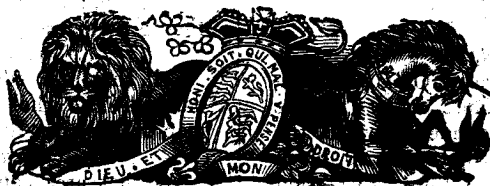

PROCLAMATION:

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**I**, JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf by the "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1865," hereby proclaim and declare that all those roads and all those portions of roads in the Province of Otago, mentioned and

referred to in the said "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1865," and particularly described in the schedule hereto, shall, from and after the day of the date hereof, cease to be public roads or thoroughfares, and shall no longer form part of the public roads in the several road districts in the Province of Otago, mentioned in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed:—

*Caversham Road District No. 17.*

(2). Six (6) chains in length, sixty (60) links wide from Main South Road, on section thirteen (13), block VII, Town District, to district road between sections eleven (11) and twelve (12), block VII, Town District: Boundaries—north, City of Dunedin; south, by sections twelve (12) and part of thirteen (13), block VII, Town District.

**WAKATIP DEPASTURING DISTRICT BOARD OF WARDENS.**

**NOTICE** is hereby given, that in accordance with a resolution passed at a meeting of the Wakatip Depasturing District Board of Wardens held at the Shotover Hotel on Tuesday, the 3rd October, 1871, the Wakatip Depasturing District was, with the consent of His Honor the Superintendent, divided into separate districts for sheep and cattle as hereinafter described, viz. :—

*Great Cattle, Block No. 1.*

All that area contained within the following boundaries :—Commencing at the junction of Maori Gully with the Cardrona River; thence down the Cardrona River to Rodey's Gully; thence up Rodey's Gully and by a straight line to the boundary of Run No. 340; thence northerly and westerly by the boundary of said Run to the source of the Roaring Billy; thence by a straight line to the head of Maori Gully; thence down said gully to the starting point.

*Great Cattle, Block No. 2.*

All that area contained within the following boundaries :—Commencing at the southernmost point of Run No. 9, adjoining Arrow River; thence northward along said river to the mouth of Sawyer's Gully; thence by said gully to the bush at base of Brow Peak; thence southward along foot of Coronet Range to Bush Creek, and by said creek to starting point.
