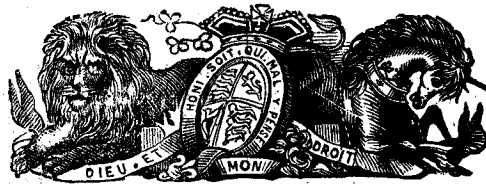

NOTICE.—Whereas it is intended to stop up these Roads and portions of Roads which are severally described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated on the maps or plans mentioned and referred to in the “Roads Diversion Ordinance 1871” Session XXIX copies of which maps or plans so far as they relate to the particular roads or portions of roads intended to be stopped up in the Road District specified in the Schedule have been deposited at the public School mentioned immediately after the description of the respective roads or portions of roads intended to be stopped up in such district: Now therefore I James Macandrew Esquire Superintendent of the Province of Otago by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in that behalf by the “Roads Diversion Ordinance 1871” Session No. XXIX do hereby give notice that all persons objecting to the stopping up of such roads or portions of roads or any of them are required to set forth a statement in writing of any well-grounded objections they may have to the stopping up of such roads or portions of roads and to leave such statement addressed to me at my office in Dunedin within sixty days from the first publication hereof otherwise such objections will not be considered by me.

Allday Road District. (No. 1.)

1. All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement 4a 0r 32p, more or less, situate in block III, Otepopo District: bounded towards the north by sections 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8, eight thousand four hundred (8400) links, more or less; and towards the south by sections 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, and 19, eight thousand four hundred (8400) links, more or less.

2. All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement 5a 1r 24p, more or less, situate in block II, Otepopo district: bounded towards the north

by parts of sections 8, 7, 6, and 103, block II, and section 66, block III, ten thousand eight hundred (10,800) links, more or less; and towards the south by other part of section 66, block III, and other parts of sections 103, 6, 7, and 8, ten thousand eight hundred (10,800) links, more or less.

North Molyneux District. (No. 15.)

Setting apart certain Lands in the Province of Otago as a site for a settlement for colonisation, at Catlin's River and Waikawa River, under "The Otago Settlements Act 1871."

WHEREAS the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago have recommended that the lands hereafter described should be set apart as a site for a settlement for colonisation: And whereas the said lands are an eligible site for a settlement for colonisation, and it is expedient that the said lands should be so set apart accordingly: Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf by "The Otago

TO SCHOOL COMMITTEES AND SCHOOL TEACHERS.

THE following Minutes of the Education Board are circulated for the information of the School Committees and School Teachers in connection with the Board.

The Board took into consideration (1) the Report of the Select Committee of the Provincial Council on the Petitions of Roman Catholic Inhabitants of the Province, Session XXIX; (2), a Resolution of the Provincial Council, Session XXIX, relating to the said Report and Petitions; and (3), a Memorandum on the same subject by the Provincial Secretary.

It was resolved:—

- (1). That the Schoolmasters and other Teachers employed under the Board be enjoined to adhere strictly to the terms of the Education Ordinance 1864, in regard to the Reading of the Bible and Religious Instruction, to take care that both Parents and Children be informed that attendance at such reading or instruction is optional, and to avoid the use of any lessons containing words or expressions offensive to Roman Catholics or other denominations of Christians.
- (2). That the Secretary be instructed to take steps, in conjunction with School Committees and Teachers, to secure the use of such Class-books in the Public Schools as shall give the least possible offence to Roman Catholics and other denominations of Christians.
- (3). That the Board express their appreciation of the prudent and fair manner in which they believe the School Committees and Teachers have generally acted in the past in reference to the reading of the Bible, and the imparting of religious instruction in the Public Schools.
- (4). That a copy of these Resolutions be forwarded to every School Committee and every Teacher connected with the Board.

Dunedin, January 20th, 1872.

The Board, taking into account the increasing number of applications coming before them for the establishment of Schools and the appointment of additional Teachers, and also the largely increasing cost of maintaining the Educational Establishments of the Province, are of opinion that a thorough revision of the whole of the Educational arrangements should be made immediately after the compilation of the Returns for the year 1871, and instruct the Secretary to proceed forthwith with the compilation of the said Returns, to inform the School Committees and Teachers connected with the Board of the intention to make such revision, and to intimate to them that, in the event of such revision showing that schools are in existence where the

attendance of pupils, proximity to other schools, or other circumstances warrant their discontinuance or a reduction of the allowances at present paid to them, the Board will not guarantee the continuance of the present payments on account of salaries or other allowances beyond the 30th day of September, 1872.

N.B.—The difference between the proportion of hydro to fixed carbon in this and the coal, No 1105 (a), is very marked. The percentage of ash is too high in this sample to allow of its being profitably employed as an oil shale or gas shale. Thus, the Hartley shale of N. S. Wales contains only 13 per cent. of ash; the Torbane Hill shale, in Scotland, 19 to 24 per cent.; the Bucken Ridge shale, 8 per cent.; and the Albert Coy., United States shale, 7 per cent. I think, from the information which accompanies the specimen, that a search should be made in the gullies by laying bare the surface of the rocks in favorable situations; but there is nothing to lead me to recommend boring, which would be very costly and unsatisfactory in such a formation. The formation is the same as that of Waikava and Otapiri, as far as I was able to judge from a personal inspection of it some years ago.

We have examined the foregoing accounts, compared them with the vouchers and bank pass books, and find them correct.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act 1870," it is among other things enacted that the Governor may, at the request of the Superintendent of any Province, from time to time make regulations (as therein mentioned) for the conduct of immigration under the said Act into such Province, and for the nomination of immigrants by persons resident therein, and for the distribution of funds provided by the said Act for immigration purposes, and for the introduction into and settlement in such Province of immigrants, and for selling as special settlements, for any such immigrants, any lands which he may acquire from any Province under the provisions therein contained, or any lands acquired under "The New Zealand Settlements Act 1863," or the Acts amending the same, and for laying out and allotting any lands so acquired amongst any such immigrants: And whereas by the "Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act 1871," it is among other things enacted that so much of the thirty-ninth and forty-first sections of the said Act as provide that any acts, matters, or things are to or may be done by the Governor, at the request of the Superintendent of a Province, is thereby repealed; and it is thereby enacted that the Governor may exercise all the powers, and do and perform all the acts, matters and things in the said sections mentioned, without any request from any Superintendent of any Province or any other person or authority:

And whereas, in pursuance of the power and authority contained in the said first-mentioned Act, the

Governor, at the request of certain Superintendents of Provinces, did make certain regulations for the introduction of immigrants from Europe into those Provinces respectively, on the nomination of persons resident therein: And whereas it hath been determined to make other regulations in lieu of those so made as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Acts, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for the introduction of immigrants from Europe into the Colony of New Zealand, on the nomination of persons resident therein.

SCHEDULE.

1. Each applicant will be required to pay, at the time of making the application, the sum of £5 for each adult (except single women) and £2 10s. for each child between the ages of one and twelve years, whom it is desired to have introduced into the Colony. Infants in arms, under one year free. This rate being only for the ship passage from London (or such other port as the ship may sail from) to the Colony, the cost of reaching such port of sailing in Europe and proceeding up the country to their friends will have to be defrayed by the emigrants themselves.

2. Free passages will be granted to single women between the ages of 12 and 35, provided they are able to produce proof of good character to the satisfaction of the Agent-General in London.

3. In the event of any emigrants applied for declining to emigrate, whatever money may have been deposited with the Government will be returned to the applicants so soon as the Agent-General in England shall have apprised the Government thereof; but in the event of any emigrants applied for accepting the offer of a passage in a particular ship, and so, by failing to present themselves for embarkation at the time and port appointed by the Agent-General in England for the sailing of such ship, be left behind, the passage money and passages will be forfeited.

4. Applicants in the Colony, when writing to the persons for whose passages they have applied, should distinctly inform them that no part of the passage money paid in the Colony will be returned, if they omit to write to the Agent-General in London, telling him that they decline the passages offered to them.

5. The address of the Agent-General in London is as follows:—

6. All the ships employed in this service will be under the provisions of the "Passenger Act."

7. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Agent-General in London will have power to refuse passages where the intending emigrants are in ill-health, or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to undertake the voyage.

8. Forms of Application may be obtained at any Post Office in the Colony, but passage moneys can only be paid at any Money Order Post Office in the Colony.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House, at Wellington, this third day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.
