CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF DUNEDIN.

BYE-LAW No. 9.

A BYE-LAW of the Council of the City of Dunedin, made under Sections 186 and 361 of the "Municipal Corporations Act 1867."

A Bye-Law for Regulating the Cattle and Sheep Market of the Corporation of the City of Dunedin.

In pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in Section 361, Part XXI.; and in Section 186 of Part XIII of the "Municipal Corporations Act 1867," the Council of the City of Dunedin ordain as follows, that is to say:—

1st. That the Cattle and Sheep Market of the Council of the City of Dunedin (hereinafter referred to as the "Market") covering all that area [comprising the southern half of the Cattle Market Reserve, as laid down on the Record Map of the City of Dunedin, and situate in the Town Belt of Dunedin, on the south side of Maclaggan street Extension, commonly known as the Serpentine Avenue, shall be open for the reception and delivery of Cattle and other Live Stock on Friday in each week, and on such other days as the said Council may from time to time by any resolution direct, until 10 o'clock post meridian, subject to such rules and regulations as may be ordered by the said Council in that behalf.

2nd. That there shall be appointed for such Cattle Market an Officer, to be called the Inspector thereof, whose duties shall be as follow:—

- 1st. To see that the Market Regulations be duly observed.
- 2nd. To demand and receive all Market Tolls and Dues.
- 3rd. To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of the parties bringing Stock to the Market for sale, in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such Inspector to be most convenient.
- 4th. To preserve order and cleanliness within such Market, and to summarily eject therefrom any person creating a riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using any gross or indecent language, or being guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein.

3rd. That any person or persons who may obstruct the Inspector or his assistants in the performance of his or their duty, or shall release any Stock from the Market, or shall remove the same from one part of the Market to another without the authority of the Inspector, or shall wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, or premises of the Market, shall forfeit and pay, for every such offence, any sum not exceeding five pounds (£5).

4th. That the party or parties placing stock in the Market for sale shall be responsible for all Market dues and tolls accruing thereon, and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the Market until all Dues, Tolls, and Charges demandable on such stock under this Bye-law shall have been first fully paid and satisfied.

5th. That any person or persons who may place stock in the Market for sale, and neglect for two (2) whole days to supply such stock with sufficient food and water, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay for every head of such stock any sum not exceeding five pounds (£5).

6th. That the following tolls or dues be demanded, paid, and taken at the said Cattle Market for all stock sold or exposed for sale therein—that is to say, for every horse, mare, gelding, foal, ass, or mule, the sum of one shilling (1s); for every head of neat cattle, the sum of sixpence (6d); and for every sheep, lamb, pig, or goat, the sum of one penny (1d).

7th. That the following charges shall be made by the Inspector for stock occupying the yards for any time between 10 o'clock post meridian and midnight, that is

to say—for every horse, mare, gelding, foal, ass, or mule, the sum of one shilling (1s) per night; for every head of neat cattle, the sum of threepence (3d) per night; for sheep, lambs, pigs, or goats, the sum of sixpence (6d) per score; and proportionally for any smaller number for every night during which they shall be so yarded.

8th. That the following charges shall be made by the Inspector for the use of the branding yards—that is to say, for every horse, mare, gelding, foal, ass, mule, or steer branded therein, the sum of sixpence (6d); and for each steer yoked therein, the sum of one shilling (1s).

9th. That sales of stock by auction in the said Cattle Market shall take place in order of priority of the arrival of such stock within the Cattle Market Reserve, and report of such arrival to the Market Inspector by the person or any of the persons in charge of such stock after the opening of the Market on Friday, and that it shall be the duty of the Market Inspector to certify and direct the precedence and succession of such sales in the order of such reports, in accordance with this Bye-law; and any person or persons who shall sell any such stock by auction, contrary and in disregard to such directions, shall be deemed guilty of obstructing the Inspector in the discharge of his duty, and shall be subject to pay, upon conviction thereof, any sum not exceeding five pounds (£5).

10th. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained as to hours during which the Market shall be open, the Market Inspector shall at all times give such facilities for the reception and delivery of stock, as for compliance with the provisions of Regulation No. IV of the Council of the City of Dunedin, made under the authority of Section 45, Sub-division 9, Part 1 of Schedule XIII of the "Municipal Corporations Act 1867," entitled a Regulation for appointing the hours during which it shall not be lawful to drive into or through the City, or any part thereof, any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of New Zealand, or of any other Colony, to any other place, &c., &c., or of any other Municipal Bye-law, may in any case be actually necessary.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE DUNEDIN WATER WORKS COMPANY.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of the Colony of New Zealand, made and passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, and entitled "The Dunedin Water Works Act, 1864," it was amongst other things enacted that the Dunedin Water Works Company might make, alter, and repeal Bye-laws for regulating the mode, form, strength, material, construction and arrangement of pipes, and other works supplying water from the pipes of the Company to adjacent premises, and regulating the time of doing the same, and notices to be given for the superintending thereof, the making good ground which may be displaced thereby, and for inspecting all services whether within or without any buildings at all reasonable times, and to regulate the construction, disposition, custody and inspection of meters, and for classifying the several tenements to be supplied with water, and determining the rate to be paid for each class, either according to the annual value or the number of rooms in such tenements or otherwise; and for making and levying such rate, and for preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the Company, and for causing persons using the same to keep their pipes and other apparatus in proper repair, and for preventing any tampering with or altering such pipes without notice to the Company, and for repairing such pipes and apparatus so as to prevent the waste of water, and recover-

ing the cost of such repairs, and for preventing any person from allowing any other person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Company, to use the water, and for preventing such person from using the same, and for preventing any person from wilfully or carelessly breaking, injuring or opening any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work or engine belonging to the Company, and from doing any other wilful act whereby such water may be wasted, and for imposing penalties for breaches of such Bye-laws. Provided the surveyor or other person appointed for that purpose by the Company, may between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon, and four o'clock in the afternoon, enter into any house or premises supplied with water by the Company, in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if such surveyor or other person at any such time be refused admittance into such dwelling-house or premises for any of the purposes aforesaid, or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid, the Company may turn off the water supplied by them from such house or other premises: And provided that no penalty greater than ten pounds shall be imposed by any such Bye-law for the breach thereof.

Bye-law No. 1. Pipes must, unless otherwise agreed, be of lead, and of not less than the following weight, namely:—

2. The drawing (bib) stop and ball cocks must be strong and of hard brass, and, the better to secure watertightness, of the kinds from time sanctioned and approved by the directors; and unless and until due notification to the contrary, the drawing cocks must be of the best and most approved kind of those called 'screw down cocks,' and in principle as manufactured by Messrs. Guest and Crimes, and in courts of houses and other exposed places must be protected by a wood or iron casing at the discretion of the Secretary, and be made to open with keys: And the ball taps must also be of the best and most approved kind, and in principle as manufactured by Messrs. Lambert and Sons: Till otherwise notified, no other description of cock must be used, without the previous and express permission of the directors.

3. Every pipe and apparatus laid and fixed by or for the use of the consumer, must be inspected by an officer of the Company before it is connected to the Works of the Company, and if found not in accordance with the regulations of the Company, must forthwith be removed or altered.

4. No pipe must be attached to the Works of the Company, or to any pipe or apparatus connected therewith; nor must any alteration be made in any existing pipe or apparatus, without due notice being given to, and the consent of the proper officer of the Company first being obtained.

5. The supply and use of water for the purpose of trade and manufacture, must be open to inspection and admeasurement whenever required; and such information must be from time afforded as will be sufficient to enable the directors to obtain a satisfactory account of the quantity of water actually consumed, and of the pipes, cocks, cisterns and other apparatus and conveniences for delivering, receiving and using such water.

6. Persons offending against any of the foregoing Bye-laws shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

7. The directors will pay a reward of ten shillings to any person who will give such information as shall lead to the conviction of any person who shall fraudulently attach any pipe or pipes to the pipes of the Company, or to any pipe, cistern or apparatus connected therewith, or to or into which the water of the Company shall

flow or proceed, or who shall fraudulently use or otherwise misappropriate the water of the Company, or who shall knowingly permit the same to be fraudulently used, or otherwise misappropriated.

VII, No. 7," the Governor is empowered from time to time to make such rules and regulations as to him may seem fit, touching the duties of the officers of any public gaol, the classification, diet, instruction, treatment and correction of the prisoners therein, and generally to prescribe all

such rules as may be necessary for the good discipline of any public gaol, and the safe custody of the prisoners therein :

And whereas by a Warrant bearing date the ninth day of April one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, certain regulations were made for the Public Gaols within the then existing Province of Southland, and it is expedient to alter the scale of rations fixed by the said regulations so far as respects the Public Gaol at Invercargill, and to fix another scale in lieu thereof :

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Ordinance, do hereby make the following regulation fixing the scale of rations to be allowed to prisoners confined in the Public Gaol at Invercargill, in the Province of Otago, that is to say,—
