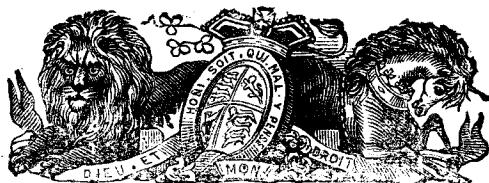

PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**I**, JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in the Superintendent of the Province of Otago in this behalf by the "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1870," and of the powers vested in me as Superintendent of the Province of Otago, hereby proclaim and declare that all those roads and all those portions of roads in the Province of Otago, mentioned and referred to in the said "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1870," and particularly described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from and after the day of the date hereof, cease to be public roads or thoroughfares, and shall no longer form part of the public roads in the several Road Districts in the Province of Otago, mentioned in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed.

## ADDRESS OF HIS HONOR THE SUPERINTENDENT,

ON OPENING THE TWENTY-NINTH SESSION OF THE  
PROVINCIAL COUNCIL OF THE PROVINCE OF  
OTAGO, MAY 25, 1871.

MR. SPEAKER AND GENTLEMEN OF THE PROVINCIAL  
COUNCIL:

In opening this, the first Session of the sixth Provincial Council of Otago, we are naturally led to reflect upon what has been accomplished under the auspices of preceding Provincial Councils. Probably the history of colonisation does not afford an instance of greater progress than has been attained by this Province since the Provincial Council was first instituted in 1853—progress which would have been much greater had the Province been a distinct Colony and left to its own resources. I am sure it is the earnest desire of each and all of us that, when the present Council shall have expired, the amount of progress to which it may be able to lay claim will be equal to that of any of its predecessors.

Gentlemen,—I have to congratulate you upon the fact that the Southern Trunk Railway has, at last, been commenced; and that the work will be vigorously prosecuted upon terms much more advantageous to the Province than had hitherto been anticipated. Also that the necessary surveys are being effected for an extension of the line right through, by Winton, to Lake Wakatipu. I need not say that this road will open up a considerable area of unsold land available for population, and will be largely conducive towards the settlement of the country. A line is also being surveyed from the northern boundary of the Province to Moeraki, which will be ultimately extended to Dunedin. Application has been made to the General Government to survey a branch line of the Southern Trunk Railway to Tuapeka. I trust you will concur with me in endeavoring to secure the immediate carrying out of these works by means of the Colonial Loan—the more especially seeing that their construction upon a scale adequate to our requirements will not involve much greater pecuniary outlay than we shall be subject to in the formation and maintenance of ordinary roads over the same ground. While the Railway works now indicated are probably as extensive as we can enter upon at

once, at the same time I am convinced that, with a view to true economy, the earlier we can lay down rails upon most of the main branch roads throughout the Province, the better.

You will be glad to know that the Railway between Dunedin and Port Chalmers is progressing satisfactorily, and is likely to be open for traffic in February next; also that the erection of the bridge across the Waitaki will be contracted for so soon as the necessary plans can be prepared.

The long delay which has occurred in placing additional land in the market has, as you are doubtless aware, seriously diminished the sum total of the revenue during the past year. Notwithstanding this, however, it will be observed from the balance sheet for the year, that the bulk of the votes passed by the late Provincial Council have been expended, and that £23,000 have been paid up to this date, by way of subsidy to District Road Boards, being £3000 in excess of the last annual vote. As a necessary result, you will not be surprised to learn that the Provincial account is at present largely overdrawn. From the steps, however, which are now being taken towards placing land in the market, and reducing the departmental expenditure, it is hoped that the account will speedily be in a more satisfactory position.

From the Estimates, which will shortly be put before you, it will be seen that the most rigid economy is being enforced, and that the annual departmental expenditure is considerably reduced. The Government has felt some delicacy in dealing with the estimates of expenditure connected with the Provincial Council, but are strongly of opinion that these may be greatly reduced. The matter is recommended to your careful consideration.

Gentlemen—I need not say that it is anything but a pleasant duty to have to dispense with the services of public officers from no fault of their own,—the necessities of the service, however, and the exigency of the case, alike leave no option in the matter. While upon this subject, I feel that any retrenchment which can be effected here will be very incomplete, unless the General Government reduces the number of its civil servants by amalgamation of offices or otherwise. At present, £50,000 a year is retained out of our share of the Consolidated revenue, in respect of General Government services Provincially charged. I trust the representatives of the Province in the Colonial Assembly will endeavor to get the amount largely diminished, so that the difference may be applied to public works.

Resolutions will be submitted for your consideration, having for their object such amendments in the "Otago Waste Land Act," as shall offer greater facilities and encouragement for the acquisition of land for settlement. It is hoped that your recommendations on this subject may be so unanimous as to secure their being given effect to by the Colonial Legislature.

A Bill will be submitted for your approval with a view to the consolidation of existing Road Districts, the establishing of Road Boards all over the Province, and the conferring of more extended powers on such boards. Should this bill become law, it will be a question whether or not it may be desirable to hand over the administration of the main roads to the district boards.

Resolutions will be submitted, expressive of your approval, of the provisions of the "Otago Settlements Act" being extended to various portions of the Province. Your concurrence will also be asked in the Province availing itself of the provisions of the "Immigration and Public Works Act," in respect of immigration.

In fulfilment of a promise made by me at the late election, a commission has been appointed, com-

prising delegates specially representing the mining community, for the purpose of conferring as to the practical working of the Gold Fields Act, and the mining regulations, with a view of recommending such amendments as past experience may suggest. I trust the result of the conference may be beneficial.

Resolutions will be proposed, expressive of your concurrence in an immediate application being made to the General Government for the proportion due to the Province of the £300,000 allocated to the Gold Fields under part III of "Immigration and Public Works Act 1870."

With a view to the more efficient administration of the Gold Fields, I have felt it my duty to call to the Executive Council, a member specially connected therewith whose time will be chiefly devoted to the mining interest. I hope this arrangement will meet with your approval.

In compliance with a resolution of the late Provincial Council, the Government some time ago framed certain conditions for the encouragement of the planting of forest trees, by means of free grants of land. A number of applications for such grants have been received. It has been found, however, in proceeding to deal with these applications that there are difficulties in the way of giving effect to them which were not anticipated, and which will require further consideration by the Government.

Among other subjects of more or less importance respecting which your advice will be solicited is the question of the Stewart and Traquair Hundreds. The latter, especially, is involved in a considerable difficulty. I would suggest the appointment of a Select Committee for the purpose of deliberating as to what is best to be done in the matter.

Gentlemen,—In conclusion, I have only to express my most earnest hope that in the fulfilment of the responsible functions which have been entrusted to us, we may all be guided by that spirit of enlightenment and of unity which will render our administration of affairs creditable to ourselves and beneficial to the Province.

I now declare this Council open for the despatch of business.

## REPLY TO THE ADDRESS OF HIS HONOR THE SUPERINTENDENT :—

1. We are glad to be able to concur with your Honor in your statement that the History of Colonisation does not afford an instance of greater progress than has been attained by this Province since the institution of the Provincial Council, and in your further statement that this progress would have been even more rapid had the Province been free from external interference, and been left to its own resources.
2. We are glad that the Southern Trunk Railway has been at last commenced, and we assure your Honor that the assistance of this Council may be relied on in every endeavour of your Honor to obtain an adequate proportion of the Colonial Loan.
3. We are glad to learn from your Honor the satisfactory progress of the Dunedin and Port Chalmers Railway: and agree that it and the other works to which you allude will prove very beneficial to the Province.
4. We regret the delay that has taken place in the sale of land, and in the consequent diminution of the revenue, causing an overdraft to a large extent; but we are pleased to learn that notwithstanding that fact your Honor and your late advisers still found means to carry on all necessary public works according to the votes and wishes of the late Council.
5. We agree with your Honor in the urgent necessity that exists for a large reduction in the departmental

expenditure, and assure your Honor that in the unpleasant task of making these reductions your Government shall receive every assistance from the Council consistent with the efficiency of the service, and justice to the Government servants and employes. We earnestly hope that the Representation of this Province in the Colonial Assembly will aid your Honor's exertions in obtaining a diminution of the General Government charges upon our Provincial Revenue.

6. With regard to the land question, we shall endeavor that our recommendations shall be so unanimous as to secure their being given effect to by the Colonial Legislature, for we agree with your Honor in thinking that unanimity will greatly help the Province to secure that desirable object.

7. We learn with satisfaction that a Bill will be submitted with a view to the consolidation of the Road Districts, and the conferring of more extended powers; and we beg to assure your Honor that the matter will receive our very favourable consideration.

8. The other important subjects referred to by your Honour shall receive our earnest attention.

9. We agree as to the desirability of making immediate application for the proportion due to this Province of the £300,000 allocated to the Gold Fields, and will assist your Honor in any endeavors you may think it advisable to make to obtain an increase of the moneys to be allocated for the furtherance of that most valuable of our industries; and we are most happy to see that your Honor has recognised the desirability of calling to the Executive Council a member who shall be specially charged with the care of the interests of our Gold Fields.

10. Agreeing as we do, with much, that your Honor has recommended for our consideration, we beg to assure your Honor, that upon all those subjects above noticed, this Council will use every endeavour to aid and assist your Honor in carrying out such measures as are calculated to advance the interests of the Province.

11. Whilst we are glad to be so heartily able to concur with your Honor's views in those matters, we at the same time regret that your Honor's advisers have failed to perceive that the "Hundreds Regulation Act 1869" and the "Hundreds Regulation Act Amendment Act 1870" are injurious to the interests of this Province and ought to be repealed; and this Council begs to assure your Honor, that no Ministry will be satisfactory to the country, or command the confidence of this Council, who will not at once on entering office take steps to obtain the unconditional repeal of those statutes.

*Professors:*

Classics and the English Language and Literature—  
Prof. SALE.

Mathematics and Natural Philosophy—Prof. SHAND.

Moral and Mental Philosophy—Prof. M'GREGOR.

Chemistry and Mineralogy—Prof. BLACK.

OWING to unavoidable delay in the departure of the

Professors from Britain, the classes will not be opened till about the first of July. Classes will then be opened in the University Building, Dunedin, for Latin, Greek, the English Language and Literature, Mathematics, Natural Philosophy, Moral Philosophy, the Physiology of Mind, and Elementary Psychology. Professor Black's classes will not be opened till May, 1872.

The term will last for six months continuously, during the entire course of which instruction will be given to each Class by the Professor, by means of Text books, Lectures, and oral and written Examinations.

The Fee for each Professor is Three Guineas per Term.

There will be no Matriculation Examination at the opening of the first Session.

Every effort will be made by the Vice-Chancellor and the University authorities to ensure the proper supervision of young men from a distance who may attend the University.

The following suggestions by the Professors have been approved of by the University Council, and they will be carried out as far as practicable, subject to such amendments as may from time to time be found advisable:—

1. *Matriculation*—That it is not advisable that any matriculation examination should be held for the admission of students at the opening of the Session of 1871; but that in future years there should be an examination in the following subjects:—

- (1.) English writing from dictation.
- (2.) Latin accidence, and translation of a portion of a Latin author.
- (3.) Arithmetic.
- (4.) Algebra—elementary rules.
- (5.) Euclid, Book I.

It seems probable that some such examination as that proposed would have a good effect upon the schools, especially if the candidates were placed in two classes, according to the results of their examination.

2. *Degree of B.A.*—That there should be a degree of B.A. attainable by (1) attendance upon the prescribed lectures during three sessions, and (2) passing an examination in certain subjects either at the end of the third or at the beginning of the fourth session after matriculation; or at the beginning or end of any subsequent session. That there should be no honour examination in connection with the B.A. degree.

3. *Degree of M.A.*—That there should be a degree of M.A., attainable only by those who have already taken the B.A. degree. That the ordinary M.A. degree should be attainable by (1) attendance upon the prescribed lectures for at least one session after the taking of the B.A. degree, and (2) by passing a further examination similar in kind to that required of candidates for the degree of B.A., such examination to be held at the end of one year from the B.A. degree, or at the commencement or end of any subsequent session. That there should also be an Honor Examination in connection with the M.A. degree. That no one should be admitted to the degree of M.A. with honors, except such as have declared their intention of entering for honors at the time of taking the B.A. degree, or within six months afterwards. That candidates for the degree of M.A. with honors should be allowed to select one or more of the following subjects, and should be examined in such subject or subjects only:—

1. Classics and Philosophy.
2. Pure and Applied Mathematics.
3. Material Science (including Physics.)

That no candidate should be admitted to the degree of M.A. with honors, after the expiration of three academical years from the date of his

B.A. degree, nor after the expiration of six years from the date of his matriculation.

4. *Attendance at Lectures.*—That all candidates for the B.A. and ordinary M.A. degrees should be required to furnish certificates of their attendance at the several courses of lectures prescribed for them. That the courses of lectures be somewhat as under :—

- (a) For candidates in their B.A. degree in their  
1st Year—Junior Latin, Junior Greek, Junior Mathematics.  
Mental Philosophy in 1871, Natural Science in 1872, and afterwards.  
2nd Year—Senior Latin, Greek, and English (alternately), Senior Mathematics and Natural History (alternately), Natural Science, and Psychology, and Logic (alternately.)  
3rd Year.—Greek and English (alternately), Senior Mathematics and Natural Philosophy (alternately), Moral Philosophy, Natural Science (alternately), and Political Economy.

- (b.) For candidates of the ordinary M.A. degree :—  
Natural Science, Senior Natural Philosophy, Moral Philosophy.

That the greater part of the subjects of the lectures should be the same as the subjects of examination for the B.A. and ordinary M.A. degrees.

5. *Examination for B.A. degree.*—That for the present the subjects of examination for the B.A. degree should be as under :—

*Latin.*—One Book of Virgil, one Book of Horace, one Book of Cicero, one Book of Livy or Tacitus, with translations from English into Latin prose ; and questions on Grammar, History, and Antiquities.

*Greek.*—One Book of Homer, one Greek Tragedy, one Oration of Demosthenes or Dialogue of Plato, with translations, &c., (as in Latin.)

*English*—The Professor's Lectures.

*Mathematics and Natural Philosophy.*—[I do not think it necessary at present to fix a standard, and I shall be in a better position to do so when I have had some experience in the Colony.—J. S.]

*Mental and Moral Philosophy.*—The Professor's lectures on Psychology, including Metaphysics, Logic, inductive and deductive, Moral Philosophy, and Political Economy.

*Natural Science.*—To be fixed hereafter.

6. *Examination for the M.A. Degree.*—That the subjects of examination for the ordinary M.A. Degree should include the subjects of the previous examination for the B.A. Degree, and should also include one additional book in each case of authors in Greek and Latin prose and poetry, as well as the subjects of the Professor's lectures for candidates for the ordinary M.A. Degree.

7. *Lectures during Session of 1871.*—With regard to the lectures to be delivered during the Session of 1871, it would probably be desirable that, for the sake of any residents in Dunedin who might wish to attend, each Professor should deliver, in addition to the lectures for first year students, one course of lectures, as under :—

The Classical Professor—English language and Literature.

The Mathematical Professor—Second year's course of Mathematics and Natural Philosophy.

The Professor of Moral Philosophy—The Physiology of Mind and Elementary Psychology.

*Position of Natural Science in the Curriculum.*—

The Professors of Classics, Mathematics, and Mental Science, are of opinion that the Natural Sciences ought to be studied from the beginning of a student's course, and extend over a greater part of the curriculum than is customary in any of the Scottish Universities. The above suggestions are made in order to assist the Council in drawing up their prospectus or advertisement for insertion in the Colonial newspapers. They are the result of the comparison of the systems at work in the Universities in which the Professors themselves were educated. There are of course many details which will have to be filled in hereafter, but it is hoped that the general scheme will obtain the approval of the Council, and will assist them in answering in general terms such inquiries as may be made by intending students.

N.B.—Provision will probably be made for dispensing with attendance at the Junior Classes, in the case of persons who have attended other Universities, or who may be able to pass a strict examination in the subjects taught in those classes.
