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NOTICE

Of certain Lands in the Province of Otago having been reserved for Educational purposes

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS the Provincial Council of Otago have under and by virtue of Section 62 of the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1866," recommended that the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto subjoined should be reserved from sale, and set aside for and appropriated to the purposes of Public Education in the Province of Otago, and for the general advancement of Education in the said Province, and it is expedient that the said Lands should be so reserved for those purposes:—

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in me in this behalf by the "Otago Waste Lands Act, 1866," do hereby publish and declare that I have made and dedicated the Lands hereinafter specified Reserves for the purposes of Public Education in the Province of Otago, and for the general advancement of Education in the said Province.

Description of Lands above referred to:—

All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement one (1) acre and thirteen (13) poles, more or less, situate in Tuapeka East District, being section 30, block X, on the map of the said district: bounded towards the north-west by sections numbered respectively 21 and 22, five hundred and sixty-seven (567) links; towards the north-east by section numbered

5, two hundred and sixteen (216) links; towards the south-east by Crown Lands, one hundred and sixty (160) links, and five hundred and fourteen (514) links; towards the south-west by Crown Lands, seventy-three (73) links; and towards the west by a road line, two hundred and thirteen (213) links.

All that parcel of land in the Province of Otago, Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement one (1) rood and seven (7) poles, more or less, situate in the Soho District, being Section numbered 1 on the Map of the said district: bounded towards the north-east by Crown Lands one hundred and sixty-nine (169) links; towards the south-east by Crown Lands two hundred (200) links; towards the south-west by Crown Lands one hundred and a-half (100½) links and sixty-eight (68) links; towards the north-west by Crown Lands sixty-seven (67) links and one hundred and thirty-three (133) links.

All that area in the Province of Otago, being part of section 15, block XIII, Invercargill Hundred, containing nine (9) acres: bounded on the north by a public road, on the east by section 2 of block XV, on the south by Education Reserve No. 7, and on the west by the Main North road.

RETURN OF NUMBER OF SHEEP IN THE PROVINCE.

Laid on the table by the Provincial Treasurer, June 19.

Sheep Inspector's Department,
Dunedin, 13th June, 1871.

SIR,—I have the honor to forward, for the information of the Government, Return of Sheep in the Province of Otago for the year ended 30th September, 1870.

The accompanying list shows a total of two millions four hundred and seventy-nine thousand five hundred and twenty-five (2,497,525) sheep above six months old, of which number one million five hundred and eighty-nine thousand and fifteen (1,589,015) are returned as depasturing on Runs, seven hundred and ninety-eight thousand eight hundred and thirteen (798,813) on freehold, seventy-five thousand six hundred and fifty (75,650) on Gold fields, and sixteen thousand and forty-seven (16,047) on hundreds.

The number forty-one thousand six hundred and fifty (41,650) appearing in the Return as diseased were confined in a corner of the Waitahuna District, and, with the exception of eleven hundred (1,100) in a paddock at Lovell's Flat on last inspection in May, I found the disease so far reduced that no symptoms of scab could be noticed amongst any of the other flocks; but a few months must elapse before they can be pronounced clean. By careful monthly inspections which I propose making, I am sanguine of being able soon to report that all the sheep in the Province are free from disease.

The Waitahuna District being the only part of the Province where any scab has existed for the last two years, I have tried hard to get it stamped out. Although it has been kept from spreading, I have failed in getting it under until now. This particular part of the country being a commonage, the great difficulty I had to encounter was in separating the flocks of the different owners. On almost every examination of any particular flock, some stray sheep belonging to nearly all the owners in the commonage were sure to be found intermixed, there being no recognised boundaries; and I found it next to impossible to compel all to clean their sheep without oppressing individuals who were doing everything in their power to get rid of the disease.

To meet such cases as the above it would be necessary for the Inspector to have the power to compel

owners of diseased sheep in a commonage to confine them in some safe place until they are free from disease.
