commis-
sioner from time to time under contracts for the Insur-
ance of Lives or the purchase of Government Annu-
ities, and for the payment of any sums which shall
become payable by the said Commissioner under the
said contracts, during the hours appointed for the
transaction of Money Order business at the said Post
Office.

Any Office, not being a Money Order Office, at
which the said Commissioner shall permit such pro-
posals or premiums to be received or such payments to
be made, shall be opened for such purposes during such
hours and on such days as the said Commissioner shall
determine.

INSURANCE OF LIVES.

2. At the Offices appointed for such purposes by the
Government Annuities Commissioner, proposals shall
be received for the Insurance of Lives—

- (1). By payment of a single Premium;
- (2). By payment of a Premium annually, or once
in every six months, or once in every three
months (that is, on the 31st March, 30th
June, 30th September, and 31st December in
each year), throughout the life of the person
insured;
- (3). By payment of a Premium annually (that is,
on the 31st December in each year), until
the person insured shall have attained the age
of sixty years;
- (4). By payment of a Premium once in six months,
or once in three months, until the insured
person shall have attained the age of sixty
years;

but no such proposal shall be received from or on behalf of any person under the age of sixteen years, or over the age of sixty years.

Form of Proposal.

3. Every person who shall desire to insure his life for the first time under the provisions of the above cited Act shall make his proposal for such insurance on the form, to be obtained at any Money Order Office, and shall deposit the proposal at one of the offices appointed by the Government Annuities Commissioner for the receipt thereof.
