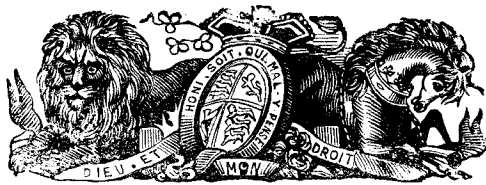

## NOTICE

*Of certain Land in the Province of Otago having been reserved for purposes of Commonage for the Town of Hawksbury*

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**W**HEREAS the Provincial Council of Otago have, under and by virtue of Section 62 of the "Otago Waste Lands Act, 1866," recommended that the Land hereinafter described should be reserved for purposes of Commonage for the use of the Inhabitants of the Town of Hawksbury; and it is expedient that the said land should be so reserved for that purpose:— Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf, do hereby publish and declare that I have made and dedicated the land hereinafter described a Reserve for purposes of Commonage for the use of the Inhabitants of the Town of Hawksbury, henceforth to be known as the "Hawksbury Commonage Reserve: " that is to say—

All that area in the Town of Hawksbury, containing by admeasurement three hundred and seventy-five (375) acres, more or less, bounded towards the north by the town boundary, towards the east by the town boundary, towards the south by the town boundary, and towards the west by Edinburgh street, exclusive of Cemetery Reserve and sections numbered respectively 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 12, block XV; 1, 3, 4, and 5, block XVI; 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 21, and 22, block XVII; 17, block XVIII; 1, 2, 3, and 5, block XIX; 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, block XX; 1, 3, 4, 5, and 6, block XXII; 2, 3, 4,

and 5, block XXIV; 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7, block XXVI; 7, block XXVII; 1, 4, and 5, block XXIX; 1, 3, and 6, block XXXII; 3, block XXXVII; 1, 2, and 3, block XLI; 5, block XLII; 22, block XLVII; 2 and 3, block LV; 3, block LVI; 3, block LXI; 3, block LXV; 11, block LXVI; and 1 and 3, block LXX.

**S**IR,—I have the honor to forward for the information of the Government, Return of Sheep in the Province of Otago for the year ended 30th September, 1869.

The accompanying list shews a total of two millions three hundred and eighty-five thousand two hundred and fifty-nine (2,385,259) sheep above six months old, of which number one million eight hundred and fifty-nine thousand one hundred and eighty-six (1,859,186) are depastured on Runs; four hundred and forty-nine thousand eight hundred and fifty-four (449,854) on freehold; forty-five thousand eight hundred and five (45,805) on Gold Fields; and thirty thousand four hundred and fourteen (30,414) on Hundreds.

It has been usual to publish the Return in the month of November in each year, but I was unable to do so on this occasion, owing to the unfortunate death of Mr. Inspector Kennedy, whose successor had to collect fresh returns from his district before I could make up the list, and even now there are doubtless a few still omitted.

With the exception of one flock all the sheep entered in the Return as diseased are now clean. I append a list of the owners of diseased sheep at present in the Province, from which it will be seen that the disease is confined to the Mount Stuart and Waitahuna Hundreds. Owing to the nature of the country it is exceedingly difficult preventing the different flocks mixing, and I anticipate that it will be a troublesome task to eradicate disease from these commonages.

I append a tabular Return, shewing the increase of sheep from 1859 to 1869, inclusive.

If any person shall establish commence or be a partner or otherwise beneficially interested in any lottery or any scheme by which prizes whether of money or of any other matter or thing shall be gained drawn or thrown for or competed for by lot dice or any other mode of chance or shall sell or dispose of any tickets or other means by which permission or authority is gained or given to any person to throw for compete or have any interest in any such lottery or scheme or shall under any pretence or by means of any device sell or dispose of or endeavour to sell or dispose of any lands goods wares or merchandise by means of any game either of skill or chance every such person being dny convicted thereof shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds and for any second offence besides such penalty shall be liable to imprisonment not exceeding six months: But this provision shall not apply to the distribution of any property amongst the owners thereof or to any raffle of any work purely of art of which a notice having the name and address of the person intending to hold the same subscribed there-to shall have been given to the Superintendent if the Superintendent shall not within one week after such notice prohibit such raffle by notice sent by post or in any other manner according to the address so subscribed by such person.
