PROCLAMATION

Of His Excellency the Governor having assented to certain Ordinances of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago.

By His Honor William Alexander Tolmie, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS in the Twenty-seventh Session of the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago the Bills next hereinafter mentioned were passed by the said Council (that is to say):—

The "District Roads Compulsory Land Taking Ordinance 1870;"

The "Tokomairiro School Residence and Glebe Lands Sale Ordinance 1870;"

The "Lawrence Athenæum and Mechanics Institute Reserve Leasing Ordinance 1870;"

The "Oamaru Racecourse Reserve Management Ordinance 1870;"

And whereas the said Bills were severally presented to the Superintendent of the Province of Otago for the assent of His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand thereto, and the said Superintendent did upon the said several Bills being so presented to him as aforesaid, declare that he reserved the same respectively for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon: And whereas the said several Bills have since been laid before His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, and he has been pleased to assent to the same:

Now, therefore, I, William Alexander Tolmie, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said several Bills before mentioned (that is to say):—

The "District Roads Compulsory Land Taking Ordinance 1870;"

The "Tokomairiro School Residence and Glebe Land Sale Ordinance 1870;"

The "Lawrence Athenæum and Mechanics Institute Reserve Leasing Ordinance 1870;" and

The "Oamaru Racecourse Reserve Management Ordinance 1870;"

have been laid before His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, and that His Excellency has assented to the same.

10. The Superintendent shall with the advice and consent of his Executive Council levy and raise yearly for and in respect of all cattle depastured upon the Waste Lands within any Hundred an assessment as follows:—

For every head of great cattle a sum of three shillings and sixpence

For every head of small cattle a sum of sevenpence

To be paid by the person depasturing such cattle at a time and place and in manner to be appointed by the Superintendent by notice in the Provincial Gazette and the amount received from every such assessment shall be paid into the Provincial Treasury and form part of the Land Revenue of the Province of Otago and shall

be appropriated by Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council in the formation and repair of district roads and bridges in the several Hundreds in which such assessment shall have accrued and such assessment shall be so expended in such Hundreds exclusive of and in addition to any sums which shall be appropriated from time to time by the Provincial Legislature under the provisions of "The Otago Road Boards Endowment Act 1868" for the formation and repair of main roads and bridges thereupon.

11. In case any person liable for the payment of any such assessment shall neglect or refuse to pay within thirty days the amount due in respect thereof it shall be lawful for the Superintendent without prejudice to any other remedy he may have at law to issue a warrant under his hand directed to some constable to levy the amount so due by distress and sale of a sufficient part of the cattle of the party liable in like manner as in case of rent in arrear between landlord and tenant.
