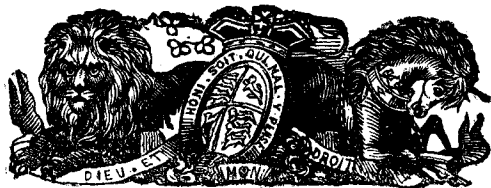

NOTICE

Of certain Land at Green Island, in the Province of Otago, having been set apart for purposes of Public Recreation.

By His Honor William Alexander Tolmie, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS the Provincial Council of Otago have, under and by virtue of Section 62 of the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1866," recommended that the lands hereinafter described should be set apart for purposes of public recreation at Green Island; and it is expedient that the said lands should be so reserved for that purpose: Now therefore, I, William Alexander Tolmie, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf, do hereby publish and declare that I have made and dedicated the lands hereinafter described a Reserve for purposes of public recreation at Green Island (that is to say)—

All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by estimation three hundred and seventy-two (372) acres, three (3) roods, and four (4) poles, more or less, situate in Dunedin and East Taieri District, being Section numbered one (1), Block fourteen (XIV) on the map of the said district: bounded towards the north by a road line two thousand and fifty (2050) links, by Green Island Bush District one thousand six hundred (1600) links, and six thousand and thirty (6030) links, by section numbered two (2) one thousand and eighty (1080) links, and three hundred and fifty (350) links, also by Green Island Bush District two thousand four hundred and forty (2440) links, two thousand (2000) links, and two thousand four hundred (2400) links; towards the south-east by a road line two thousand three hundred

and thirty (2330) links; towards the south by the ocean thirteen thousand seven hundred (13,700) links; and towards the west by the Kalkorai Stream two thousand eight hundred (2800) links;—be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

10. The Superintendent shall with the advice and consent of his Executive Council levy and raise yearly for and in respect of all cattle depastured upon the Waste Lands within any Hundred an assessment as follows:—

For every head of great cattle a sum of three shillings and sixpence |

For every head of small cattle a sum of sevenpence

To be paid by the person depasturing such cattle at a time and place and in manner to be appointed by the Superintendent by notice in the Provincial Gazette and the amount received from every such assessment shall be paid into the Provincial Treasury and form part of the Land Revenue of the Province of Otago and shall be appropriated by Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council in the formation and repair of district roads and bridges in the several Hundreds in which such assessment shall have accrued and such assessment shall be so expended in such Hundreds exclusive of and in addition to any sums which shall be appropriated from time to time by the Provincial Legislature under the provisions of "The Otago Road Boards Endowment Act 1868" for the formation and repair of main roads and bridges thereupon.

11. In case any person liable for the payment of any such assessment shall neglect or refuse to pay within thirty days the amount due in respect thereof it shall be lawful for the Superintendent without prejudice to any other remedy he may have at law to issue a warrant under his hand directed to some constable to levy the amount so due by distress and sale of a sufficient part of the cattle of the party liable in like manner as in case of rent in arrear between landlord and tenant.
