PROCLAMATION

Appointing WILLIAM ALEXANDER TOLMIE, Esq., to be Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled the "Superintendent's Deputy Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any Province, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette of such Province, to appoint such person as he may think fit, being an inhabitant of such Province, and being registered as an elector on the Electoral Roll of some Electoral District within such Province, to be his Deputy, and as such to do, perform, and exercise all the acts, powers, and authorities (except as is excepted in the seventh clause of the said Act) which may be done, performed, or exercised by such Superintendent, or such of them only as shall be specified in such Proclamation: And whereas it is expedient that a Deputy-Superintendent should be appointed under the provisions of the said Act:

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Esq., Superintendent of the said Province of Otago, do hereby proclaim and declare that I do hereby appoint

WILLIAM ALEXANDER TOLMIE, of Dunedin, in the Province of Otago, Esquire

(he being an inhabitant of the said Province of Otago, and being registered as an elector on the Electoral Roll of the Electoral District of Clutha, within the said Province of Otago), as and to be my Deputy, and as such to do, perform, and exercise all the acts, powers, and authorities (except as is excepted in the seventh clause of the said Act) which may be done, performed, or exercised by me as such Superintendent of the said Province as aforesaid.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Otago, at Dunedin, this tenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.
