PROCLAMATION.

Appointing a day for the first Election of a Citizen to be Mayor of the Incorporated Town of Invercargill.

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance 1865 Amendment Ordinance 1870," it is amongst other things provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, at any time after any Municipality shall have been proclaimed under the provisions of the Ordinance intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance 1865," by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the Province of Otago, to appoint a day for the first Election of a Citizen to be Mayor of such Municipality: And whereas the township of Invercargill has been proclaimed a Municipality under the provisions of the said Ordinance; and it is expedient to appoint a day for the first Election of a Citizen to be Mayor of the said Municipality of Invercargill:
