NOTICE.

Of certain Land in the Town of Roxburgh in the Province of Otago, having been set apart as a Reserve for Recreation for the use of the Inhabitants of Roxburgh.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS the Provincial Council of Otago have under and by virtue of Section 62 of the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1866," recommended that the lands hereinafter described should be reserved for recreation purposes; and it is expedient that the said lands should be so reserved for that purpose: Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf, do hereby publish and declare that I have made and dedicated the lands hereinafter described a reserve for recreation for the use of the inhabitants of Roxburgh (that is to say)—

Extract from Section XIV of the "Education Ordinance, 1864."
